The centre reopened on June 20, following a 10-month closure to undergo a £3.5million refurbishment. This was the first project in Suffolk Coastal's five-vear programme to improve leisure

There was a great turnout in the opening week, with over 2,000 people visiting in the first week alone.

Deben Leisure Centre is already doing extremely well with new membership sign-ups comfortably exceeding expectations.

Emili is based at the Woodbridge Complimentary Health Centre and also works with schools.


She chose to work with children and young people because she believes the earlier they intervene with mental health problems, the better the outcome may



Charity asking for community's help



∧ local charity is hoping it will be the recipient of AThe National Lottery funding.

The East Anglian Sailing Trust (EAST) is in the running for a £5,000 grant which will cover 25 per cent of the charity's annual running costs.

Simon Daws, trustee of EAST, has been registered blind for nine years and has been part of the trust since 2009.

He said: "I always did sailing from when I was a teenager. I did it purely for fun and relaxation.

"My sight started to decrease when I was about 40. "My wife thought it wasn't safe for me to sail anymore as I couldn't find my way back. I had to sell my boat with a heavy heart. It was my pride and joy."

The EAST gives adults and children with disabilities the opportunity to enjoy sailing.

Simon continued: "It's a huge social aspect for people that come here. It's about confidence and pushing the barriers."

If the charity received the funding it would be put towards running costs.

Simon said: "Getting money for running costs is a very different kettle of fish and that's where we

News from Councillor Geoff Holdcroft

was very pleased to be asked to write an article for this new magazine celebrating all that is good about Woodbridge. As Suffolk Coastal's cabinet member for economic development I wish VISIONWoodbridge every success in promoting the town and its surrounding area.

On Father's Day, in June, Woodbridge Regatta and Riverside Fair celebrated its 180th anniversary which included a record breaking entry for the raft race organised by 1st Woodbridge Scout Group although local bragging rights went to the rival Scout group in town, 5th Woodbridge as they ended up as victors in a closely contested final race.

Also in June, the new Deben Leisure Centre opened its doors after a nine-month £3.5million redevelopment by the district council. The new gym is amazing and together with a new spa area at the rear of the completely redecorated pool area is a much-needed facility for the area. I know some people were disappointed that a smaller pool suitable for young children could not be incorporated in the new building, but space is very



limited and it just wasn't possible.

The new East Suffolk Council, which will stretch all the way from Felixstowe to Lowestoft, comes into being on April 1, 2019 with elections scheduled for May 2. The Local Government Boundary Commission for England has been looking at the size and shape of the wards that councillors will represent, and they published their draft proposals on July 3. Women affected by cancer screening scandal

More than 7,000 women in Suffolk and north Essex, including Woodbridge, are among the 174,000 who missed out on breast cancer screening because of an IT error, new figures have revealed.

An independent inquiry was launched last month after the government admitted around 75 women had died prematurely as a result of the technical mistake, which dates back to 2009.

Health Secretary Jeremy Hunt MP revealed that 4,412 women in Suffolk who missed their final screening have been offered a new appointment.

Suffolk Coastal was the worst hit constituency, with 840 letters sent. The figure stood at 551 in lpswich, 637 in Central Suffolk and North Ipswich, and 699 in Bury St Edmunds.

There were a further 597 appointments offered in South Suffolk, 377 in West Suffolk and 711 in Waveney, the East Anglian Daily Times reported.

Women aged 50 to 70 are invited for an X-ray

mammogram every three years to detect any lumps or abnormalities that could be or become breast capper.

However, a technical issue dating back to 2009 and only identified in 2018 was responsible for some women in England missing out on the last of their regular invitations for screening.

Mr Hunt MP said the government originally estimated that between 135 and 270 women had died prematurely as a result of the failing – however, he has since reduced that figure to 75.

All those affected who want to be screened will be seen by the end of October, Mr Hunt MP said.

He added: "I would like to repeat my wholehearted and unreserved apology to the women affected and their families – and above all reassure them that we are working hard to understand what went wrong and what we need to do to stop similar incidents from happening in the future."

Revive with coconut oil

If your wooden surfaces or leather upholstery are looking a little lacklustre, they probably just need rehydration and nourishment. But you don't need to splash out on fancy furniture polish or beeswax, as a little coconut oil will do the trick just as well. Start by giving the surface a wipe down with warm water and soap, and when dry, apply coconut oil to an old rag before thoroughly rubbing into furniture.

Use vinegar to naturally stain wood

If you have a wooden table that's looking patchy, or you just prefer a new finish, you can stain naturally with vinegar. Simply combine one cup of vinegar (balsamic for a dark effect, apple cider for a lighter colour) with one cup of water and leave in a bucket for 24 hours with a steel wool pad. Then paint this solution onto your wood - note: it will look significantly lighter when wet (not darker, as you may expect).

Remove stains and marks with everyday products

Forget the harsh chemicals, by mixing up a solution that's three guarters vegetable oil and a guarter vinegar. you can get rid of most superficial wood marks - just rub on and leave. For leather, try using lemon juice, or for tough stains, rub in alcohol.

Shine up glass and mirror surfaces

Got smears that just won't budge? Start with a microfibre cloth to remove dust, then mix a solution that's half white vinegar and half water in a spray bottle. Apply and then buff with microfibre. Finish with a rub of scrunched-up newspaper.

Fill nail holes with wood

What's the best material to fill a hole in wood with? Wood, of course. Depending on the size, use a toothpick, or wooden skewer to fill the space, cut it to the right size and fix with a little wood glue. Sand to finish.



Eco Warrior

WITH YOUR VERY OWN ALLOTMENT SHED

o you have a love for all things homegrown and fancy dipping your toes in sustainable living but don't have a lot of outdoor space? Building or converting an allotment shed could be the perfect solution for you.

Utilise recycled materials

In keeping with the sustainable vibe, try to source as many recycled materials as possible: old pallets are perfect for building a shed from scratch, used tyres are ideal to create raised vegetable beds and recycled water bottles make great hanging planters. ambience and to allow you to enjoy the space late into the night without any detrimental effects to the environment. For the winter months a wood burning stove is a must-have; logs are considered a carbon neutral fuel and therefore much greener than gas or electric heaters.

Create space to escape

It is just as important to create a place to relax in your shed as well a place to store your garden appliances and grow produce. Don't shy away from interior design; injecting your personality into your shed will make you want to spend more time in it. as will a comfy, upcycled chair.

Be environmentally friendly

Lighting can transform a shed from dank and damp to warm and inviting; invest in solar panels to create

Know your limits

Building a green space on your shed roof is a brilliant way to create an allotment with limited space, but this type of project is not for beginners. Drainage, weight distribution, possible planning permission and choosing suitable plants are all important factors. If you are not an experienced gardener then it might be best to start small with a selection of veg you can grow in your shed such as tomato plants, lettuces, potatoes and a selection of herbs.





eware the hidden dangers that are lurking in your garden which could prove fatal to your beloved family pets if consumed. We have identified the most common garden plants which could poison your dog or cat to help you keep your animals safe.

From the stem to the petals, the tulip flower is toxic, but the bulb specifically is poisonous to dogs and cats and when consumed will result in a nasty case of nausea, mouth irritation and excessive drooling. If you are a horse aficionado, it is worth noting that this flower is toxic to our equine friends also.

If you are a keen allotment gardener, always ensure that your tomato plants are not accessible to either cats or dogs as the leaves of this plant are toxic to them.

This variety of crocus is extremely dangerous for both cats and dogs and if ingested can lead to liver and kidney damage, seizures and even death. The spring crocus is not without fault as it can still cause vomiting and diarrhoea but doesn't lead to fatalities.

The beautiful lily flower is a complete no-no for any cat owners as every part of this plant is toxic to them; as little as one petal can make them very ill indeed. Certain varieties are also toxic to dogs.

This common perennial grass weed that can grow up to two feet tall is incredibly harmful to dogs. Most likely to be found in open fields but it could be growing in your garden, this

fter upping sticks for the US three years ago, James Corden has become one of the biggest names in world entertainment, yet it's refreshing to find Uxbridge's most famous export hasn't lost any of his tenderness, humility or down-to-earth charm.

Cheeky, charming and affable as ever, it isn't hard to wonder why the star has enjoyed stellar success, though no one could have predicted he would crack America with such ease. But since taking over from Craig Ferguson as host of CBS's *The Late Late Show*, Corden's fanbase has swelled, as has his bank balance. His popularity is mostly down to a perfectly delivered, self-deprecating sense of humour, though is helped along by an impeccable contacts book, which has seen the likes of Justin Bieber, Mariah Carey and Adele booked for his brilliant *Carpool Karaoke* skit.


But away from the glaring spotlights, Corden likes to keep his life simple. Yes, he is mates with some of the biggest stars going, but outside of work the Brit loves nothing more than relaxing at his home in LA with wife Julia Carey, children Max, seven, Carey, three, and their recent new-born. Family life provides a necessary anchor in the sea of celebdom, as he jokes that his kids don't give a fig about his illustrious career. "They've got bigger fish to fry - I'm just dad. I do the dishes and make funny faces; that's all I'm good for," he jokes.

Having made his name in the late 1990s with the BBC Three sitcom *Gavin & Stacey* – which he co-wrote and starred in with his *Fat Friends* co-star Ruth Jones – Corden is living proof that anything is possible. Yet his last role was opposite some of cinema's hottest and most celebrated stars, in the *Ocean's 8* all-female reboot starring Sandra Bullock, Cate Blanchett and Rihanna.

"Ocean's 8 was really fun," he says with a grin. "I mean, with a cast like that, you know it's going to be incredible.

"I still count myself as lucky every day. To be successful is all I wanted, but as time goes on, you come to realise that to be happy and to feel loved is much more important."

ACHIP OFF THE OLD BLOCK

The history of the classic fish 'n' chips

he UK may be serving up the world something of a food renaissance when it comes to ground-breaking chefs, but in reality, all we need to really dine out on is our greatest ever food export, fish 'n' chips.

Although some of the history around our finest takeaway treat is sketchy, it seems the idea of marrying together the two first came about in the 1860s in Lancashire, when Mossley-based entrepreneur John Lees began selling the combo out of a modest wooden hut. Prior to that, the idea of frying potato had actually been considered as an alternative to fish for the times in the cold winter months when rivers and fishing lakes froze over.

This new dinner revolution quickly caught on, particularly as, over time, people began to discover the ability to add their own subtle touches: ketchup, salt 'n' vinegar, tartar sauce as extra flavouring;

right through to mushy peas, sausages and onion rings as full accompaniments.

Fish 'n' chips are even credited with helping us win the First World War, with the British government of the time making the safeguarding of stocks a priority, just as they did again when we went into battle again in 1939. And you can see why such a complement of carbohydrates and fish (that we regularly call 'brain food') would fuel a nation under attack.

Being an island too, fish stocks have always been in plentiful supply, even if EU regulations over recent decades have affected our reach. Some of the red tape has led to a slight change in consumer tastes, with the emergence of fish such as pollock and hake, although cod remains a solid first choice, with over 60 per cent of us choosing the fluffy, white, moist flavours as our perfect Friday night treat.

elson Mandela walked into a room with the Queen in Durban, South Africa. He briefly left her side as she talked to another guest. I suddenly found myself standing next to the great man and he turned to me and said: "Isn't Elizabeth wonderful?"

Slightly taken aback and wondering who he was taking about, I asked, "Who is Elizabeth?"

Mr Mandela, who had retired as South Africa's first Black president a few months earlier in 1999 looked astonished and pointed at the Queen and said: "Elizabeth of course, your Queen."

I was shocked as I had never heard anyone be so familiar with Her Majesty. I knew her family name was Lilibet and that the Duke of Edinburgh sometimes affectionately called her "Cabbage".

If that left me surprised, I was more shocked when I spoke to his daughter Zindzi who told me that when Mr Mandela and the Queen were alone together in private he called her "Lizzie".

If anyone could pull it off, it's the late South African president. He and "Lizzie" were quite close—she signed letters to him with "Your sincere friend, Elizabeth R."

She referred to him as Nelson.

The couple had become great friends ever since his release in 1990. Eighteen of those years were spent on Robben Island, off the coast of Cape Town. He had been jailed in 1963 after being found guilty of trying to overthrow the government.

The Queen had shown a remarkable piece of judgment. After all, Mrs Thatcher had called Mandela a terrorist in Vancouver in 1987.


The world mourned when he died in 2013, aged 95. This month (July 18) marks the centenary of his birth.

Although he spent his life fighting Britain's colonial legacy in South Africa, Nelson Mandela was an Anglophile. The roots of his close and contradictory relationship with Britain were in his childhood.

Born into a tribal aristocracy in the Transkei, the seven-year-old Rolihlahla Mandela was sent to a Christian mission school.

It was the custom then for all the African boys to be given English names, so on his first day his teacher renamed him Nelson Mandela and a man of the people was born.





Babe Ruth

Widely considered one of the greatest baseball players ever to grace the diamond, and one of the five first inductees of the sport's Hall of Fame, George 'Babe' Ruth learned to be both

a proficient carpenter and shirtmaker during his time at a reformatory and orphanage, and even during The Bambino's high-flying time with the Yankees, Ruth would adjust his own shirt collars.

Graham Hill

As suave a speedster as ever there was, Hill – the only man to win the coveted Triple Crown of Motorsport (the Monaco Grand Prix, Le Mans and the Indianapolis 500) – only passed his driving test at age 24. Before this, he was an apprentice engineer at Smith's Instruments, and even spent some time with the Royal Navy aboard HMS Swiftsure, rising to the rank of Petty Officer.

Neville Southall

Widely considered one of the greatest goalkeepers ever to grace British football – and Wales' all-time appearance maker to boot – Southall came into the beautiful game relatively late having worked as a binman, waiter and hod carrier, the first of these becoming the inspiration behind his autobiography *The Binman Chronicles*.

Get creative and add food colouring and glitter to your slime.

Friday

Strengthen their little fingers (great for handwriting) and have them in fits of laughter with cornstarch goo; it's basically homemade quicksand. Just gradually mix cornstarch with water and you are off.



Build a fortress with DIY kinetic sand; so much cheaper than the shop bought product and the kids will never know the difference. Simply bake 2lbs of sand at 120 degrees for 5 hours. Then, mix one bottle (5oz) of clear glue with one cup of liquid starch until you have a runny slime consistency. Gradually add a spoonful of the slime to the sand until you get the desired effect.

Saturday

Create their very own ice cream parlour with cloud dough, supereasy to make and with minimal mess; a win-win situation for all. Simply mix 1 cup of baby oil with 8 cups of flour and you are ready to go. Set out some ice cream scoops, spoons and tubs, and let their imagination do the rest.

Create their favourite animals or insects with solt dough figures; hours of endless interactive and imaginative play, and that's after the fun of building the figures.
