If you thought it was just modern-day society that's taken in by the strength of marketing, think again. Here's the story of how Christmas was stolen not by the Grinch, but by the soft drinks brand.

He's arguably the most iconic and most easily recognised person on the planet, but even Santa is a Coca-Cola marketing team's plaything, and the evidence is staring us right in the face. That's right - that trademark red-and-white suit that we have come to know, love and welcome into our homes on Christmas Eve is a brand team's creation that's straight out of the marketing textbook.

Before Coca-Cola sidled up to the most travelled man on the planet, Saint Nicholas could be seen in all manner of colours, clothes and designs. Pictures exist of him dressed in a tan-coloured suit: others show him wearing shades of light and dark blue; while in some pictures he comes across as a somewhat sinister elf-like character dressed in green as he dots from house to house.

It was only natural then that, as the power of the media grew in the lead-up to World War II, so too should a universal image of the great man emerge. And siding with the world's biggestselling soda – and its red-and-white livery – well, it was a match made in heaven... or, at least, Lapland.

And that, boys and girls, is the story of how Santa's red-andwhite suit was created by the guys at Coca-Cola.

While the tale of Santa taking on the colours of the world's leading drinks brand is a water-cooler classic that has done the rounds for years, it is only actually half-true.

That famous fluffy livery was actually to be found on pictures of the great man going back into the nineteenth century. It was cartoonist Thomas Nast who truly popularised the use of red and white with his hugely successful sketch series in the 1870s. And some believe Coca-Cola wasn't even the first drinks brand to popularise the figure, with carbonated water producers White Rock using him in adverts from the early 1920s.

However, where Coca-Cola can take credit is in capitalising on the big guy's popularity. Consider White Rock had 90 per cent of the fizzy water market back in 1920s America, and with imitation being the greatest form of flattery and all that, logic follows that the brand Coca-Cola adopted its own version of Santa (holding

With the help of illustrator Haddon Sundblom, it evolved the big man into an even stronger caricature of himself. This served to vanguish the various other images of Father Christmas who back then could still be found dressed in such variant colours, all the while subconsciously linking the drink to a figure representing kindness, generosity and happiness in the minds of youngsters (and a few adults).

Put it this way: try finding a festive Coca-Cola image that doesn't feature its brand ambassador, and vou'll appreciate that while the American drinks giant may not have chosen the colours for Santa, it has certainly ensured he's staying dressed in his perfect red-and-white suit, and we'll all drink to that.

NEW SERIES, NEW DECADE, NEW CAST - THE RETURN OF THE CROWN

s new series of prime-time drama go, *The Crown* has been a long time in coming. stage with the likes of David Mitchell, Richard Ayoade and Peter Serafinowicz, before excelling in Rev, Broadchurch, The Night Manager and The Favourite.

Her landing in such a major Netflix product feels perfectly timed, having just been awarded a CBE in the Queen's Birthday Honours for her services to drama.

The good news for fans of *The Crown* is that given the series are shot back to back, season four will be along very shortly. Set in

the 1980s, it will deliver Margaret Thatcher (Gillian Anderson) and Emma Corrin (Princess Diana)... and no doubt a yuppie or two.

DESIGN FOR LIFE

DAVID LINLEY AND INTERIOR DESIGN'S MISSING LINK

alk about interior design, architecture, design and craftsmanship, and so much of what you hear revolves around the intentions, desires and whims of the designers themselves. It's almost as if they are going to be the ones living in the spaces they curate.

Clearly, in most cases they're not, and that's where the Linley stable of designers and architects takes a different approach towards creating artistic excellence.

At the heart of Linley is the intention to style a client's own vision before anything else. Sure, the Belgravia-based experts, who have been a major player in working with upmarket clients for more than 30 years, can extol the virtues of custom-made and tailored cabinets. furniture and kitchen spaces, but unless it has client direction, a project won't begin.

When bespoke designs are brought forward, Linley

designs favour a few simple rules: items are sleek and sharp, utilising









whites, greys, blacks and browns, with references to art deco, 1970s elegance with polished tones. They are happy to juxtapose styles and periods to create rooms with distinction and flair, but the celebration of eras is without brazen, shouty, disturbing colours. In short, subtletv is kev.

Small item collections are often in glassware or polished wood (such as boxes, desk items and picture frames), with a fascination for intensity, detail and

alk of urban minimalist design brings about notions of wealthy Docklands apartments littered with little more than a table candle, a coffee cup and a laptop.

And yet the achieving of a clean, clear, spacedriven home isn't out of reach, yuppie living or not. Ultimately, where urban minimalist design succeeds, it's in the understanding that you are defined not by your possessions, by your furniture.

Wind back a decade or so and minimalism would have sat much more on the side of brutalism, with polished concrete floors, conflicting wood and terracotta, and sleeping arrangements that appeared more akin to a night in the cells.

These days the rules are relaxed, and urban minimalism dives further into the human need for comfort, warmth, colour and texture, without the clutter, chaos and disharmony of possessions

ruining streamlined furniture, geometric design and perfectly judged angles.

In terms of colours, the warmth of wood is a key asset. Patterned against white walls, urban minimalism allows a return to the perfect white offset, while hard floors, matched rugs and boxed rooms allow styles to merge without them spilling out into corridors or hallways.

The secret to the look is to be regimented in your approach to everyday clutter. Storage space is not a secret or an embarrassment to those wanting to pull off this look, but clearly, practical solutions need to be sought in order to maintain what is a devoted approach towards cleanliness.

Nail the ability to hide away the knick-knacks of life, and urban minimalism enables homemakers to celebrate the ultimate pleasure derived from space and shape.

- Give your bath a new lick of paint for an acrylic or porcelain tub, select an EP-acrylic paint with a glossy finish; for iron bath tubs, use a latex primer then at least two coats of latex paint.
- Use a paint sprayer on the bath itself to achieve a smooth, streak-free finish inside and out.
- Apply a new coat of porcelain using a professional tradesman.
- Opt for new colours your bath doesn't have to be white (nor that horrible lime green), so be ambitious, outlandish and brave in your new creation.
- Replace taps... a new, elegant set of taps on a bath – much like replacing kitchen unit handles – can create instant uplift.
- And finally, don't stop at the bath... because if the tiling around your tub looks like something out of a horror movie, you still won't want to take a dip. So clean, scrub, regrout and caulk your tiles to offer the cleanest finish possible.

- Cut each card into a 4x4 square.
- Spread Mod Podge onto each tile and apply a card to each one.
- Use a credit card to smooth out the card, then leave to dry for 2-4 hours.
- Coat each coaster with Minwax Polycrylic, then leave to dry.
- Stick a 4x4 square of felt to the bottom of each tile to protect surfaces.

Pensioner thanks heroic ambulance staff for saving his life

Aman from Brentwood has met the ambulance crew who helped save his life after he survived his third cardiac arrest.

Keith Copsey, 70, began to suffer with worsening chest pains and recognised the sensation from a previous cardiac arrest in 2007.

His wife Jen immediately phoned 999 and a team of three arrived in an ambulance soon after.

By 1.30am, three hours and 20 minutes after he first arrested outside his house. Keith was in the intensive care unit having had two stents fitted.

Once Keith recovered, he and his wife met with paramedic Sandra Lodge, associate ambulance practitioner Joseph Bisquera and student paramedic Dave Smith at Basildon Ambulance Station on October 29.

Keith, who is from Pilgrims Hatch, said: "That team of three people undoubtedly saved my life.

"I cannot think of enough superlatives to describe how grateful my wife and I are for their actions on that night. If I hadn't already been an ambulance service fan. I surely would be now.

"Our meeting was to say the least, emotional.

"How do you say thank you to somebody who has not only saved your life but has brought you back to life three times?

"They were the epitome of what the ambulance service stands for. They filled in the missing parts for me and were also genuinely pleased to see us again in happier circumstances.

"It was a meeting that I never thought was possible. but I am so grateful it took place."

Mark Whiddon, leading operations manager, said: "It was incredibly emotional for everyone seeing Keith again after all he's been through.

"The crew wanted to see how he was doing after the event: however, this is not normally possible.

"The team went above and beyond when Keith needed to be transferred out of our area and we are so delighted that he is recovering well."



Town listed as one of the healthiest in the UK

Prentwood has been named as the healthiest town in Essex and the third best in the UK.

A study by Babylon Health, of more than 30,000 of its users, found that Brentwood made the top three.

The data was collected via their health check app and depending on the user's location, it helped gauge how healthy towns and cities across the UK are.

Scoring was based on nine indicators of a healthy lifestyle including how often people drink alcohol, smoke and exercise.

Brentwood scored 71.8 out of a maximum score of 100, placing it as the healthiest town in Essex and third in the UK.

The Forest of Dean was the UK's overall healthiest place with a score of 74.5.

The data found the amount of alcohol units consumed on average in Brentwood is 6.2.

Brentwood also has the third lowest proportion of smokers in the UK, with only 11.3 per cent of the population smoking. Those smokers also smoke on average five cigarettes a day which is below the average amount.

Another revealing statistic shows that 73.1 per cent of smokers in Brentwood want to quit and people are more likely to exercise more often.

Brentwood resident, Leanne Ward, said: "It's not surprising to hear how healthy Brentwood is compared to other places.

"There are a huge amount of options when it comes to exercise classes, sports clubs and there is definitely an active running scene in the town.

"Let's hope next year we can do even better and be the best in the UK."

Grace verdict welcomed by family

The parents of murdered Brentwood schoolgirl broke down in court after the man accused of her killing was found guilty of murder.

David Millane and his wife Gillian wept as the guilty verdict was read out.

Grace was strangled by a man she met on Tinder and her body was found buried in a suitcase in New Zealand. Before her death, she spent several hours drinking with him in Auckland on December 1 last year and then went back to his flat. She was killed either that night or early the next morning – the date of her 22nd birthday.

Outside the court, Mr Millane said the verdict will be welcomed by every member of the Millane family and friends of Grace.

He commented: "It will not reduce the pain and suffering we have had to endure over the past year. Grace was taken in the most brutal fashion a year ago and our lives have been ripped apart. Grace was our sunshine and she will be missed forever. She did not deserve to be murdered in such a barbaric way during her gap year."

Man charged following snate of burglaries

Schoolbov shows his football talent

ABrentwood schoolboy was back in international football action after he played for England under 16s

Jacob Knightsbridge, who attends Brentwood School, represented England in their U16 fixture against Norway at St George's Park, the English Football Association's national centre at Burton upon Trent.

The 15-year-old goalkeeper put in a matchwinning performance with England winning the encounter 2-1.

It was Jacob's first appearance for the U16 side - he was first selected to play for England back in February in an U15 fixture against Belgium.

Jacob was on the pitch for 45 minutes of the encounter but his international experience did not end there.

Following the full-time whistle, both teams seized the opportunity to get in some serious practice with a penalty shootout, which England also won with Jacob saving a penalty.

Jacob, who started plaving competitive football when he was five years old, is also part of the West Ham Academy where he has been since the age of seven.

As well as training with the Academy, he also plays for the school U16 team.

Jacob said: "There was a penalty shootout because we need practice for penalties in future football tournaments.

"We have a duty to rescue all road users in Essex and it only seemed right that we continued the long journey up north. I thank the officers for their quick-thinking and kind actions."

Train services affected for Christmas upgrades

massengers in Brentwood are being advised to check before they travel this Christmas as the railway is set to get upgraded.

The work, which includes upgrading the overhead wires between Shenfield and South Victoria, means buses will replace some services.

It follows a period of disruption already for passengers with work also taking place throughout December.

On Sunday mornings from 2.15am to 9am, some services will be affected. This will take place on December 1, 8, 15 and 22.

There are no services on Christmas Day and Boxing Day, and a rail replacement service will operate between December 27 and January 1 with work

planned to focus on the complex junction at Wickford. In total, Network Rail is replacing 128km of overhead wires with a new auto tension system that adapts to temperature changes.

This will improve the reliability of services for years to come for passengers on the Southend Victoria line.

Mark Budden, Network Rail's route director for Anglia, said: "Most of the railway network is open over Christmas, but some routes will be closed for engineering works so we can provide a safe and reliable railway for passengers.

"For those wishing to travel over the festive period. my advice is to plan ahead and check with their train operator or National Rail Enquiries."

Girl praised for lifesaving actions

Abrave girl who helped to save her grandfather's life in Brentwood by keeping calm and calling for help when he collapsed after suffering stroke symptoms has been praised for her courage.

Quick-thinking Grace Bruce, 12, raised the alarm and followed the call handler's instructions until crews could arrive when her grandad David became seriously unwell at his home in Brentwood.

Her actions have been praised by the East of England Ambulance Service NHS Trust (EEAST) and led to her being awarded a bravery certificate at the start of November.

After she spoke to the call handler, she then went onto clear space for ambulance crews to work before helping collect medication, as well as calling her mum to tell her what had happened.

Although David suffered a fit and went into cardiac and respiratory arrest. Grace staved calm and collected throughout the traumatic ordeal.

David was quickly transferred to Queen's Hospital in Romford and has since made a full recovery.

Michael Whitcombe, student paramedic and EMT and Shane Farnham, EMT, were the first crew on scene.

Michael said: "David recalls his granddaughter



calling for help, putting the phone on loudspeaker and following the instructions and answering the call handler's questions.

"She assisted us on scene with clearing space, getting medication and getting in touch with her mum. It is clear that had Grace not called for help, then her granddad wouldn't be here today."

Michael and his colleagues were able to thank Grace in person when she visited Basildon Ambulance Station with her mum Mandy and grandad David to collect a bravery certificate and letter of thanks from EEAST chief executive, Dorothy Hosein.

Calls for fire station to return full-time after house blaze

ssex's fire chief has said they are doing all they can to recruit enough on-call firefighters so Ongar has cover every day of the week.

Criticism was aimed at Essex Fire and Rescue after a fierce fire in Ongar left a family home in ruins. The blaze happened vards away from Ongar Fire station where nobody was available to respond.

That incident led to residents turning up en masse to a town council meeting to ask about what could be done to improve fire service cover in the town.

The council duly contacted the Police Fire and Crime Commissioner (PFCC), Roger Hirst, to ask about what could be done in Ongar.

In that request, the town council expressed the concerns of the residents and asked about making Ongar Fire Station a seven-day-a-week operation once again.

In response the fire service outlined what is being done to improve immediate cover at the station and what recruitment will take place.

The response from PFCC said: "Ongar Fire Station was off the run at the time of the fire due to a shortage of an officer which meant the station was not available to respond to this incident.

"Having an appropriately trained officer in command is essential to ensure a safe working environment for the firefighters. Ongar Fire Station recently lost two officers which has adversely affected availability.

"The service has moved a dedicated officer into Ongar Fire Station on a temporary basis to increase availability until it is able to promote suitably qualified officers from within the station establishment.

"There is an ongoing service wide recruitment programme to increase on-call firefighters and Ongar Fire Station currently has a further six potential firefighters who are at various stages of their application, with two of them potentially being available for fire cover very soon.

"The recruitment target is to reach a minimum of 13 firefighters for the station which will also improve the availability and resilience of the station.

"The key to maintaining Ongar on the run is ensuring that there are enough on-call firefighters suitably trained and readily available to attend calls."

LIFE AND TIMES OF

hrough one of the marvels of modern science, I am enabled, this Christmas Day, to speak to all my peoples throughout the Empire.

"I take it as a good omen that wireless should have reached its present perfection at a time when the Empire has been linked in closer union. For it offers us immense possibilities to make that union closer still."

These 62 words were spoken by King George V in 1932 in the first ever Christmas broadcast to the nation on the radio.

Historians see it as one of the great speeches

of the twentieth century and it is catalogued in the British Library. The majestic words, which were widely acclaimed, were written by one of the greatest British authors, Rudyard Kipling.

He was born in Bombay, India, on December 30, 1865. In 1870, Kipling was sent to England to stay with a foster family in Southsea and then went to boarding school in Devon.

In 1882, he returned to India and worked as a journalist, writing poetry and fiction in his spare time. Books such as *Plain Tales from the Hills* (1888) gained success in England, and in 1889 Kipling went to live in London.

In 1892, Kipling married Caroline Balestier, and the couple moved to Vermont, USA, where they had their two daughters. In 1894 Kipling wrote his most famous book, *The Jungle Book*. In 1896, a quarrel with his wife's family prompted Kipling to move back to England and he settled with his own family in Sussex. His son John was born in 1897.

Other books followed, including *Kim* (1901) and *Puck of Pook's Hill* (1906). *The Just So Stories* (1902) were originally written for his daughter Josephine, who died of pneumonia aged six.

In 1902, Kipling bought a seventeenthcentury house called Bateman's in East Sussex where he lived for the rest of his life. He travelled a lot, including repeated trips to South

Africa in winter.

In 1915, his son, John, went missing in action while serving with the Irish Guards in the Battle of Loos during First World War. Kipling had difficulty accepting his son's death – having played a major role in getting the chronically short-sighted John accepted for military service – and subsequently

wrote an account of his regiment, *The Irish Guards in the Great War*. He also joined the Imperial War Graves Commission and selected the biblical phrase inscribed on many British war memorials: *Their Name Liveth For Evermore*.

Despite his personal friendship with King George, Kipling declined most of the many honours that were offered to him, including a knighthood, the Poet Laureateship and the Order of Merit, but in 1907 he accepted the Nobel Prize for Literature.

Kipling died on 18 January 1936 and is buried at Westminster Abbey.

Warming those winter garden vistas with some bursts of festive colour

And yet, winter can be about much more than greens, browns and greys where gardens are concerned. Certainly in the use of berries, your outside space can quickly adopt all the sprigs and spray of summer. With that in mind, then, here are some plants that will help keep things colourful:

In white, pink, yellow, red, blue and quite the most stunning copper tones, the berries from this deciduous tree will bring breathless colour to even the darkest corner.

HOLLY

A festive favourite, holly combines a burning red berry with that intensely detailed, beautifully curated leaf, with a combination of greens that offsets its radiant bedfellow with a flourish of frosty finesse.

VIBURNUM TINUS

In its prime between the months of December and April, just when you think the golden pink buds of this characterful plant can't offer anything more, the ends burst open, offering a spray of white flowers. One of the first risers for spring's sumptuous season of colour, the Viburnum Tinus will soar in prominence just as the temperatures begin to do

CALLICARPA

This shrub has purple, jewel-like berries that look as if they've come straight from a safe deposit box in Hatton Garden. An intensely rich shade, the plant goes into overdrive in autumn and winter, offering colour to even the gloomiest garden.

And if the beauty of the winter rebels isn't a pleasure enough to see, the range of birds they will attract to your garden will only serve to delight you further.

PLANT OF THE MONTH:

Sarcococca

arcococca confusa, also known as Christmas box, is an evergreen shrub that bears small white flowers. Somewhat surprisingly, given its heavenly honey-scented blooms, it is one of the least popular evergreens available, but don't let that stop you from choosing this obliging plant for your garden.

Where to grow Sarcococca confusa

Sarcococca confusa is a hardy plant that is very easy to grow. It prefers a relatively shady spot but can still thrive in full sun as long as the soil is kept

Due to its sweet fragrance, it is advised to grow this plant close to your house where you can enjoy the full force of its aroma in flower borders, flower beds or containers.

How to plant Sarcococca confusa

You can plant this tough shrub at most times of the year, except when the ground is frozen solid, waterlogged or extremely dry, but if you want to perk up your garden this winter, then this is the plant for vou.

Simply plant the shrub in moist, well-drained soil, water well and apply a granular general feed around the plant. It will also benefit from a layer of garden compost or bark chippings around the roots.

How to care for Sarcococca confusa

In early spring, lightly trim or prune back the shoots of your shrub and then apply another layer of compost around the base of the plant. In its first year, water regularly.

What other plants complement Sarcococca

As this shrub is lush and green all year round, with flowers between December and March, it is suited to plants that only peak at certain times of the year such as deciduous plants. It also complements taller shrubs such as hydrangeas.

THE VEGETABLES YOU SHOULD LOOK TO GROW OVER THE WINTER SEASON.

The notion of the winter vegetable is one we all stand by. Rough, rustic, wholesome and happy, they are the meal mainstays of a season in which we want to be inside, wrapped up warm, with the products of our labour in front of us.

But what about the vegetables you want to plant now for picking at the start of next year and when spring rolls around? Here is a selection that will last through those cold winter months:

SPINACH

Typically planted at the start of autumn, the time is almost done for spinach going into the ground, but any late additions will see a solid reward of leaves throughout the cold months and right the way through to next summer.

CARROTS

We associate carrots with sugary, summer flavours, but planted in November and with a bit of protection, the Adelaide carrot flourishes across the colder months for an early-spring treat.

The simple leek is a must on a winter

plot, offering volume, flavour and spiciness right up until the soil freezes solid.

CHARD

Although some of these leaved plants can wilt in the harsh conditions, others will stand the test of winter while providing a December harvest to boot, offering your kitchen great flavour and vour garden intense colour.

WINTER SALADS

Rows of lambs lettuce, land cress and mustard will need some protection from the elements, but once in the ground are resilient and happy to be picked across the colder months, where they'll regrow and keep the supply to your lunch table constant.

ONIONS

Hardy, tough and tasty, onions (and shallots) are easy to plant, brilliantly versatile and incredibly resourceful in the soil. Onions have a very long growing season and require slightly longer in the ground, so planting now will mean they won't be ready until next summer.



WHAT IS HIIT PILATES?



- 2. Plank Jacks: Start in the plank position, holding your abs tight. Jump your feet outwards into a 'V' position and immediately back to your starting position.
- 3. Triple Crunchers: Lie down with your feet flat and your knees bent. Support your head with your hands, elbows out wide, and then lift your shoulders off the floor in three gradual movements until you are sitting upright. Keep your abs tight.

Carry out all of the above for one minute, rest for one minute and repeat twice more.

tting adequate shut-eye is more important than any vitamin, mineral, food or workout, so why are we so blasé about sleep?

Perfect Turkey

ne turkey is the centrepiece of most traditional family Christmas dinners. Ensuring that it is cooked to perfection is one of the most important, not to mention stressful, tasks that you can undertake this holiday season.

Should you soak it overnight? Should you baste it? To wrap or not to wrap? These truly are the questions.

Soaking your turkey overnight

There is no set-in-stone way to prepare your turkey, but some swear by brining your bird overnight. This involves soaking your turkey in a salt-and-water solution to keep it moist. You can also add herbs and spices such as peppercorns, juniper berries and bay leaves.

Get your timings right

You need to weigh your bird so that you can ensure that you roast it for the correct length of time. Once you know how much your turkey weighs, follow these below cooking times to ensure cooked yet moist meat.

Heat your oven to 180 degrees Celsius or 350 degrees Fahrenheit.

- >4-5kg cook for 2 ½ hours
- 5-6kg cook for 2 ½ to 3 hours
- >6-7kg cook for 3 to 3 ½ hours
- Then add half an hour for each additional kg.

Rest your turkey

You should rest your turkey for between 1 ½ and 2 hours. It is also advisable to take your turkey out of the fridge before roasting for a minimum of half an hour to prevent shrinkage.

Basting and covering

If you place your turkey on a bed of vegetables, then there is no need to baste it; plus, you will have the added benefit of a delicious gravy. To ensure a crisp skin but to not dry out the meat, it is advised to cover your turkey loosely with foil for the first

ow did we ever exist without the humble tumble dryer? It's quick, efficient and, most importantly, not dependent on the unpredictable British weather. But it can cause chaos to your clothes if not used correctly.

1. Bras

The main job of a bra is to provide support, but by tumble drying this item you risk the elastic becoming stretched and out of shape.

2. Leather items

Leather, suede and faux leather should always be air-dried as heat can cause these materials to crack or become distorted.

3. Delicate fabrics

Silk, lace and sheer net items should never be tumble dried as the high temperature will set in wrinkles.

4. Gym wear

Activewear is made from man-made fibres which are designed to keep you cool and supported, but they will not keep their shape in the dryer.

5. Athletic shoes

Shoes that are made from leather, canvas or the latest high-tech performance

cause the soles to fall off.

6. Knitted jumpers/cardigans

Tumble drying knitwear can cause the items to lose their shape by causing the fabric to shrink or stretch.

7. Fur items

Real fur can crack in the dryer, whereas faux fur can melt or become tangled.

8. Swimwear

Costumes, bikinis and swim shorts should be washed or rinsed after each use, but avoid tumble drying as this can ruin the fabric.


9. Ugg boots

Although super cosy, Ugg boots are not the best footwear to get caught in the rain in, and when they do get wet it can be tempting to throw them in the dryer. Don't. Sheepskin will shrink in the heat.

10. Tights/stockings

Even a few minutes in the tumble dryer can cause irreversible damage to hosiery: think tangles, knots and even runs.

IS PREMIUM FUEL REALLY WORTH THE EXTRA INVESTMENT?

e've all seen those suffixes at the petrol station - "Super", "V-Power", "Premium", "Nitro+", or "Ultimate" - luring you to the more expensive pump as you prepare to dole out anything up to £100 to fill up your tank.

For some of us, whether it's petrol or diesel, simply filling up is enough of a financial chore, without wanting to contemplate voluntarily spending more on jazzed-up fuel. For others, premium denotes performance and longevity, but does the added investment pay back? In the long term, the answer is, surprisingly... yes; but don't bother if you're driving a Nissan Micra.

In short, if you own a high-spec vehicle, then filling up from the premium pump could be a sound move. The fuel's higher-octane rating means it works better with engines of a higher compression, so that leads to increased performance and moreefficient maintenance of your system.

The downside is cost – on average, performance fuel will cost you around 10p per litre more. Spin that out over the course of a year's motoring and you've added on a fair whack to your road bills, but on the plus side your car will be running more efficiently, and for longer. There's also the prevention of "engine knock" to consider - that's where unburned fuel pre-ignites in a vehicle's engine, damaging interior components.

But all this largely only applies to premium vehicles, where higher-octane motors mean higher-octane fuel. For what you might describe as "everyday cars", go for the cheaper option. Your little run-around will have a standard octane rating of 95, meaning that the electronics are configured so that the vehicle will run in a satisfactory way on the regular fuel.

Put another way, there's a good chance upgrading vour fuel will make little noticeable difference... except to your wallet.

FINAL HURDLE

Ingland's 2019 World Cup might have ended with defeat to a familiar foe, but in the land of the setting sun there was at least a sporting silver lining on show.

You would suppose that any team capable of beating the Wallabies and the All Blacks in a Rugby World Cup should go on to clinch the Webb Ellis Cup with something to spare, but England's failure to drag themselves over the final hurdle in Yokohama was as much down to South Africa's dogged spirit as it was the Red Rose running out of steam.

Some 16 years on from England's only World Cup win, Eddie Jones's side looked set to exorcise demons of pitifully poor recent tournaments, especially after scoring in excess of 35 points in each of their pool matches.

However, England's final was over almost as soon as it began, with prop and vital scrum component Kyle Sinckler accidentally caught by the elbow of his own team-mate Maro Itoje after just two minutes.

It left them susceptible in the scrum, and South Africa won five penalties on their way to a 32-12 victory, with a somewhat deceptively large margin of victory opening up in the closing stages as England went for broke. Their opponents were as decisive as England were wasteful, and the experience will go down as a case of what might have been.

And yet, what we should gain from this is the confidence to compete with the very best. The Six Nations begins in less than three months' time and, with Wales, Ireland and France all in periods of transition, it would be a brave person to bet against the World Cup experience making England even more likely to land silverware in the spring.
