

E MAY HAVE NOT BEEN THE FAVOURED CHOICE, BUT RESERVE JUDGEMENT ON THIS OCCASION, AS NEW PRIME MINISTER BORIS JOHNSON MAY JUST BE THIS COUNTRY'S SAVING GRACE.

Given that our political system has always existed while stuffed clumsily in the pocket of the ultimate organisational irony – that we are governed by a set-up of MPs whose very being means acting in opposition to one another – it's a miracle we've made it this far.

Sure, over the centuries, the Houses of Parliament appear to have bumbled, burst and bludgeoned their way through a variety of issues, but there is a sense that never before have a collected band of representatives been so unapologetically unhelpful towards each other, whilst displaying such plain disregard for those who put them there in the first place – the electorate.

We've been left in a parlous state, where even some of the most ardent Leave or Remain campaigners have had the last bit of political puff forced out of them by a string of events that has dragged on longer than the annual trot around the Eurovision juries.

And yet, now, it may be that finally our very own 'Euro vision' is forming, and thank goodness we have someone like Boris Johnson to drag it up on stage, stand it in front of the microphone and cover its ears as the rest of the continent offers a resounding 'nul points' to its little ditty.

In reality, Boris is the best we have. Theresa May's position was a poisoned chalice from the start, Jeremy Hunt you feel would have simply toed the same drab, pointlessly formal line, and Jeremy Corbyn has taken three years to finally decide he's a Remainer. And for the

respect of what little democracy we have left, a second referendum, however it was being dressed up, was never an option.

We are at a stage now where we need to put political allegiances aside and just get on with leaving the EU on October 31 in the most clinical way possible, and as BoJo has proved several times already in his career, he is a leader, a motivator and a driving force for positive, unerring, often brazen action.

Whether Boris will make a good Prime Minister should, at this point, be seen as secondary to the real job in hand, although even on that front, his merciless, almost dramatic dressing down of Corbyn in his first House of Commons debate at least shows a glimpse of a political future where humour, drama and liberal dashes of sarcasm may replace an overstayed period of shouting, shuffling, sneering and downright childish gameplay from those who should know better.

As yes, 55-year-old Boris may well still represent a cumbersome orator from another era, but during his time as London Mayor – and all those Boris bikes – as columnist and magazine editor, and as Foreign Secretary, he made very real change happen. The man is no fool.

Ultimately, what you get with Boris Johnson is charisma, action, and perhaps a little entertainment thrown in for good measure. Sure, he will speak out of turn, he will wobble precariously on the line of acceptability, but he will also put both barrels behind the country he loves, even at risk of throwing himself under the bus... or is it a bike?

Sessilent of HERO

or 60 years Marcel Marceau's talent for pantomime entertained audiences around the world.

He was also the man whose act inspired Michael Jackson's famous moonwalk. But few of his adoring fans realised that behind the mask of his most famous character, chalk-faced Bip the clown, there was a true hero.

During the Second World War he saved hundreds of Jewish children from the Holocaust. Masquerading as a boy scout, Marcel evacuated a Jewish orphanage in eastern France. He told the children he was

taking them on a vacation in the Alps, and led them to safety in Switzerland. Marcel made the perilous journey three times, saving hundreds of Jewish orphans.

He was able to avoid detection by entertaining the children with silent pantomime.

Born to a Jewish family in Strasbourg, France in 1923, young Marcel Mangel discovered Charlie Chaplin at the age of five and became an avid fan.

When Marcel was 16, the Nazis marched into France, and the Jews of Strasbourg - near the German border - had to flee. Marcel changed his last name to Marceau to avoid being identified as Jewish, and joined the French Resistance movement.

Documentary filmmaker, Phillipe Mora, whose father fought alongside Marcel in the French Resistance, said: "Marceau started miming to keep children quiet as they were escaping. It had nothing to do with show business. He was miming for his life."

Marcel's kosher butcher father perished at Auschwitz.

Marcel later said: "My name is Mangel. I am Jewish. Perhaps that, unconsciously, contributed towards my choice of silence."

In his first major performance, Marcel entertained 3,000 US troops after the liberation of Paris in August 1944.

In 1947, Marcel created his beloved character Bip, a childlike everyman with a stovepipe hat and a red carnation.

In 2001, Marcel was awarded the Wallenberg Medal for his acts of courage during the Holocaust.

Until his death at age 84, Marcel performed 300 times a year and taught four hours a day at his pantomime school in Paris. He died on Yom Kippur, 2007.

/ fe've all seen news reports, undercover documentaries and social media posts detailing those who've put faith and finance into tradesmen not up to the task.

While there is no foolproof system for verifying contractors, utilising a few simple checks can protect against cowboys:

ONE - REPUTATION IS KEY

Be wary of online reviews as these can be filled out by anyone – a genuine customer or perhaps just a mate of the contractor. That said, a great site to check is trustmark.org.uk, which offers government-endorsed tradespeople across multiple sectors.

Beyond that, see if www.youre-hired.com will provide phone numbers of previous customers who have had similar work done. You may even be able to do this with suppliers too.

TWO - WRITE TO REPLY

Make sure you ask the builders to put everything down in writing as regards payment terms, project timeframe and how the job will draw to a conclusion, including, for instance, who will dispose of waste materials.

THREE - MONEY MAN

You should never pay upfront for a job. Any good contractor should want to get the job finished before receiving full payment.

THREE - IMMEDIATE START? BE STARTLED

While we'd all like hired help to get to work as soon as we call, it's not always a bad sign to find a builder cannot start as quickly as you would hope, with a well-stacked calendar servicing other customers.

FOUR - ENSURE OR SHOW THEM THE DOOR

Enquire as to the insurance they offer over work done – what are you covered for in the event of them needing to come back?

FIVE - QUALIFYING TIME

Probably the best check of all is to run your preferred contractor's name past a regulating body. There are a number for each specialism but you can search quickly online to check they are verified.



HOW TO BRING THE UNDERWATER WORLD INSIDE

nere is something tranquil, calming and reassuring about the sea, to the extent that a recent trend finds us recreating the gentle serenity of the coast within our own homes.

Where in the past an underwater theme would have been the domain of the kids' bedrooms, experimenting with maritime design even in our main living spaces – consider blues, turquoises and light greens – can add colour, complexion and an element of fun.

And you don't have to go all out on themed furniture. Sometimes just very subtle references to the sea can have the best effect, such as scallop-patterned chains or edging to drawers or units.

Wallpaper can add smart, subtle references to the coast, either in swathes of brilliant blue and subtle sandy brown, or as a detailed design that perhaps showcases boats, shells or beach huts. And while you're at it, rugs and carpets with irregular, fluffy edges can move and sway in much the same elegant, carefree way as a receding tide. Patterned cushions can add a very simple effect too – think traditional blue and white with perhaps a splash of yellow.

The subtle placement of objects and art can also really bring on that feeling of being in a sub-aqua wonderland inside of your home. Driftwood, for instance, is one of the most curious, curved, beautifully artistic things you can have, even as a stand-alone object or used as picture frames or stand-alone shelf decoration. And when adding watercolours, sculptures and other more covertly obvious nods to the beach, you can quickly build a mood that gives you everything the coast offers without the hassle of sand getting caught between your toes.

And with double-digit growth, the evidence is that demand for going for a dip is Brexit-proof... if not waterproof.



-Town racing driver scores best result yet

Λ teenager from Brentwood scored his best result Avet in the UK's most competitive junior motorsport championship recently.

Ethan Brooks went home with his two best results of the season following the Michelin Ginetta Junior Championship.

The Brentwood School pupil powered through to score two top 10 finishes out of a grid of 26 in the event held at Thruxton Motorsport Centre in Hampshire the UK's fastest motorsport circuit.

Ethan had a disappointing qualifying session because he was caught up in traffic. This resulted in him qualifying in 17th place.

Despite this, he worked his way through the pack and finished in a respectable eighth place - his best to date.

In race two, the 16-year-old started in 13th place, but made his way to fifth by the end of the first lap.

Due to a red flag and a full restart, he dropped back again in the standings but managed to finish in seventh place.

In the final race, Ethan made a promising start climbing to fifth by turn three. However, he later crashed with another car at 100mph causing him to spin off.

He managed to climb from last place to 13th, whilst matching the pace of the front runners.

Speaking following the championship, Ethan said: "This was our best weekend this season as we were able to fight at the front and gain our two best results.

"Of course, I'm disappointed about race three, but we showed that we had the pace to battle for the podium."

Ethan managed to secure his place on the Junior Championship grid after winning the Ginetta Junior Scholarship in October 2018.

He fought off 70 of Europe's best drivers to be crowned Scholarship winner and secure a place on the Ginetta Junior Grid for 2019.

The Ginetta Junior Championship resumes at Knockhill in Scotland on September 14 and 15.

Ethan is still seeking sponsorship in order to see out the remainder of the season.

The championship is broadcast live on ITV4 and supports the British Touring Car Championship

Dispute with golf club will not give plans the yips

Prentwood's council leader insists plans for a £7million revamp of leisure facilities will not be scuppered by a dispute with a golf club.

Councillor Chris Hossack, leader of Brentwood Borough Council (BBC), says the development to boost leisure facilities at the King George's Playing Fields in Warley will go ahead.

That's despite a dispute with Hartswood Golf Club who currently have exclusive use of a clubhouse set to be demolished as part of the plans.

They feel the proposed new clubhouse they would take over would not be up to the standards of the existing one. Currently they also have a lease with 13 years left to run which would have to be renegotiated.

Conversations are ongoing between the golf club and the council but it does add doubt as to the future

of the £7million leisure plans.

Once complete the new leisure facility will include a new pavilion building, splash pad and outdoor adventure play area.

Cllr Hossack said: "The deal won't be scuppered; it has the unanimous support of the whole council and the public consultation showed strong support for investment into King George's Playing Fields to improve facilities for all users."

A council spokesperson added: "The council is trying to build a facility that supports all the users of the park and the golf club is one of a number of considerations.

"The club has proposed a number of options/ suggestions to the council at each meeting and the council is currently evaluating all of these as part of any future lease agreement with the club."

Police appeal after man stabbed in high street

Aman is recovering after he was stabbed in the shoulder when a brawl broke out between a large group of people on Brentwood High Street last month.

Police were called at around 2am on August 4 after the disturbance turned violent and the man in his 20s was stabbed. His condition is not deemed to be lifethreatening.

Police want to hear from anyone with information.


A police spokesman said: "We are investigating following an incident where a man sustained a stab

He said: "Their success shines a spotlight on the strength of Brentwood School's swimming programme, the hard work put in by our head of swimming Nikki Watson and the sacrifices that swimmers have to make to be the best in their sport."

Man who robbed town shop jailed

Aman who robbed a shop in Brentwood armed with a machete has been jailed for four years.

A man dressed in a black balaclava, grey zip-up jacket, black combat trousers, black gloves and armed with a machete went into the McColls in Eagle Way, Warley shortly before 10pm on February 23.

He went up to the member of staff behind the till and demanded money before making off with a three-figure sum of cash.

Police were called at around 10.30pm and when two officers attended the scene, they began a search of the area where items of clothing were found.

All the items were identified as those used by the robber.

A full DNA profile was obtained from the inside of the balaclava and when it was sent off for testing it came back as that of 37-year-old Matthew Page.

Page was arrested at his home address in Brentwood on March 15 and later charged with robbery and possession of a knife in a public place.

He denied the charges but, following a trial at Basildon Crown Court, he was found quilty of both on August 1.

He was jailed for a total of four years.

Council called upon to solve litter problem

↑ woman in Brentwood says urgent action needs to be taken to deal with a Aproblem of overflowing rubbish in the town.

Carole Nash lives at Rollason Way near Brentwood Station where local residents have a communal bin area where they can put general waste as well as recycle.

But as this shocking picture shows, this area is regularly overflowing and, speaking to VISIONBrentwoodOngar. Carole explained what she thinks the problem is.

She said: "People living nearby have to go right into the basement to put their rubbish in the bins so it's easier to put it in ours. People don't like lifting the lids so they just chuck the rubbish on the floor. Brentwood Council won't touch the bins. Housing won't touch it so my sister had to ring Environmental Health."

Carole's sister lives with her elderly mother who has dementia next to the communal bin area and says the pair's quality of life has been directly affected by the issue.

Carole said: "She can't have the patio door open because of the smell outside and the possibility of rats. The binmen say they have seen rat droppings. This has been going on for a couple of years and people are just trying to pass the buck."

Brentwood Borough Council were unavailable to respond.

Tributes to founder of youth football team



ributes have been paid to a man from Brentwood. who set up a youth football club, after he died. Norman French set up the popular Byron Red Star FC in Romford and introduced thousands of people in some form or another to football.

The club website says Norman will be sadly missed by everyone who knew him and the wider youth football community.

The website reads: "Norman started as manager. treasurer, secretary and chairman but, as the club grew, he'd spend more time doing what he loved the most: training the youngest players as manager.

"Thousands of boys have played in Byron's teams and some appeared at professional level, including Clive Allen and Paul McKenzie. Byron Red Star were also once a feeder club for Bobby Robson at Ipswich Town."

In 2012, Norman was given the honour of carrying the Olympic Torch through Romford for his contribution to grassroots football.

He continued to be actively involved with the club until ill health forced him to step down.

Norman remained president until he died.

Uber won't be making significant changes

ber says it will not be withdrawing from Jor applying for an operator's licence with Brentwood Borough Council.

The declaration from the ride-hailing company comes after a meeting of Brentwood Borough Council's Planning and Licensing Committee in June at which members asked Uber to withdraw from the town or apply for an Operator's Licence with the borough council.

At the meeting, drivers from the Brentwood Borough Taxi Drivers Association said that Uber's presence in the town was causing "the erosion of localism and a local trade based upon drivers who live and work in the borough and develop strong and positive relationships with their customers."

But a letter from Uber to the council said no changes will be made in the near future.

The letter reads: "I am afraid that we are not going to be making any significant changes to our business, or applying for new licences, in the near future.

"As I expect you and your licensing committee are aware, the Government is currently considering reform of the national taxi and private hire regulatory framework.

"This means that we cannot justify making further changes to our systems until we have greater clarity of next steps in that regard.

"When we have an idea about the broader national picture. I would like to revisit the idea of applying for an operator's licence with Brentwood."

In this day and age, access to fast, reliable broadband is essential for most of us to benefit from online services, and for UK businesses to compete globally.

The Government's focus is now on those hardest to reach places in the UK that are not covered by existing plans.

Thousands of new workers will be needed and

Openreach has taken on 3000 new recruits this year within twelve regional training schools. It's currently the biggest provider of apprenticeships in the UK and the largest employer of ex-forces personnel. And, fortunately for the broadband users of Brentwood and Ongar, there were plenty of highly-trained staff on hand when I was offered the chance to splice some of the high-tech fibre technology into the system.

Openreach is keen to make sure all of us with access to superfast technology are aware it is available.

For those with very slow broadband, the Government has introduced the Better Broadband Scheme. Anyone, in any part of the UK, whose broadband is slower than 2Mbps, can apply to this scheme to get Government support for a faster connection to allow them to carry out the basic online tasks that are expected in a modern world such as emailing, or completing online forms. Owner wants to reopen bar following fatal attack



The owner of a bar in Brentwood which had its licence revoked after a fatal attack outside the premises has applied to the council for it to be reopened.

The Vine is at the centre of the murder inquiry of 25-year-old Paul Wallington who was assaulted on Christmas Eve last year.

Mr Wallington died as a result of a head injury five days after being assaulted.

The bar was forced to close following the incident and has since remained vacant and unused.

After an investigation, police "made representations that the management of The Vine had been inadequate, as evidenced by a number of failures to adhere to its licensing conditions" and revoked its licence after it was initially suspended.

Andreas Artemi, The Vine owner, applied to Brentwood Borough Council for a premises licence on August 19.

If accepted, the bar will have permission to re-open from 22:00 to 00:00 on Monday to Wednesday, 22:00 to 01:00 on Thursdays and Sundays and 22:00 to 02:00 on Fridays and Saturdays.

A consultation period on the application will be open until September 16.

Police break up town drug ring

N early 20 people in Brentwood were arrested during an operation to target those involved in the supply of cocaine, police have revealed.

The town raid is just one of 80 operations carried out by police over the last two months to tackle knife crime and serious violence in public places.

Police in the county were awarded £1.76million from the Home Office and used the funding to continue Operation Sceptre Essex, a targeted crackdown on knife crime.

Chief Superintendent Tracey Harman said: "Every day we have officers out across the county tackling violent crime and knife crime.

"This includes extra patrols, using stop and search powers, and gathering intelligence to help us target offenders.

"Information from the public is also really important in helping us identify offenders, as we can only tackle these issues as a community."



Why new *Dragons' Den* enterprise impresario Sara Davies is a calling card for all businesses hoping to grow out of nothing.

Anyone who has seen the new series of *Dragons' Den* will have clocked a new face on the panel of fire-breathing business behemoths.

Terrestrial television's most successful new business show resumed its 17th series at the start of August. And with Jenny Campbell having stepped back from investment duties at the end of the last run of programmes, the much-vaunted seat two – once occupied by James Caan, Richard Farleigh and Hilary Devey – was instead filled by a new backer; and someone able to empathise with all areas of the entrepreneurial spectrum.

To the untrained eye, County Durham-born Sara Davies MBE represents a friendly, warm, welcoming, empathetic member of Britain's most feared panel. And so she should – the 35-year-old was brought up in rather simple surroundings in the north-east, and launched her debut business, Crafter's Companion, from her university student accomodation.

Her idea was simple – she offered a tool that could create bespoke envelopes for handmade cards. It came at a time when craft had begun to boom in the UK, and such an obvious gap in the market was there to be exploited. Sure enough, by the time Davies graduated, the enterprise was turning over £500.000 a year.

These days, Crafter's Companion exports to over 40 countries, employs 190 people worldwide, and can boast an annual turnover of £25million – not bad for an idea not just written on the back of an envelope, but was the envelope itself.

It all adds up to someone perfectly in touch with the qualities required to take a ground level business and move it to the next level. In the opening episodes we see Sara's approach as firm but fair, sympathetic yet system-driven.

"I think my background isn't too dissimilar to that of the other Dragons," she says.

"It's not like we were born into huge amounts of wealth. For us it's just been a case of having a good idea, going with it, then using the profits from that to try other avenues.

"As I say to a lot of young companies, sometimes getting that first idea right makes it 10 times easier to fuel all those that follow. That's because you have a springboard, you have experience, and the chances are you have contacts, as your next move is most likely to be in a familiar area."

As the 18th business wizard to step into the show, Davies is the youngest, proving that the world of modern business, even at corporate level, isn't the domain of those who have spent decades climbing up through the system.

"While it takes time to understand the mechanics of enterprise, I believe the spark to make money and to make a difference is there from childhood. That's not something you can learn – you either have it or you don't," she says.

Davies is already making a difference in the den. While, straight away, she put her hand in her pocket to make real the dreams of the next generation of business whizz, she is at the same time inspiring a brand of Sunday night armchair money-makers as well – are you one of them?



Agroup of family and friends climbed the O2 to raise awareness of cystic fibrosis (CF) in memory of their cousin Katy Rose Short who died of the condition.

Katy was diagnosed with the life-limiting genetic condition from birth and sadly passed away at the age of 16. On the day of her 22nd birthday (August 20), Teran Hedges from Ongar, climbed the iconic O2 arena in her memory with family and friends.

Teran, whose 10-year-old daughter Keira is battling CF, was on the climb last month.

She said: "It was really good, there was a couple who were scared of heights, but everyone made it to the top. We ran the Great North Run last year and did this challenge this year to raise money for cystic fibrosis and we are planning to host another event early next year."

The group has so far raised over £600 of their £1.000 target.

CF is a life-limiting genetic condition affecting more than 10,000 people across the UK. It affects the lungs and digestive system and can cause chronic infections and reduced lung function. Currently, half of those with CF will not live past age 41.



Serving police officer sentenced for theft

Aserving police officer from Ongar has been sentenced for theft.

The disgraced officer had also been paying child support for his three children with his ex-wife and also financially supports another child he has fathered with his new partner.

Now that criminal proceedings have been completed, a misconduct process will commence.

The officer is currently suspended.

Ongar Town ready for new challenge


ollowing an impressive season where they were crowned champions, Ongar Jubilee has merged with Ongar Town in preparation for the start of the club's third season.

Next year's festival will also feature two themed areas; the vintage area and the modern area.



ntirrhinum is also known as dragon flowers on the leave \(\lambda \) or snapdragon due to the fact that its flowers resemble the jaws of a dragon that appears to be snapping when squeezed open and close. They are known for their vibrancy and are ideal for providing autumn and winter colour in your garden.

WHAT TYPE OF PLANT IS ANTIRRHINUM?

Antirrhinum is normally considered as a biennial and is available in dwarf, pyramid-shaped plants or tall towerlike ones. They have a light floral fragrance and come in many vivid colours including pink, crimson, yellow and white. They can grow up to three feet tall.

WHEN AND WHERE DO I PLANT ANTIRRHINUM?

This plant loves the sun and also needs rich, fertile soil with a medium amount of moisture to flourish. They enjoy the cooler autumn weather and can often survive a heavy frost so commence bedding in September for display in spring. Grow them in flower beds, planters or borders for best results.

HOW DO I PLANT ANTIRRHINUM?

Prepare the soil by mixing in manure or other organic matter. Each plug plant needs its own hole and must be deep enough to cover the roots but not the stem. Water regularly and feed weekly.

HOW DO I LOOK AFTER THIS PLANT AND HELP IT FLOURISH?

If looked after, each Antirrhinum plant can grow out up to eight flower spikes per season. In order to achieve this, make sure you pinch out the stem tips once the plants are established, cut the flowers to encourage new growth and keep on top of deadheading. Look out for 'rusting' - small brown spots on the leaves.

WHAT DOES THIS PLANT SYMBOLISE?

Snapdragon flowers are said to represent concealment and deception but on a more positive note, they also have connotations with graciousness.



As a nation we love canned tuna, but we are definitely missing a trick by not experimenting with the fresh variety which is irm in texture and mild to taste.

A good marinade is essential when preparing fresh tuna as not only will it help the fish taste delicious; it will also keep it moist during cooking.

We recommend grilling your tuna steak for a quick and tasty meal. For a half-inch thick steak, grill for four to six minutes. The fish should flake when tested and still be pink in the middle.

Who doesn't love a piece of battered cod and chips on a Friday night? But that doesn't have to be the only time you enjoy this flavoursome fish.

For best results, we recommend baking your cod in foil with lemon and garlic. Simply preheat your oven to 180C and bake for 15 minutes for six to eight ounce fillets or 20 minutes for a whole fillet.

You will know your cod is cooked when it appears opaque

A truly luxurious fish, salmon is also extremely versatile. It can be pan-seared, grilled, roasted, poached.

Most salmon are sold with the bones removed but it is worth checking for any stragglers by rubbing your finger gently along the fillet.

If you are planning to pan-sear or roast the salmon, we advise keeping the skin on. Based on a half-inch thick piece, you should roast for six minutes or four if you prefer your salmon a touch rare.





HOW ROBOTIC PETS ARE BRINGING JOY TO DEMENTIA SUFFERERS

t's a disease more terrifying, debilitating and demeaning as any other; one that rips apart families and leaves victims often in a spiral of panic and fear, and yet we still seem to know desperately little about dementia, and within that Alzheimer's.

While progress in the research labs over the past decade has been impressive, not even the very best scientists could have predicted the dramatic impact robotic pets appear to be having when it comes to soothing the anxiety and loneliness of sufferers.

"A stuffed, robotic dog or cat can be a companion throughout the day for an elderly individual with Alzheimer's disease or dementia. Social isolation is a very common problem among older adults, and having a pet is a really wonderful way to combat that," notes Dr. Mattan Schuchman, a leading authority on this new idea.

The robotic pet eliminates the need to care for a real pet, which is virtually impossible for those suffering with the disease, yet puts a position of responsibility back on the patient and reaffirms their ability to tend to and care for something, having often had that feeling of being relied upon taken away from them.

Recent studies discovered patients' sense of joy and well-being when looking after a robotic pet builds confidence into other areas, reaffirms love and affection, and slows what can sometimes be a rapid acceleration of the debilitating side effects of dementia.

While we still have a long way to go, the use of such a simple toy, which is cost-effective, long-lasting, companion-driven and precludes the unnecessary use of drugs, seems a very clever solution to a very profound problem.


