A dalliance with design that has lasted 50 years

icky Haslam has assumed many guises throughout his life - designer, show horse breeder, global socialite, friend to the stars. The inspirational designer even waited until his 73rd birthday to release his debut album, finally indulging one of his boyhood daydreams with the assistance of industry heavyweights such as Nick Mason (Pink Floyd), Helena Bonham Carter, Bryan Ferry and the late Cilla Black.

But it is clearly for his immaculate take on style and fashion that we have become most absorbed in Nicky Haslam's work. The Buckinghamshire-born icon has been the creative auteur and driving force behind London institution NH Design, and while he admits his workload has reduced in recent years as he fights against the idea of retirement, his hunger for interiors has never abated.



Lake Meadow confirmed as one of Britain's best parks

A Billericay park has been named as one of the best Ain the country having claimed an award at the UK Park of the Year 2019 competition.

Lake Meadow won the 'Much Loved' award after being placed in the top 20 per cent of all nominations nationally in voting for UK's Best Park 2019.

The 40-acre park is visited daily by hundreds of people of all ages, who utilise the peace, green spaces, mature trees, lake, statues and sports.

The park is maintained by the Friends of Lake Meadows (FOLM) which is an independent local charity, with volunteers working in partnership with Basildon Council and Billericay Town Council for the benefit of the community.

They contribute about 1,500 hours of volunteer time. They help to care for the park, to promote its benefits, improve its facilities and encourage conservation.

One nominator for Lake Meadows was full of praise for FOLM.

He said: "Our Friends group cares for the gardens, runs events, installs exciting projects and promotes wildlife in the ancient woodland, flower meadow and conservation areas."

FOLM told VISIONBillericayShenfield: "As Friends

we like to think that our efforts have contributed to the award by enhancements to the park both by our volunteering and also the new areas and facilities we have provided.

"We hope that this award will improve the visibility of the Friends and lead to more members. I think that it is a boost to all the volunteers.

"Basildon Council are responsible for the care of the park, but for the last seven years FOLM have helped in various ways. We hold a gardening group with 20 volunteers, who look after all the garden areas every Tuesday, working for 46 weeks a year.

"In addition, we hold a monthly working party to do more general tasks such as the spring clean of all the park signs and benches. Our ecology volunteers help to promote the wildlife by improving habitats, such as developing the wild flower meadow in the conservation area.

"We are also providing information boards about the habitats. We converted the old hut into our information centre with lots of information about the park and its history displayed. This needs manning and a team of volunteers open it for a couple of hours four or five days a week."



Four motor enthusiasts from Billericay said they "had a blast" as they drove more than 2,000 miles to Italy and back to raise money for a social club.

The group took part in a rally known as The Skinflint Rally - *The Italian Job*, with the route taking the teams that were taking part to Italy.

The journey travelled through the Great St Bernard's Pass, which features in the opening scene of *The Italian Job*.

Simon Poole, 44, Marcus Bennett, 43, Gabriel Dascalu, 31, and Daniel Jackson, 43, travelled in their Billericay Skinflint Rally Rover 75 which went on to win the Best Dressed Car award.

The rally, which wasn't a race, saw 12 teams with a budget of just \pounds 800 buy and prepare their car for

the journey, which took place between September 12 and 16.

The Billericay team also used the challenge as an opportunity to fundraise for round table.

The four who took part are all round tablers and they set a target of \pounds 1,500 which will help go towards events in the town.

Simon, from the Billericay Skinflint Rally Team, said: "We had so much banter with the other teams and we raised a shed-load of money for charity which is awesome and such a big part of it.

"We went from Billericay down to Chambery in the French Alps. We went from there to Turin through the Great St Bernard's Pass from *The Italian Job.*"

This year, Billericay's town crier, Jim Shrubb, helped proceedings along.



Acafe owner in Shenfield says she is "worried" about alcohol-related issues after planning permission was given to open a new bar.

The former NatWest Bank in Hutton Road will become a bar and restaurant after Brentwood Council approved plans for it to reopen in its new guise.

It will serve alcohol between 10am and 10.30pm Monday to Thursday, between 10am and 11.30pm on Friday and Saturday and 10am and 10pm on Sundays.

That has caused concern for one nearby cafe owner, Giovanna Georgiou, who objected to the plans.

Describing why she is against the plans, Giovanna said: "I don't think there is really any need for another food establishment in the area. There is plenty already for such a small high street.

"I'm worried this will attract a lot of alcohol-related incidents and make the High Street dangerous and not verv safe.

"It will also make the parking situation a lot harder than it already is."

The new bar and restaurant will not be allowed to serve takeaway hot food as part of its permission from the council, with delivery hours restricted so it does not impact on neighbours.

In response to any concerns about the new bar. Brentwood Council said: "The proposed opening hours are the same as the existing food and drinking establishments surrounding the site and environmental health do not raise concern regarding the noise generated from the proposed change of use subject to conditions.

"It is considered that the level of noise and activity that can reasonably be expected from a food and drinking establishment would not adversely affect the occupiers of any neighbouring property."

Buses to replace trains every weekend for two months

Train users in Shenfield face disruption every weekend in October and November, with bus replacement services in operation.

It means buses will replace trains between Shenfield and Southend every weekend until Saturday, November 30.

The disruption to services is so Network Rail can upgrade overhead lines.

There will be some disruption into 2020 as well, with the upgrade not due to be complete until March.

In total, 128km of overhead wires between Southend Victoria and Shenfield will be replaced with a new auto tension system that adapts to temperature changes.

This will improve the reliability of services for years to come for passengers on the Southend Victoria line. The winter weekends phase of works is due to complete by the end of March 2020, two months earlier than originally planned.

When complete, 320km of wires and 200 structures that support the wires at the correct height and tension will have been replaced on the entire route that runs between London Liverpool Street and Southend Victoria as part of the £46million project.

Mark Budden, Network Rail's route director for Anglia, said: "We're entering the final phases of this much-needed upgrade, which will bring greater reliability for passengers on this busy line.

"I know that there is a lot of weekend disruption for passengers, and I'm sorry their journeys will be more difficult during this time.

"It will lead to a much more reliable service for everyone using the Southend line, reducing delays."

Fake police letters bid to improve parking

Police have warned motorists to be aware after fake letters with their logo were placed onto parked cars in Shenfield.

Some motorists in Chelmsford Road found a letter placed on their windscreen with the letters claiming to be from Essex Police, Brentwood Borough Council and Safer Essex Roads Partnership.

Those letters have been confirmed by Essex Police as fakes and it is thought they were produced and slapped on cars after residents became disgruntled at the quality of some parking. An Essex Police spokesperson said: "It has been brought to our attention that letters have been left on vehicles in Chelmsford Road.

"These letters have been adapted and logos have been used unofficially.

"If you do find that a vehicle is causing an obstruction and is a danger to other road users and pedestrians, please report to Essex Police using our online reporting system."

Anyone with concerns can contact Essex Police on 101.

Train travels at 80mph with door open during rush hour

Passengers in Shenfield had a terrifying commute recently as the train travelled for 23 minutes at 80mph with a door open.

The Greater Anglia train was approaching Shenfield in late August when the door malfunctioned and remained open.

The faulty door was reported to the driver at Hockley station having already travelled around 16 miles.

Martin Moran, Greater Anglia commercial and customer service director, said: "Safety is our highest priority.

"We immediately took the train out of service when this happened and carried out our own investigation

ng into the incident.

"We have also carried out checks on every single door on that type of train that we have.

"No-one was injured in this incident and there have been no further incidents since."

The Rail Accident Investigation Branch has conducted an investigation and will release its findings in the coming months.

Derek Monnery, chairman of the Essex Rail Users Federation, said the incident does not happen often. He said: "It could be a dangerous situation if the train is crowded and a lot of people are standing there, which fortunately it doesn't sound like it was in this case."

Police and council forced to move travellers once again

The police and the council had to once again work together to move travellers from Shenfield Common.

Travellers descending on the common have been an issue several times this year.

However, now well versed in how to remove the travellers, Brentwood Borough Council (BBC), Essex County Council and Essex Police quickly moved them on.

They used a section 61 notice, which can be enforced to remove travellers if there are more than two of them and a police officer believes they intend to "reside" there.

Alternatively, it can be enforced if they have caused

damage, been abusing, already been asked to leave by the owner or have more than six vehicles between them.

Their arrival was slammed by one social media user, who wished not to have their name printed.

They said: "They often only stay a short time as they get moved on but the destruction they leave behind lasts longer.

"Fly-tipping, rubbish strewn everywhere and not to mention how rude some of the travellers can be. I'd rather they stayed away."

BBC and Essex Police have been asked for comment but have not responded at the time of going to print.

More and more of us are using online banking these days, and this has a knock-on effect on the services being offered by banks on the high street.

While some banks have chosen to close less used branches, Barclays bank has decided to run a pilot scheme to attract new customers in areas where it is now the last bank in town. Its Shenfield branch is one of those in the pilot project, with local residents and businesses being offered help to switch their banking to Barclays. In return, the bank is stepping up its visible presence on Shenfield on Hutton Road by getting involved in community activities and running banking and fraud awareness workshops in the library.

Sadly, fraud and financial scams are all too common. and it's often older people who get taken in. ore commonly known as the snowdrop, Galanthus is one of those flowers that can brighten up your garden (and spirit) after a long, cold winter by signalling that spring is well on its way. Materialising en masse, snowdrops can create a white blanket of beauty across any garden or woodland area.

How do I plant snowdrops?

Great for beginners and pros alike, the snowdrop is a hardy plant that is easy to grow and flowers quickly; plant in October for flowers in late winter/ early spring.

- Find a spot in your garden where the soil is well drained and there is moderate shade
- Plant your bulbs 3 inches apart, with their pointed tops 2-3 inches below the surface
- Water well directly after planting

What does the snowdrop symbolise?

The name Galanthus Nivalis actually means 'milk flower of the snow' but has gone under many other names over the years including 'February fairmaids' and 'Candlemas bells.' The flower is said to symbolise purity, optimism, virtue and sympathy, making it the perfect plant to kick start a new season.

Fancy yourself as a bit of a conservationist? Then a pond is a great way to help support your local habitat. The moisture that ponds provide can help surrounding soil stay moist which is beneficial to nearby plants.

CONS:

Ponds can be expensive

You need to dig your pond, invest in pond liner, a pond pump and a filter and choose plants, all of which adds up. And don't forget fish – more expense, especially if you have your heart set on some eye-catching Koi carp.

They require a strong commitment

A pond is very high maintenance. It requires constant cleaning to prevent the water from becoming contaminated by plant debris. The pond's filtration system will also need to be cleaned, inspected and repaired when necessary.

safety can be an issue

As with any open water, you need to be vigilant and take the necessary precautions when any small children are in the vicinity. If you are worried about your children or grandchildren around water, then perhaps a pond is not for you.

TIME on our side

The time-bearing standard that defines the world, and it's just an hour away.

Any of us go through the odd moment of wishing we could turn back the clock, but the power of time is something only very few have ever had in their command.

And yet, the meeting of 25 nations in Washington DC 135 years ago this month will always be marked as a monumental moment against which we've been setting our watches ever since. On October 22, to be exact, the great and the good at the International Meridian Conference decided that the Royal Observatory in Greenwich would become the site of the Universal Time meridian of longitude.

It's positioning of Greenwich Mean Time (GMT) as a standard bearer for the world is most probably a reference point that will never be changed. Subsequently, the delineation of world time zones has always been either plus or minus a specified quantity of hours – the furthest time zone being that of the Baker and Howland Islands in the Equatorial Pacific, which rank a full 12 hours behind us.

Of course, these time zones are subject to significant shift. When lines marking time boundaries are drawn on a map, a number of peculiarities can be found, often arched around small islands.

The most extreme example of time difference is at the Diomede Islands, which sees us return to the Pacific. Big Diomede dwarfs Little Diomede, which sits two-and-a-half miles away. With one being the

furthest east you can go and the other being the furthest west, and the international date line running down the middle, they are, in effect, one day apart (21 hours, to be exact). That means if you stand on one with a pair of binoculars and look at the other, you are viewing tomorrow... or is it yesterday?

More pertinently, given that one is owned by Russia and the other by America, the Diomede Islands appear a chink in time even GMT won't be able to resolve.

Blurred Vision?

WHAT IS AGE RELATED MACULAR DEGENERATION (AMD)?

AMD is the most common cause of visual impairment in the UK. It is more common as you age, with over 10% of those aged over 65 years affected in some form.

Dry AMD can lead to a slow deterioration and blurring of central vision. This usually occurs over many years. Wet AMD is a more rapidly progressing form of AMD which distorts the central vision; commonly making straight lines appear kinked or wobbly.

HOW CAN IT BE TREATED?

Presently Dry AMD cannot be treated directly. A healthy diet and protection from UV light can help keep the macula healthy.

Wet AMD is most commonly treated with injections of special medication into the eye. These injections need to be given repeatedly with regular review and is known to be very successful in improving and maintaining vision.

The effectiveness is individual to every patient. It is important for patients with Wet AMD to have individualised treatment for their condition and be under the care of an eye doctor with a special interest in macular degeneration.

With October being Breast Cancer Awareness Month, is it time to reassess our perceptions of this illness?

A s a nation, our understanding of cancer has never been better, our healthcare is in its best ever place, and rates for the successful banishing of this dreadful biological disease are the best recorded.

We have so much to celebrate where breast cancer is concerned, yet the reality is someone will still wake up tomorrow, and the next day, and the day after that, and have their life ruined by this terrible disease.

Breast Cancer Awareness Month is a global campaign running across October that aims to engage as many people as possible in raising both awareness and funds in the fight against the disease. You can take part in wear it pink on Friday, October 18, and find out more on how to get involved by visiting wearitpink.org

The aims coming from the scientific world are big, with the intention that, by 2050, everyone

who develops breast cancer will live. Research is focused into four areas – risk and prevention, early detection and diagnosis, treatment, and secondary breast cancer.

By focusing on these stages of the disease and monitoring progress and results, specialists can use the most advanced techniques to save lives. In 2018, that meant the five-year survival rate topped 95 per cent; up from 82 per cent three decades ago.

So to answer the question posed at the top of this piece – no, it's definitely not time to reassess our perceptions where breast cancer is concerned. It is an affliction that ends lives, as well as causing untold pain for those left behind. It is an enemy of women of almost any age, any background, any social status, and the only thing we need to recalibrate is how we can fight in ways harder, tougher and even more stubborn than before.



SKIN TAGS... Why they matter Skin tags are small growths that hang off your skin. They are common blood vessels surrounded by

that hang off your skin. They are common and essentially harmless, but can be removed if they bother you.

What skin tags look like

Skin tags are small, soft, skin-coloured growths on your skin. They can vary in colour and size – from a few millimetres up to 5cm (about 2 inches) wide.

They are usually found on the neck, armpits, around the groin, or under the breasts, but they can also grow on the eyelids or under the folds of the buttocks.

They can look like warts, but skin tags are usually smooth and soft (whereas warts tend to be rougher with an irregular surface).

Skin tags are knobbly and hang off the skin (whereas warts are usually slightly raised or flat)

Skin tags are not contagious (whereas warts spread very easily, so a sudden outbreak or cluster of growths is more likely to be warts)

NB: Skin tags do not usually cause any pain or discomfort.

Why skin tags occur

Skin tags are made of loose collagen fibres and

blood vessels surrounded by skin. Collagen is a type of protein found throughout the body.

Both men and women can develop skin tags. They tend to occur in older people and (significantly) people who are obese or have type 2 diabetes.

Why skin tags matter

If you have a diet high in carbs and sugars, your insulin will be high as a result. (Insulin controls blood sugar, so more sugar equals more insulin). But insulin has numerous actions on the body, one of which is cell-proliferation (important for example at puberty, when the body grows rapidly).

Uncontrolled cell-growth is a bad thing however, which is why people with type 2 diabetes are more prone to cancer. Skin tags are benign and harmless but they DO indicate that your insulin levels are probably too high. 





WHERE ARE THE BEST PLACES TO SEE THE AURORA BOREALIS?

he Northern Lights are one of Planet Earth's most amazing natural phenomena, having drawn in, enchanted and amazed generations of travellers to Scandinavia and North America for hundreds of years.

First witnessed by astronomers Gassendi and Galilei in 1621, the stunning, dancing sprays of neon light, almost extra-terrestrial in their appearance, form when charged particles are emitted from the sun at the time of a solar flare. These penetrate the earth's magnetic shield, then collide with atoms and molecules in the atmosphere.

The key areas for seeing these displays of nature's beauty can be found in a zone within northern Scandinavia, between is on 66°N and 69°N, otherwise known as the Aurora Zone. The band can become larger when there is high activity of geomagnetic action which is why the lights can, on occasions, even be visible from north-west Scotland.

Traditionally, it's been said the best places to

witness the Northern Lights were Sweden and Norway, but Finland, Iceland and Greenland can all lay claim to offering stunning tourist experiences. Much of this factors in the tranquil majesty of surroundings lakes, forests and fells which, while almost completely devoid of light pollution, also add to the mystical air of this remarkable sight.

In recent times, northern territories in Canada have also attempted to take advantage of what is now a global fascination for the Northern Lights. The Yukon provides wild animals, scattered towns and villages and delicate snowfall against a backdrop of shimmering lights.

And the display isn't just a visual treat to those in the Northern Hemisphere. The Southern Lights (Aurora Australis) are rarer in their visibility but can be spied from Australia, New Zealand and South Africa.

It's also known that similar displays can be seen above Jupiter and Saturn, although tourism numbers, thus far, have been disappointingly low.





VOLATILITY

FOUR: A592. Windermere to Penrith

Better known as the Kirkstone Pass, this incredible route reaches almost 1,500ft, with spectacular valley views, drystone walls and wonderful winding roads.

FIV: The Snake Pass

Edging through the Peak District towards Glossop, the Snake Pass is true to its name in offering a slithering track often seen on car adverts. The tranquillity of the spot is what draws drivers in, with elevation and adverse cambers testing driving skills to the max.

The recent death of young Renault driver Anthoine

Hubert brought home the startling reality that although

motor racing is as safe as it's ever been, the race track remains sport's most dangerous arena. August 31, will go down as a sad day for motor racing. Anthoine Hubert, just 22, lost his life following a horrific 170mph crash at Spa-Francorchamps circuit in Belgium. It was a reminder of the perils that these individuals face every time they step into a high-performance car, with the Frenchman becoming the 52nd driver to have been involved in a fatal car accident in high-performance competition since 1952.

UK test driver Cameron Earl was the first - the Yorkshireman was killed at the MIRA circuit in Nuneaton. A total of 14 drivers would lose their lives during the 1950s alone, with the

Indianapolis Motor Speedway responsible for more than a third. In 1982, Canadian Gilles Villeneuve also passed away following a crash in Belgium, but at the older Circuit Zolder. The most notable loss of life came in a horror weekend at the San Marino GP at Imola 12 years later, when three-time world F1 champion and legendary Brazilian driver Ayrton Senna died instantly when his steering column broke.

His death came just 24 hours after the Austrian Simtek driver Roland Raztenberger was also killed.

Hubert's death was, at least, the first since Jules Bianchi succumbed a full nine months after injuries he sustained in a collision with a track rescue crane at the Japanese Suzuka circuit, in 2014.

The truth is, manufacturers are being pushed to ensure their machines are as safe as they can possibly be, and while performance has been affected by the imposing of new controls, you can be sure no dying driver would ever want the sport to die with him.

DEAD AND BURY-D

he sad demise of a once proud football club and what it means for 91 other Football League members.

In September, and in a scenario football fans have seen played out countless times, most expected the white knight to ride in and save Bury Football Club's 125-year membership of the Football League.

The nearer the deadline became, perversely, the more belief grew that things would resolve themselves. And yet, there was no white knight, there were no further stays of execution, and having failed to prove funds were in place for them to survive the season whilst taking care of the Company Voluntary Arrangement agreed a few months previously with creditors, Bury Football Club were expelled from the world's richest football league.

On the face of it, to let a former FA Cup winner wilt for the equivalent of two weeks of Alexis Sanchez's wages is preposterous, but the Shakers' plight is a stark reminder that self-sufficiency is a requirement, not an option, and the Lancashire club's drive for higher division football - and the wages that accompany it - must be a salient warning to all clubs.

Emotionally, the situation was made worse for the Gigg Lane outfit by local rivals Bolton Wanderers' survival, though this isn't necessarily the end for Bury. They exist still as a business, with owner Steve Dale seemingly desperate to relinquish all ties as the club seek entry at a much lower level - probably the Northern Premier League - for the 2020/21 season.

What's left is very much the same as before. The pursuit of the riches at the top of the game is as fervent as ever in English football, and clubs will continue to gamble big time in pursuing that. What's changed is that chairman and owners know the trap door is no longer bolted shut.


