The 1980s were a dark, crusty, sometimes snuffly period where noses were concerned. Despite being accompanied by the radiant Princess Diana, Prince Charles's hooter was seemingly on the front of every newspaper, Barbara Streisand's snorter was helping her to the top of the charts, and even the striking coal miners found themselves at the septum of nostril-led nastiness... 'What do you do if the government gets up your nose? Picket.'

But then, in 1988, something changed. Richard Curtis – for so long sticking his finger up the schnozzle of the establishment courtesy of his iconic *Blackadder* character – paired up with occasional funnyman Lenny Henry to start a new fundraising concept that had comedy at its heart.

It was called Comic Relief. It invited celebrities to challenge, entertain and host; it offered schoolkids and community leaders the chance to get their creative juices flowing; it implored TV watchers to dig deep for the less fortunate in society; and rallied around TV editors to free up screen time and resources for a total tee-hee takeover.

It's now a project that runs every two years, with merchandise, oneoff specials (such as *Comic Relief does The Apprentice*) and outwardbound pursuits (notably this year it's a wealth of celebrities, including Jade Thirlwall and Leigh-Anne Pinnock from Little Mix, *Strictly* judge Shirley Ballas, former MP Ed Balls, and TV presenters Dan Walker, Anita Rani and Alexander Armstrong, climbing the 19,000ft peak of Mount Kilimanjaro). There's also a showpiece event at Wembley Arena, with 2019 welcoming heavyweights from the comedy world: Jimmy Carr, Rob Beckett, John Bishop, Romesh Ranganathan, Alan Carr and others.

And let's not forget the noses themselves – 11 new stonkers such as Sir Schnoz III, The Abominable Snoseman and Hairy Nostroll, all of which can be brought to life with augmented reality on your smartphone through the Red Nose Day app.

Since Red Nose Day 2017, nearly 15 million people across the UK and some of the world's poorest communities have been helped, and an estimated two-and-a-half million of those are children and vulnerable adults.

While the project uses Red Nose Day as its centrepiece – and in the past 30 years has raised over £1billion for charitable causes – the charity's work stretches well beyond putting a lump of foam on the end of your nozzle. Right now, the organisers are reaching out to anyone

who wants to get involved ahead of the big day on March 15. A mobile phone Red Nose Day giving page is a simple and hassle-free platform for raising funds – past that it's just a case of how far your imagination will take you in dressing up, performing, baking, physical challenges, parties, applebobbing... anything goes for the red nose.

From raising £15million in its first year, to a record high of £108million in 2011, the growth in Red Nose Day's popularity has been Pinocchio-esque. Can it reach new heights – or is it lengths – this year? With your help, perhaps.

April 1 – April Fool's Day. It's one date on the calendar the practical jokers all come out in force for, and avoiding the traps can be tricky.

The provenance of April Fool's Day – it's not really a day as you only have until noon to construct your web of deceit – is sketchy to say the least, but some believe it originates in 16th Century France. Previously, the 'New Year' began on April 1, but once the Gregorian calendar was introduced, that annual event went back to January 1.

This calendar change was met with some resistance, leading those who took up the change to mock and play tricks on people who didn't, thus referring to them as 'April Fools'.

The first recorded reference to the day was in 1686 when the writer John Aubrey called it 'Fooles Holy Day'; and 12 years later, newsletter printer Ichabod Dawks wrote: "Yesterday being the first of April, several persons were sent to the tower ditch to see the lions washed."

That particular prank continued into the 18th and 19th centuries where those easily-led were invited to view this supposed annual ceremony... only to find that they been sent on a fool's errand.

Since the invention of the TV, the BBC have tested out a number of 'ideas' on the nation, including their famous spaghetti plants – which was so successful, viewers wanted to know where they could obtain one of their own – and 'Smell-o-Vision', where smells were to be broadcast alongside programmes.

Skier triumphs at English Alpine Championships

Woodbridge School pupil Honor Bartlett was delighted to be crowned the best skier for her age in England after a triumphant week at the English Alpine Championships in Bormio, Italy,

The 13-year-old is one of the top young skiers in Britain, and reached the podium at the event where Dave Ryding, a World Cup alpine ski racer, began his career, one of the biggest in the annual calendar.

And final-day gold in the showpiece slalom on Stella Alpina piste saw Honor complete a superb set of race wins across super-G and giant slalom disciplines.

She said: "I'm delighted, it's a really nice way to end the week.

"I've felt good on the skis the whole time - I wasn't expecting the giant slalom to go so well or for my performances to be this good in general.

"I'm so happy to win the overall title in my second year in this age group. I always love coming to Bormio."

lans for a Woodbridge community youth and arts centre have been unanimously approved.

The decision about Jetty Lane was made by Suffolk Coastal District Council on February 21.

Project manager Cordelia Richman said: "I'm thrilled, especially because it was a unanimous decision by the planning committee.

"Several of the members of the committee made some really lovely statements about us and it was quite a ringing endorsement."

Following the news, Cordelia has received lots of messages of support from members of the public.

She explained: "I've received dozens of emails saying how thrilled they are for us.

"We know there are some people who objected to our application and while we're sorry about that we do know that we're going to do our utmost to be good neighbours and allay their fears."

As part of the plans there will be two halls and

some meeting rooms available for hire, a large kitchen attached to one of the halls and eight studios for emerging artists.

There may also be some small rooms which can be used for mentoring or one-to-one activities.

Just42, a local children's charity, will be based at the centre and has offices there.

There will also be a limited number of office facilities available for commercial rent, which will enable the centre to be run to a high standard and subsidise charges for community activities.

Cordelia added: "It's been a real team effort among the directors to get to this point and we feel we've come a long way since early 2017 when Caroline Page had the foresight and drive to fight to rebuild a new centre after the vouth centre on the site was demolished. Caroline is a really inspiring chairman and leader for us."

Tide Mill reopens after a busy winter

Woodbridge Tide Mill Living Museum officially reopens on the weekend of March 29-31.

For the first time this winter the mill opened occasionally for milling demonstrations which have proved very popular.

New head miller Dan Tarrant-Willis came up with the idea of these demonstrations as he was milling to satisfy the mill's flour customers and thought 'why not let people watch'.

On 27 occasions he opened the mill to let visitors see it in action. A mild winter helped attract numerous new visitors during this normally quiet time.

As well as continuing with a full schedule of wheel turnings and milling demos, the mill is planning several other new developments to raise its profile and generate more visitors.

The team is also keen to encourage people to support the mill by becoming Friends of The Tide Mill. These include working closely with the Long Shed and Woodbridge Museum to attract footfall, holding more events at the mill, continuing to support local events, as well as offering the mill for event hire.

Chairman of Trustees John Carrington said: "Dan's initiative has highlighted the popularity of seeing the mill in action and the opportunity we have to review our traditional closed season.

"The mill costs around £5,000 per month to run and this doesn't cover the funds we have to put aside for significant periodic maintenance. So we need to give visitors what they want".

Recent wins included 8-2 at Hadleigh United, 4-0 at Gorleston and 1-0 at home to Norwich United.



News from **Councillor Geoff Holdcroft** District & Town Councillor for Woodbridge

Dealing with planning applications is probably the most contentious aspect of any district councillor's role whether they sit on the planning committee, as I do, or not. The Jetty Lane Project application that was granted by the council last month illustrates this issue very clearly.

Ever since becoming a district councillor 10 years ago, I have supported two of the organisations, Just42 and 1st Woodbridge Scouts, who have come together with others to seek to build a purpose-built community, youth and arts centre on the land in The Avenue previously occupied by the Youth Centre.

The applicants had, in their words, a big and bold vision to create a beautiful, dramatic and above all practical new community centre that would create a modern vibrant legacy for future generations in Woodbridge and beyond. Objecting to the proposal were a group of Woodbridge residents, not only those who lived close to the site but elsewhere in town, who in their words said the building was far too high and much too big for the site. They also objected to the additional light pollution, disturbance and traffic that the use of the building by its various users would cause.



Like every other planning application, the decision is down to balancing the good that comes from the building against the harm that is caused. As a councillor for Woodbridge I was able to give voice to the concerns of those residents who had objected questioning both planning and highways officers as well as the applicant about its impact. The applicants were very clear about the benefits of the project to community life including how it would be funded without recourse to public funds so at the end of the debate I was pleased to propose its acceptance and the application was granted unanimously.

Bookshop shortlisted for regional award

A Woodbridge bookshop has been shortlisted in The British Book Awards 2019.

Woodbridge Emporium, on The Thoroughfare, will appear under the Independent Bookshop of the Year category.

Owner Jules Button is delighted to have been shortlisted.

M & S to close despite 'heartfelt protests'

"Despite saying it was consulting with people over the proposal, this appears to have been a done deal from the beginning, as Marks & Spencer has blatantly ignored the heartfelt protests of local people, who have campaigned vigorously to keep this shop open.

"What is particularly disappointing is that Marks & Spencer has chosen to discount the strong business case that we have made for the shop to remain open in some form, based on the predicted continued growth of Felixstowe's economy. We are committed to maintaining a vibrant High Street in Felixstowe."



Eco Gardening

t can become all too easy to rely on pesticides and nasty chemicals to treat our garden and deal with any unwanted pests, but surely there must be an alternative that is better for us, our garden and the environment?

Mulching beverages

Rather than buying expensive pesticides which can cause more harm than good, why not try mulching beverages instead.

Simply save up any used ground coffee or tea leaves and sprinkle around you garden or add to your compost heap. This will not only deter insects from eating your produce but also enrich the soil in your garden.

Copper control

Slugs can be a real nuisance in the garden; munching on flowers, plants and vegetables alike. Luckily there is a common household object that can easily deter them from your prized plants. he word aromatherapy may evoke luxurious but pricey massages, decadent bath oils, and tiny bottles of precious elixir, but in reality it's very easy to plant and grow your own aromatic herbs and plants, creating a space that is fresh, fragrant and inexpensive.

Great options for your window box include basil, lavender, rosemary, mint, jasmine, oregano and rose.

Once your plants are flourishing all you need to decide is what to do with them. The easy answer is 'nothing', for even a stroll through a garden fragrant with honeysuckle and rose, or a gentle waft of jasmine through the window, can be soothing in itself. Herbs like rosemary and basil of course are great to use when cooking; chamomile and mint can be steeped in hot water as tea, while lavender is ideal for a relaxing bath.

By the end of summer it is possible to have a veritable apothecary on your doorstep, which can be harvested and dried to enjoy when the cold sets in.

Mhen is Dain OK?

We've all felt that ache after a strenuous workout, but when does it become something to worry about, asks Julie Foster?

Muscle soreness is a side effect of the stress put on muscles when vou exercise.

It usually begins within six-toeight hours after a new activity or a change in activity and can last up to 24-48 hours after the exercise.

All people are at risk for muscle soreness. even professional athletes. The good news is that normal muscle soreness is a sign that you're getting stronger and is nothing to be alarmed about.

During exercise, you stress your muscles and the fibres begin to break down. As the fibres repair themselves, they become larger and stronger. This means that your muscles will be better prepared next time you work out.

The best way to relieve harmless post exercise muscle soreness is to perform some gentle exercises, like walking or light stretching.

Mild to moderate muscle soreness is common and usually harmless. However, if the pain you're experiencing prevents you from carrying out daily activities associated with living or working, then it is wise to see the surgery nurse or GP.

If the pain begins during the exercise, then it should be seen as a signal from your body to stop the activity before serious joint or muscle damage occurs.

AN ORIGINAL ENGLAND ICON

he passing of Gordon Banks in the middle of February offered the nation a chance of reflect and admire arguably the most iconic keeper the England football team has ever had.

Across two World Cups the Sheffield-born stopper wrote his name into Three Lions folklore – first, repelling West Germany at Wembley in 1966 as Sir Alf Ramsey's men lifted the Jules Rimet Trophy; then four years later, in Mexico, making a seemingly impossible save to thwart the great Pele.

In truth, England's World Cup win on July 30, 1966, was built around 10 other footballers, and as for the best save ever, it's doubtful... and these are facts the impossibly modest Banks reminded people of regularly in what is half a century since.

His humility was only one part of his character. Banks was a dominant, strapping, resilient, battling keeper from an altogether different era, where footballers were everyday folk, and retirement often led to opening a pub rather than going after the much-vaunted 'media work'.

He starred for Leicester City at the time of England's greatest game, and despite surprisingly being allowed to leave the Foxes little more than a year after that Wembley win, went on to make almost 200 appearances for Stoke City, prolonging his international career until the age of 35.

His retirement from the game was ultimately forced on him after a car crash in October 1972. He lost the sight in his right eye, and with it, the ability to perform fully as a keeper, despite stints thereafter in the US and Ireland.

Although he took up coaching and management roles, his experiences were never going to match those as a player and he left the game, returning later as an ambassador for Stoke City and regular member of the Pools Panel.

Banks passed peacefully away in his sleep on February 12, 2019.

SPORT FAILING with style

e it careening down cascading waterfalls or leaping into rapids from a helicopter, Tao Berman has consistently pushed the boundaries when it comes to extreme sports.

When it comes to white water, there's extreme... and then there's Tao Berman. The Washington State native, who turns 40 this year, made his name as one of the most fearless kayakers known to the sport, capable of descending near-vertical waterfalls and performing incredible stunts.

"I never had the objective of doing the extreme stunts," he admits. "As I progressed I was just constantly looking for new ways to push against my abilities, and as I got better at it I needed to take greater and greater risks to push my skill set to continue to get better."

This is the man who, as a 15-year-old amateur kayaker, was already starting to "run waterfalls and things of that nature". In 1997, Berman ran an 83ft descent on the El Tomata River in Mexico; by 1999, at age 19, he'd conquered the Upper Johnston Falls in Banff National Forest – all 98 feet of its thundering vertical drop – and landed a coveted place in the Guinness Book of World Records.

At the turn of the decade, however, Berman decided to hang up his paddle and retire from the world of extreme kayaking, having "accomplished every goal" he had set for himself.

"When I first got into it, I was pushing and progressing into the extreme end of the sport and after setting several world records in the extreme end, including the highest waterfall ever kayaked, I then got into freestyle kayaking," he explains. "After being ranked number one in the world, by winning the three world championships, I was looking for a new challenge so I got into extreme racing – which is racing down white water for a time – and after doing


