Tt's surprising Donald Trump didn't venture around the UK in an armoured tank given the amount of vitriol that laid in wait around every corner during the US President's visit in the middle of July.

Yet a guaff of thick hair and an even thicker skin accompanied the bolshie and intentionally controversial leader, whose three-day working visit to the UK followed a NATO summit in Brussels, and preceded equally spicy talks with Russia President Vladimir Putin in Finland. Love him or loathe him, the 72-year-old doesn't do things in short measures.

Whether linking hands with Prime Minister Theresa May or haplessly failing to follow royal convention with the Queen at Windsor Castle, Trump revelled in the pomp and the protests.

He is in fact the 13th US president that Her Majesty has met during her reign. and the exchange was said to be cordial ... so cordial in fact that HRH - on behalf of the government - laid out an invitation for a full state visit in April of next year, immediately after the conclusion of the Brexit process (whether or not we have struck a deal with the EU). That visit will include a military guard of honour and carriage ride up the Mall to Buckingham Palace... and perhaps a few thousand expletive-ridden placards too.

Trump divides opinion like no one else before him. Recently, his policy of keeping migrant children in cages at the US border appears brutal, yet his praise for our Prime Minister, and stories of his mother Mary Anne's praise for Her Majesty and 'tell it like it is' approach appeal wholeheartedly to those tired of 'suit and shoes' politics.

While those who hosted him in July were welcoming, others refused to engage. There was no meeting at all with the American citizen who has joined our Royal Family, Meghan Markle (who isn't quiet in her dislike of the president); nor was there a visit by Mr Trump to the new US Embassy south of the river (after he criticised the move from Grosvenor Square).

In addition, he was not invited to address both Houses of Parliament - an honour that has been accorded to previous US presidents - because of opposition from John Bercow, the Commons speaker.

But progress was made at Chequers where bilateral talks with Theresa May went well, and it appears the personal relationship between the two may have gone up a degree or two in warmth, despite a very obvious frosty chill continuing to linger just below the surface.

Trump concluded proceedings in Scotland where he played a round of golf with Prince Andrew at Turnberry, the course he owns, Business and pleasure - par for the course.

VINYL

ur desire for home interiors to be unique, bespoke and personal has made popular a number of crafts in recent years, with few as accessible and impressive as stencil art. In envisaging a pattern, creating a template and getting busy with some perfectly matched paint, you can transform weary old walls in no time.

1. Select a design

The Coptfold Road car park reopened on July 16 following the renovation which includes new surfaces, paintwork, signage and fire doors installed.

The car park had suffered from irreparable damage meaning repairs were imperative.

The work is on schedule for completion in January 2019 when a new CCTV system will be in place to increase security.

Council leader cllr Louise McKinlay said: "The car park looks completely different and has become a brighter and more welcoming place to park, with well-marked out parking bays in well-lit areas.

"The building was way past its best, and of course was suffering from concrete cancer making work a priority in order to secure its future use.

"Furthermore, the project is expected to, through a number of cost-saving measures, come in under the original $\pounds1.9$ million budget."



Secret Brentwood extract

"An unusual Brentwood resident of the early twentieth century was a man named Ole Oddy, a hermit who built himself a dugout at Warley Gap. He was described by Mrs Eva Carsnell, the landlady of the Brewery Tap, as being very unkempt and as smoking an old clay pipe upside down. He also wore an old overcoat that nearly touched the ground. Oddy would step on molehills and claimed that moles died if you touched their nose. He then dried the moleskins and sewed them onto his waistcoat.

He would come into the Brewery Tap every Saturday morning and put down threepence for a quart of beer in a pewter tankard – the pub had no glasses at that time. After drinking half his beer he would produce a rabbit from one of the many pockets in his old coat and offer it for sale for sixpence. Mrs Carsnell said that he would produce up to twelve rabbits at one time. Then when he had sold them all he would go to other public houses to sell more.

In August 1913 Lord and Lady Petre, the local aristocracy, returned from their honeymoon. They set about entertaining the cottagers, old people, tradespeople and tenant farmers on different days at Thorndon Hall, which was an old custom of the family. Lord Petre hoped to start reconstructing Thornden Hall and to live there among his tenant farmers.

Lord Petre told the farmers that the position of a great estate landlord was not as firm as it was thirty years before, but he hoped to bring it back to something like its former standing. He went on to say that agriculture was passing through a very troublesome time and he hoped it would survive."

Cash prize for schools which love their clothes

School children across Essex, including a school in Brentwood, have raised over £3,700 for their schools by donating over nine tonnes of old clothes to be recycled.

St Thomas of Canterbury Infant School was one of the schools that took part.

The competition, run by Bag2School in partnership with Recycle for Essex, saw 37 schools take part.

Every household in Essex throws away the equivalent of 36 woolly jumpers each year, but recycling old clothes and textiles is becoming easier.

Many districts and boroughs in Essex offer kerbside

collections, all recycling centres accept textiles, along with the many textile banks located all around the county. All clean clothing and textiles can be recycled, even items that are ripped or have holes in.

Councillor Simon Walsh, Essex County Council cabinet member for waste, said: "The schools recycling competition has been a fun new way to encourage pupils and parents to learn about the value of recycling their clothes.

"I would like to congratulate all the schools who took part for encouraging young people in Essex to become a new generation of recyclers."

Man taken to hospital due to smoke inhalation

Aman was taken to hospital after suffering from Severe smoke inhalation recently.

Firefighters attended the incident in Brook Street in Brentwood on July 2 at around 2.40pm and found the man had inhaled a large amount of smoke attempting to extinguish the large fire.

Firefighters reported a pile of manure, measuring 20 metres by 10 metres, was alight.

Crews worked quickly to surround and contain the fire and it was completely extinguished by 4.49pm. Essex Fire has issued advice following the incident.

Tom Side, crew manager at Brentwood Fire Station, said: "While we understand this gentlemen's intentions were to try to help and do what he could to contain the fire, he actually put himself at huge risk.

"If you see a fire and it can't be put out with a bucket of water, think 'get out, stay out and call the fire service out'. Get out of the building or area, stay out of harm's way and call the fire service out.

"During dry conditions at this time of year, outdoor fires can become serious very quickly - so please don't put yourself in danger."

War memorial restored for the centenary of the end of WWI

Brentwood Borough's war memorial has undergone a thorough transformation to mark 100 years since the end of the First World War.

A deep clean and repairs saw the significant cross and pedestal, together with the Memorial Wall, brought back to "like-new" condition.

The Mayor of Brentwood cllr Sheila Murphy took a tour around the memorial garden and said: "It is quite incredible to see all the names of all the young men and know that they each made the ultimate sacrifice, giving their lives to protect democracy, the country and the future generations living now.

"In these days of technology, the face of war has changed dramatically, and it is hard to envisage every family, neighbour or colleague losing someone or knowing someone who has lost a loved one – this was the case in the First World War. Entire communities would never be the same again. "It is a great testament to Brentwood that the borough played such a significant part in the First World War and it is only right that our wonderful war memorial be kept in a manner that befits its status to the fallen."

The British Legion expects the Remembrance Sunday parade on November 11 to see more than 1,000 people take part this year.

Brentwood British Legion president Brian Kitchener and chairman Syd Bryer said: "We are most fortunate here in Brentwood to have such an impressive memorial which is much cherished by residents and the British Legion.

"This is a significant year, marking as it does the end of the First World War in 1918. We have had considerable interest already in this year's parade, so it is excellent to see the memorial is already prepared for the occasion."

Medals belonging to late international cricketer stolen

Essex Police are appealing for information following a burglary where cricket medals belonging to a late international cricket player were stolen.

The burglary took place in Brentwood between 1pm and 2pm on Tuesday, June 26.

Among the items stolen were three national cricket competition winners' medals, jewellery and cash.

Investigating officer Police Constable Paul Burnett said: "Not only has the victim had to deal with a breakin to their home, but the theft of these medals which have invaluable sentimental worth.

"One medal is gold with the wording 'Gillette Cup Final' and the name of the winner inscribed on one side and 'The County Cricket Competition, The Gillette Cup' with the silhouette of a trophy engraved

on the other.

"The second medal is silver with the wording 'Gillette Cup Final Winners' engraved on one side and 'The County Cricket Competition, The Gillette Cup' with the silhouette of a trophy on the opposite side.

"The third medal is gold with the wording 'Benson & Hedges Cup Final Winners'."

The victim, who wishes to remain anonymous, said: "I have been left totally devastated by what has happened."

"We would also like to be able to fund any child that we feel needs urgent help and we can get private therapy for."

The recent lengthy spell of hot weather has taken its toll on much of our greenery, and there are many brown lawns and wilting plants visible as I travel around the Brentwood and Ongar area.

The local water companies, Affinity and Essex and Suffolk Water, have made it clear they are doing their bit to ensure we have the water we need but are urging us to do our bit to conserve this precious resource during the dry summer (at the time of writing the driest start to a summer ever). Those brown lawns are deceptive – a couple of days of rain and they will be back to their full emerald glory.

We are fortunate to have many well-cultivated allotment sites across the constituency, and there is a steady stream of plot holders heading out to water their rapidly developing courgettes, tomatoes and beans when the air is cooler and the water will not be burned off by the sun. Hosepipes are not allowed on most allotment sites, so there is plenty of hard work to be done trudging backwards and forwards from the water points with heavy watering cans.

Allotmenteers are canny people, and there are multiple water butts and water saving devices to be seen next to the homebuilt sheds and polytunnels. And the watering can/water butt system seems to work well for them...a quick glance across the sites sees an abundance of crops.

I'm impressed by the enthusiasm for homegrown veg across the constituency – there's a real feel of "Dig for Victory" from some people who prefer a back garden full of potatoes and swedes than neatly clipped shrubs and lawns. And it seems to work – one of last year's *Great British Bake Off* competitors used his Brentwood allotment produce for his bakes, and I've noticed while out visiting groups in the constituency there are an abundance of courgette recipes doing the rounds too.

In fact, the pair make such a terrific team that they will be joining *The X Factor* panel as judges when it returns to our screens later this year.

What we can expect from this new era of the larger-than-life superstar remains to be seen, but love him or loathe him, the British celeb circuit is a lot less entertaining without Robbie Williams.

Ithough not life threatening and definitely not a health problem to lose any sleep over, hiccups can be inconvenient, embarrassing and downright annoving.

WHY DO WE GET HICCUPS?

You may not know this but all mammals hiccup. However, it is most common in humans and babies in particular are more prone to this affliction than adults. Hiccups occur when the air you breathe in hits your voice box too quickly causing your vocal cords to suddenly close. Shock, stress, alcohol, smoking, overeating or feelings of nervousness and excitement can all lead to a case of the dreaded hiccups.

GETTING RID OF YOUR HICCUPS

Although there are no fool proof ways to cure a bad case of the hiccups there are many tried and tested methods that are known to help:

- > Hold your breath for as long as you can
- > Ask a friend to scare you/make you jump

- > Gargle with ice cold water
- > Try to drink from the far side of the glass
- > Bite down on a lemon

HOW TO AVOID HICCUPS

- > Do not eat too guickly
- > Avoid chewing gum as this causes you to swallow air
- > Try to limit your alcohol and fizzy drink intake
- > Do not eat or drink something very cold straight after consuming anything hot

If none of the above works, do not worry. Most episodes of the hiccups only last a few minutes and will naturally stop on their own. Although it is worth noting that the longest case of the hiccups lasted an epic 68 years. Charles Osborne of Iowa, USA started hiccupping in 1922 and, unable to find a cure, continued to suffer until 1990. He was estimated to have hiccupped 430 million times.

Some are calling for its legalisation in the UK, but just how effective is medical marijuana? And do the pros really outweigh the cons?

When Home Secretary Sajid Javid intervened to allow the cannabis oil treatment of a severely epileptic 12-year-old whose medication had been confiscated by Customs officers back in June, it put the argument of whether medical marijuana ought to be legalised back on the table. Certainly Charlotte Caldwell, the mother of the boy in question, thinks it should be, and her voice is backed by sufferers (or their friends) of conditions that marijuana is known to treat - from helping

to control epileptic seizures, slowing and possibly even preventing cancer

Alzheimer's, easing the pain of multiple sclerosis cells from spreading. Even former Health Secretary Jeremy Hunt has called for cannabis oil to be made freely available on the NHS, but the topic remains contentious, with concerns that legalisation may just usher in a whole new health crisis as patients become addicted to the substance.

So what are the pros? Cannabis is currently classified as a Class B drug in the UK and carries a prison sentence of up to five years for possession. Advocates for legalisation argue that making it legally available would not only benefit the war on drugs, but it would also create a billion-pound industry that is fully taxable. Also, with concerns that street weed is dangerous in being laced with other substances such as PCP (which can cause psychosis, extreme anxiety and seizures), it would surely be advantageous to know that a safer option was available.

Having said that, there is also the risk that people who have never before tried the drug could become hooked, while also sending out a message that substance experimentation is suddenly okay.

The big question is, will legalisation create a nation of healthy go-getters or an army of stoners?

How to get whiter teeth at home (and mostly using ingredients you already have in your cupboard).

f you've always dreamt of having a megawatt smile like Angelina Jolie or perfect gnashers like Tom Cruise but don't have the cash to splash out on an expensive whitening treatment at a private clinic, then you'll be happy to know that there are plenty of tricks and techniques you can try at home. Let's start with the basics. You may not believe in the power of the humble toothbrush, but a good dental hygiene regime will go a long way towards keeping your teeth their best. Flossing is a great way to minimise the build-up of plaque (which is the white/yellow stuff in between your teeth) so do it every day and consider investing in an electric toothbrush – they are proven to be more effective.

Load up your diet in foods that are rich in calcium and include lots of crunchy veg like apples and carrots (which remove plaque as you chew). Another way to keep your mouth and breath fresh throughout the day is to try 'oil pulling'. Once a day swish a tablespoon of coconut oil around your mouth for 15-20 minutes. The oil pulls all bacteria out of your mouth, and some people swear it brightens their teeth too.

TROUSERS/JEANS

During pregnancy, most women find that their legs stay roughly the same while their hips and tummy grow. For this reason, the only thing that needs to be adjusted on your trousers or jeans is the waistband.

> Quick fix: Take a hair elastic, wrap it around the button on your jeans three times before looping the other end through the corresponding hole. Wrap around the button one last time.

Easy stitch: Rip down the seam three to four inches on either side of the waistband. Fold one side in a couple of inches to create a triangle shape. Now pin a piece of thick elastic in the space and sew.

After the first few months, your belly is going to peek out of from underneath your top, so you will need to find a little more coverage.

Quick fix: The easiest solution is simply to create a belly band which you can wear underneath your regular tops. You can either buy one or make your own by cutting the top off of an old stretchy vest. This band can then cover the space between your shirt and your jeans.

Easy stitch: Take an oversized T-shirt and ruche the sides with elastic by turning the shirt inside out and using a stretch stitch to sew elastic up the side seam, from near the hem to just below the bustline.

Quick fix: There's zero stitching required to create your very own voluminous dress. All you need is two yards of stretchy fabric to drape around you. Now cut out arm holes and tie together with a belt above your bump.

ANNUITIES

When you retire, you can choose to take some or all of your pension pot as an annuity, an insurance product that provides a guaranteed income for life. One of the benefits that annuities provide is security. Unlike other retirement income products, and with the exception of investment-linked annuities, you aren't exposed to stock market risk which could erode your income. On the downside, should you die early, the residual value of the annuity dies with you; there is usually no return of capital to your estate.

DRAWDOWN

With income drawdown, you take a retirement income direct from your pension pot while leaving the rest of the cash invested, providing an opportunity for future growth. There is no minimum amount for drawdown,

No one should be deterred from planning for their 1 so you could, for instance, take your 25% tax-free lump sum and choose to leave the remaining funds invested. You can also move funds into drawdown in stages, known as partial or phased drawdown. The 25% tax-free amount doesn't have to be taken at once on retirement - smaller amounts can be taken over time, each with 25% tax-free. Once in drawdown you can access funds as you need them. You could, for example, vary the amount you take each year, taking less if you wish to remain in a lower tax band, or more if you have plans to spend. After taking your 25% tax-free cash, your withdrawals will be subject to income tax and your drawdown income is added to any other income you receive in that tax year. It's important to remember that taking large withdrawals may result in you paying tax at a higher rate.

DRIVINGEFFICIENCY

Five steps to ensure you are driving at maximum efficiency

Je've all found ourselves at the petrol pump wondering how it is the last tank of fuel evaporated quite so quickly. The truth is, it's not just distance that costs us dear when it comes to the cost of filling up, it's our driving habits too. Here are five steps towards achieving driving efficiency, and with it, a lowering of fuel costs:

NIFTY FIFTY

Driving between 50-55mph is the optimum speed for the majority of modern engines and UK roads, and moving along at a sensible speed also optimises stopping distances so that you are not wasting fuel by repeatedly gaining speed and applying brakes.

CLEARING OUT CLUTTER

Remember, when you press the accelerator everything that's in your car is being moved around with you, so declutter regularly or you're wasting fuel. Consider too who is on each journey - if it's just you heading to the shops, take out heavy child seats, your partner's overnight case and that old bike in the boot, or you're paying for the privilege of lugging them about.

IDUNG

Although the engines on new cars will cut out when the motor is stationary, the majority of vehicles will still sit idling, and this is the worst waste of fuel. Simply, if you're going to be sitting still for more than a minute, cut the engine and cut the cost.

WIND IT UP

Driving with windows down reduces aerodynamics and means your motor is pulling in extra fuel just to cover the same distance. Although using your air con can also increase fuel consumption by up to 10 per cent, it's still the more efficient method.

OVER-REVVING

Try to change gear before you hear that familiar strained rev, as overdoing it on your gears not only wastes fuel, but it's also the best way to wear out your engine.

Don't worry – it's not just you. Many of us were thinking the same thing when watching the World Cup final, just as we were for the 1998 tournament, and during the Euros in the year 2000 for that matter too... namely: "France – are they really any better than us?"

FRAN

In the immediate short-term, the answer, of course, is a resounding 'yes', despite the huge advancements made by Gareth Southgate's troops. France coasted through a World Cup during which – barring a funny five minutes against Argentina – they never appeared in any real danger. Over the duration of the tournament, they came from behind, they dominated midfields, they kept clean sheets and they bombarded teams with the sort of relentless goalscoring prowess that the likes of Platini, Trezeguet, Ginola and Cantona would have endorsed.

By the time the French arrived at the World Cup final on July 15, many felt they already had one hand on the trophy. Croatia were a spent force having already endured three ventures into extratime en route to Moscow, and Didier Deschamps' goalscorers provided a fitting reflection of how France's dominance has been acquired. There was Kylian Mbappé, the ruthless goalscorer, Antoine Griezmann, the nippy playmaker, and Paul Pogba, the big-money midfield muscle. With a Mario Mandžukić own goal setting Les Bleus on their way, the probable soon became the inevitable, and not even a Hugo Lloris howler to reduce the arrears to 4-2 (adding to Ivan Perišić's opener for Croatia) could spoil the French party. As fans danced and cavorted on the Champs-Élysées long into the night, they knew this was actually one of their country's less complicated triumphs in a World Cup where Germany, Spain, Brazil and Argentina faltered badly. Even their dispiriting goalless draw against Denmark didn't matter – they'd already qualified for the group stage having seen off Australia and Peru.

Once past Argentina in the second round, Uruguay's stubbornness proved no match in the quarter-final; and when Belgium were defeated by a solitary Samuel Umtiti goal, we all knew how the ending would come about.

Amid a World Cup of VAR (including a penalty award in the final itself which, while not the most controversial of the tournament, was defining in restoring France's lead), ludicrous Neymar antics, a favourable side of the draw and a love affair with Russia that no one expected, few can say the eventual winners were undeserving after negotiating a path that was by no means simple... even if they made it look that way. SPOR

So while the credit goes to the French, the optimism sits with England. After all, compare the sets of players and there are real similarities – for our glorious Golden Boot winner Harry Kane, look at (an inferior) Olivier Giroud; for Raheem Sterling consider the aforementioned Griezmann; for Raphael Varane compare Harry Maguire. On the whole, we compare with the World Champs – they're just a bit, well, better... for now.

So while the French have matched expectations, we've bettered them – and that all bodes well for our prospects at the Euros in two years' time. Allez les Lions.
