Tt's surprising Donald Trump didn't venture around the UK in an armoured tank given the amount of vitriol that laid in wait around every corner during the US President's visit in the middle of July.

Yet a guaff of thick hair and an even thicker skin accompanied the bolshie and intentionally controversial leader, whose three-day working visit to the UK followed a NATO summit in Brussels, and preceded equally spicy talks with Russia President Vladimir Putin in Finland. Love him or loathe him, the 72-year-old doesn't do things in short measures.

Whether linking hands with Prime Minister Theresa May or haplessly failing to follow royal convention with the Queen at Windsor Castle, Trump revelled in the pomp and the protests.

He is in fact the 13th US president that Her Majesty has met during her reign. and the exchange was said to be cordial ... so cordial in fact that HRH - on behalf of the government - laid out an invitation for a full state visit in April of next year, immediately after the conclusion of the Brexit process (whether or not we have struck a deal with the EU). That visit will include a military guard of honour and carriage ride up the Mall to Buckingham Palace... and perhaps a few thousand expletive-ridden placards too.

Trump divides opinion like no one else before him. Recently, his policy of keeping migrant children in cages at the US border appears brutal, yet his praise for our Prime Minister, and stories of his mother Mary Anne's praise for Her Majesty and 'tell it like it is' approach appeal wholeheartedly to those tired of 'suit and shoes' politics.

While those who hosted him in July were welcoming, others refused to engage. There was no meeting at all with the American citizen who has joined our Royal Family, Meghan Markle (who isn't quiet in her dislike of the president); nor was there a visit by Mr Trump to the new US Embassy south of the river (after he criticised the move from Grosvenor Square).

In addition, he was not invited to address both Houses of Parliament - an honour that has been accorded to previous US presidents - because of opposition from John Bercow, the Commons speaker.

But progress was made at Chequers where bilateral talks with Theresa May went well, and it appears the personal relationship between the two may have gone up a degree or two in warmth, despite a very obvious frosty chill continuing to linger just below the surface.

Trump concluded proceedings in Scotland where he played a round of golf with Prince Andrew at Turnberry, the course he owns, Business and pleasure - par for the course.

HOW TO BEST PEST-PROOF YOUR HOME

t's silly season when it comes to all manner of midges, moths and mayflies making homelife hell at this time of the year.

Also check roof overhangs for nests, keep windows and doors shut when possible and inspect beds, pillows and mattresses for bugs, vacuuming regularly.

In the garden, be wary of shrubbery and vegetation, store wood elevated and away from house walls, and keep compost containers sealed.

As Michael Barrymore once said: "A hotspot is not a good spot." So check places where heat gets trapped; while leaving food out is an open invitation to dine, these creatures are really not the greatest of dinner party guests. Loving the room.

Ur homes are filled with so many different styles, fabrics and finishes when it comes to floors – a far cry from dull carpets and plain tiles just a generation ago. These days you can factor in wondrous wooden surfaces, laminate, slate, marble and even polished concrete. While variety is the spice of any living space, each finish comes with its own required maintenance, and it's worth paying attention to



these in order to ensure your living space stays, well... alive.

CARPETS

The best and safest surface for children, comfortable underfoot, and with the widest variety of colours and designs, carpets are however a breathing ground for bacteria. > are prefinished, but not all, so check before treating and use only cleaners specific to your floor type. Now you're ready, use a dust mop or vacuum to remove surface debris, then simply mop to remove dirt using a trusted cleaning agent before allowing to dry naturally.

SLATE / TILES

Whether a chic or rustic finish, hard floors give a room solidity and style, though can be expensive and unforgiving for youngsters. A mild detergent in hot water and a rag or chamois will see you right, though you may want to toothbrush the grouted gaps with soap a few times a year.

VINYL

Cheap, wide-ranging in styles and with the ability to wipe away any sin, vinyl can show wear quickly if not maintained. A homemade apple vinegar and hot water solution will do everything a shop-bought cleaner achieves.

With the start of the new football season just days away, The Blues will open their National League South campaign with a trip to Truro. The journey of 305 miles will be Town's longest of the season.

Three days later, Harry Wheeler's men have their first game at the AGP Arena when they take on Concord Rangers.

In early November, Town make history when they take on Torquay United in Devon for the first time in their history.

On Boxing Day, the Blues face an Essex derby when they travel to Chelmsford City with the return fixture coming just three days later.

The 2018-2019 season is due to end on April 27 with Bath City coming to Billericay.

Meanwhile Wheeler said he had been very pleased with the Blues pre-season preparations before Town got the campaign up and running with a 1-1 draw against Ebbsfleet United.

He said: "Pre-season has been bright and very sharp so far. The players have applied themselves fantastically throughout and went into the game in good shape. It's a great first game for us against a very well-run club with top facilities and we are looking forward to seeing where the players are physically and in terms of quality at this stage of pre-season."

Town started the pre-season with a creditable draw against National League side Ebbsfleet in Kent, Sam Deering cancelling out an early goal for the home side.

After a defeat to Evo-Stik League South champions Beaconsfield Town, Billericay travelled to Aveley to take on Isthmian League North Division side Aveley FC. Jake Howells, Sam Deering and Jordy Mangol gave the visitors an unassailable 3-0 lead.

At time of writing, the Blues were due to travel back to Kent to take on National League opponents Maidstone United. Thumping 5-0 wins recorded away at Isthmian Premier side, Folkestone Invicta, and, back at the Gallagher Stadium, versus Nottingham Forest U23s indicate that the Stones are gelling nicely ahead of the new League campaign.

There was further excitement for Blues fans as owner Glenn Tamplin said he would be unveiling two new signings at the Maidstone game.

Youth group set up to help children



Agroup of volunteers are hoping to change the lives of young people.

Youth Matters, which was set up by a group of local people, aims to help people between the ages of 10 and 18 years old to get support during difficult times.

Local companies have donated items such as T-shirts, business cards and some materials for sessions, however the group needs the community's help to keep the sessions running.

Donna continued: "We would also like to be able to fund any child that we feel needs urgent help and we can get private therapy for."

News from the policing team

Basildon Community Policing Team have been dealing with issues raised by Billericay residents. Inspector Steve Parry said: "In June's local community meeting, police visibility in and around the town was raised. My team have provided a high visibility presence on the high street, engaging with the public and working alongside council licensing and volunteers.

"The team have continued to build on public engagement and were delighted to take part in Billericayfest 2018. Supported by the Special Constabulary and Police cadets, the community event at Barleylands saw younger members of the community really enjoying their interactions.

"Work has continued in relation to anti-social behaviour and drug activity. Lake Meadows has continued to see focus with a number of youths stop checked, intelligence gathered and positive action taken against individuals found in possession of cannabis.

"The team respond to all intelligence and a recent warrant in Billericay uncovered a cannabis cultivation. Investigation continues into two persons who have been arrested and interviewed for possession of a controlled drug with intent to supply cannabis. This case highlights the value of passing information through to either the police or Crimestoppers anonymously on 0800 555 111."

Drugs and cash seized following police search

Officers seized drugs and associated paraphernalia when they executed a drugs warrant in Billericay recently.

On June 19, officers from Basildon Policing Team visited a property in Stonechat Road following information provided by the public.

Police seized more than 30 plants believed to be cannabis from the property's garage, loft, freezer and garden. Drug paraphernalia and £1,200 in cash was also seized.

A 28-year-old man and a 28-year-old woman have been interviewed in connection with the incident and at the time of going to print, investigations were still ongoing.

hese days, a large garden with an abundance of trees, plants, a vegetable plot and perhaps even a small area for herbs is a luxury few of us have. In fact, the pair make such a terrific team that they will be joining *The X Factor* panel as judges when it returns to our screens later this year.

What we can expect from this new era of the larger-than-life superstar remains to be seen, but love him or loathe him, the British celeb circuit is a lot less entertaining without Robbie Williams.

The recent lengthy spell of hot weather has taken its toll on much of our greenery, and there are many brown lawns and wilting plants visible as I travel around the Brentwood and Ongar area.

The local water companies, Affinity and Essex and Suffolk Water, have made it clear they are doing their bit to ensure we have the water we need but are urging us to do our bit to conserve this precious resource during the dry summer (at the time of writing the driest start to a summer ever). Those brown lawns are deceptive – a couple of days of rain and they will be back to their full emerald glory.

We are fortunate to have many well-cultivated allotment sites across the constituency, and there is a steady stream of plot holders heading out to water their rapidly developing courgettes, tomatoes and beans when the air is cooler and the water will not be burned off by the sun. Hosepipes are not allowed on most allotment sites, so there is plenty of hard work to be done trudging backwards and forwards from the water points with heavy watering cans.

Allotmenteers are canny people, and there are multiple water butts and water saving devices to be seen next to the homebuilt sheds and polytunnels. And the watering can/water butt system seems to work well for them...a quick glance across the sites sees an abundance of crops.

I'm impressed by the enthusiasm for homegrown veg across the constituency – there's a real feel of "Dig for Victory" from some people who prefer a back garden full of potatoes and swedes than neatly clipped shrubs and lawns. And it seems to work – one of last year's *Great British Bake Off* competitors used his Brentwood allotment produce for his bakes, and I've noticed while out visiting groups in the constituency there are an abundance of courgette recipes doing the rounds too.

It's summer time, and with more skin on show and foreign travel on the horizon we wanted to talk about moles.

t's all too easy to become accustomed to our predictable, brown dots. Our 'forever' skin marks which we've had for most of our adult lives. The trouble is that these neat, round companions can change over time. What is a mole?

Moles are small coloured spots on the skin, often a brownish colour, although some may be darker or skin-coloured. They can be flat or raised, smooth or rough, and some have hair growing from them. Moles are usually circular or oval with a smooth edge.

Moles can change in number and appearance. Some fade away over time, often without you realising. They also sometimes respond to hormonal changes, for example during:

- pregnancy when they may get slightly darker
- teenage years when they increase in number
- older age when they may disappear from 40 to 50 years of age onwards

Most adults will have between 10 and 40 harmless moles on their body by the time they reach 40. Some may be unsightly and affect your confidence. They may also be a nuisance, for example if they regularly catch on your clothing or you cut them

while shaving.

Cannabliss

ome are calling for its legalisation in the UK, but just how effective is medical marijuana? And do the pros really outweigh the cons?

When Home Secretary Sajid Javid intervened to allow the cannabis oil treatment of a severely epileptic 12-year-old whose medication had been confiscated by Customs officers back in June, it put the argument of whether medical marijuana ought to be legalised back on the table.

Certainly Charlotte Caldwell, the mother of the boy in question, thinks it should be, and her voice is backed by sufferers (or their friends) of conditions that marijuana is known to treat - from helping to control epileptic seizures, slowing Alzheimer's, possibly even preventing cancer cells from spreading. Even former Health Secretary

Jeremy Hunt has called for cannabis oil to be made freely available on the NHS, but the topic remains contentious, with concerns that legalisation may just usher in a whole new health crisis as patients become addicted to the substance.

So what are the pros? Cannabis is currently classified as a Class B drug in the UK and carries a prison sentence of up to five years for possession. Advocates for legalisation argue that making it legally available would not only benefit the war on drugs, but it would also create a billion-pound industry that is fully taxable. Also, with concerns that street weed is dangerous in being laced with other substances such as PCP (which can cause psychosis, extreme anxiety and seizures), it would surely be advantageous to know that a safer option was available.

Having said that, there is also the risk that people who have never before tried the drug could become hooked, while also sending out a message that substance experimentation is suddenly okay.

The big question is, will legalisation create a nation of healthy go-getters or an army of stoners?

Baking Soda

How to get whiter teeth at home (and mostly using ingredients you already have in your cupboard).

f you've always dreamt of having a megawatt smile like Angelina Jolie or perfect gnashers like Tom Cruise but don't have the cash to splash out on an expensive whitening treatment at a private clinic, then you'll be happy to know that there are plenty of tricks and techniques you can try at home. Let's start with the basics. You may not believe in the power of the humble toothbrush, but a good dental hygiene regime will go a long way towards keeping your teeth their best. Flossing is a great way to minimise the build-up of plaque (which is the white/yellow stuff in between your teeth) so do it every day and consider investing in an electric toothbrush – they are proven to be more effective.

Next up we want to focus on stain removal. Ever wondered why some toothpastes contain baking soda? It's because it creates an alkaline environment in your mouth, which over time will whiten your teeth. You don't need to buy a fancy toothpaste though, just mix a little baking powder with your regular one. Then, follow up with apple cider vinegar diluted in water to kill any remaining bacteria.

Finally, it's important to stop further staining from building up, so cut down on sugary treats, black coffee and red wine, or even drink them through a paper straw. Load up your diet in foods that are rich in calcium and include lots of crunchy veg like apples and carrots (which remove plaque as you chew). Another way to keep your mouth and breath fresh throughout the day is to try 'oil pulling'. Once a day swish a tablespoon of coconut oil around your mouth for 15-20 minutes. The oil pulls all bacteria out of your mouth, and some people swear it brightens their teeth too.

Fruit Cocktails

In a world of experimentation, cross-breeding of fruits and vegetables was inevitable and thankfully it has resulted in some weird and wonderful creations that will brighten up your meal times.

Blood Limes

If you like blood oranges, then blood limes are definitely for you. A hybrid of an Ellendale mandarin and a red finger lime, they are less bitter and more sweet than their standard counterparts. Best for making marmalades, preserves or sauces, blood limes also work well as a vivid garnish on an otherwise run of the mill salad.

Plumcots

Plumcots are the innovative creation of nursery owner Luther Burbank and combine the sweet apricot with the tart plum to create a perfectly balanced fruit. Originally 75 per cent plum and 25 per cent apricot, this fabulous hybrid was first produced over a century ago but proved too difficult to grow at the time. Today we enjoy a more advanced hybrid known as the pluot.

Cucamelons

Possibly our favourite hybrid; the cucamelon is similar in appearance to a tiny watermelon but tastes like a cucumber with a hint of sourness. Also known as the Mexican sour gherkin cucumber, we recommend pickling this fruit with dill and mint leaves or simply adding it to a salad cut in half as you would a tomato.

Kalettes

Brussels sprouts - you either love them or you hate them. That is why British agricultural experts have spent the last 15 years working on a tastier sprout by cross-breeding it with the ever-

popular kale. Both these sprouting vegetables are part of the Brassica family, which makes them ideal for producing a hybrid. The end result is a nuttier, sweeter version of the sprout that also looks more appealing to eat.

ANNUITIES

When you retire, you can choose to take some or all of your pension pot as an annuity, an insurance product that provides a guaranteed income for life. One of the benefits that annuities provide is security. Unlike other retirement income products, and with the exception of investment-linked annuities, you aren't exposed to stock market risk which could erode your income. On the downside, should you die early, the residual value of the annuity dies with you; there is usually no return of capital to your estate.

DRAWDOWN

With income drawdown, you take a retirement income direct from your pension pot while leaving the rest of the cash invested, providing an opportunity for future growth. There is no minimum amount for drawdown,

so you could, for instance, take your 25% tax-free lump sum and choose to leave the remaining funds invested. You can also move funds into drawdown in stages, known as partial or phased drawdown. The 25% tax-free amount doesn't have to be taken at once on retirement – smaller amounts can be taken over time, each with 25% tax-free. Once in drawdown you can access funds as you need them. You could, for example, vary the amount you take each year, taking less if you wish to remain in a lower tax band, or more if you have plans to spend. After taking your 25% tax-free cash, your withdrawals will be subject to income tax and your drawdown income is added to any other income you receive in that tax year. It's important to remember that taking large withdrawals may result in you paying tax at a higher rate.

Je've all found ourselves at the petrol pump wondering how it is the last tank of fuel evaporated quite so quickly. The truth is, it's not just distance that costs us dear when it comes to the cost of filling up, it's our driving habits too. Here are five steps towards achieving driving efficiency, and with it, a lowering of fuel costs:

NIFTY FIFTY

Driving between 50-55mph is the optimum speed for the majority of modern engines and UK roads, and moving along at a sensible speed also optimises stopping distances so that you are not wasting fuel by repeatedly gaining speed and applying brakes.

CLEARING OUT CLUTTER

Remember, when you press the accelerator everything that's in your car is being moved around with you, so declutter regularly or you're wasting fuel. Consider too who is on each journey - if it's just you heading to the shops, take out heavy child seats, your partner's overnight case and that old bike in the boot, or you're paying for the privilege of lugging them about.

IDUNG

Although the engines on new cars will cut out when the motor is stationary, the majority of vehicles will still sit idling, and this is the worst waste of fuel. Simply, if you're going to be sitting still for more than a minute, cut the engine and cut the cost.

WIND IT UP
