THE WORLD AROUND US Part 4 THE

In the last part of our environmental series, we look at the final key driver in the health and well-being of the planet: global warming.

he phrase 'climate change denier' has become commonplace in conversations about the gradual warming of the planet and the causes of this. Scientific opinion points to humans and our explosion of population, industry and consumption as the real effects of the Earth increasing in temperature by 1° Celsius since 1880.

It doesn't sound a lot, does it? And yet, a one-to two-degree drop was all it took to plunge the Earth into the Little Ice Age in the Medieval Period.

The platform climate change deniers have generally sees their voices amplified well beyond what they should be. The results of various studies often level out at around the same rate - namely that only two or three people out of 100 will dispute the scientists' theory that humans are the cause of alobal warming.

With such a large accepting consensus, the drive to combat this gradual warming of Earth has

accelerated in recent years. Equipping ourselves with data, while ensuring we have the ability to interpret it, is vital.

Temperatures across a timespan of a year, five years or even a decade might rise four degrees in one region and drop six in another (which is why anomalies occur, such as Greenland's Jakobshavn Glacier actually increasing in mass since 2016), but overall, there is trouble ahead.

The next, vital step the Earth faces is a willingness of its people to do something about it. For all the UK's action over the past couple of decades, for all the destruction global warming has already contributed, such as coastal erosion, moorlands fires, floods and more, we contribute just 1.2 per cent of the world's total emissions.

It means that, as if it were ever in doubt, a global solution requires a true global investment of action from the planet's inhabitants.



WHAT YOU WILL NEED:

- > Your chosen clothing or fabric for guilt squares
- > Fusible interlining
- > Batting
- > Backing fabric
- > Adhesive spray, such as Elmer's Multi-Purpose Spray Adhesive
- > An iron
- > Scissors
- > Pins
- > Sewing machine
- > Ruler or tape measure

HOW TO MAKE:

Step 1: Gather the fabrics you want to make your quilt with. This could be t-shirts, blankets or baby clothes.

Step 3: Cut your fusible interlining slightly larger than your guilt to allow for cutting back later.

Step 4: Cut off the necks and sides of your t-shirts. You will be left with two squares from each one.

Step 5: Following the manufacturer's instructions, lay the fusible interlining on the back of your squares and fuse using an iron.

Step 6: Once all pieces are fused, cut to size.

Step 7: Decide upon the layout of your squares and pin together before starting to sew.

Step 8: Using your sewing machine, start to sew each row together before attaching the rows to complete your quilt top. Remove pins.

Step 9: Make a quilt sandwich using backing and batting which needs to be 5cm bigger on all sides. Fuse the batting using an iron and then attach your backing with an adhesive spray.

Step 10: Complete your quilt using the stitch-in-the -ditch technique using your sewing machine, or use free-motion guilting.

Congratulations. Your memory quilt is complete.

THE DOS AND DON'TS TO ACHIEVING PERFECT UNDERFOOT CONDITIONS

ou think splashing the cash on a swanky new length of carpet is the first and last bit of expense you need to worry about, before someone reminds you that carpet without underlay is akin to a new motor without tyres on the wheels. It's recommended that you change your underlay whenever you change your carpet - after all, years of wear, tear, and no small amount of gravity will have squashed the best life out of it.

New underlay will provide for you a number of things - firmness, bounce, insulation, noise reduction, preservation of your new flooring, as well as reinforcing the feeling that your new piece of carpet is worthy of something you'd find on the way into a film premiere.

Premium underlay will set you back up to £10 per metre square, though perfectly good brands can be picked up for less than half that. It's true to say the higher quality your underlay, the longer it will, in

turn, look after your carpet.

Typical depth is around 10-13mm, with a lower grade on the stairs. You'll also have to consider the tog rating - anything higher than 2.5 tog will insulate nicely, though if you have heated floors then switch back down to a lower tog of around

As for the fabric, PU foam is the most common underlay on the market. It offers a soft feeling underfoot, is made from recycled materials and is a good insulator. Other types are made from rubber, sponge rubber and crumb rubber, the latter being made from car tyres. Felt and wool carpet underlay also come well recommended.

And if you're fitting wood or laminate flooring, then consult a specialist who can bring forward a range of hardfloor-specific underlays that are lighter and thinner, and respect what is an intentionally solid top layer.



he February birth flower is the vibrant violet. People born in this month tend to be both modest and mild mannered, hence the popular expression "shrinking violet". Sweet violets are regularly found in the UK in woods and hedgerows and are often candied and used to decorate cakes.

Violets have been around for centuries and were first cultivated by the Greeks around 500BC. According to Greek mythology, violets were created when one of Artemis' nymphs was pursued by her twin brother Apollo. To protect her, Artemis turned her into a violet, which in turn led to this flower being known to represent modesty.

WHAT DOES THIS BIRTH FLOWER SAY ABOUT YOUR PERSONALITY?

If you were born in February, you are said to be wise beyond your years. A private person, you are also prone to being a bit of a dreamer. It can take you a while to warm up to people, but when you do, you are fiercely loyal.

CAN I GROW VIOLETS IN MY GARDEN?

Violets typically grow in the wild, although they are decreasing in numbers owing to habitat loss, which means if you want to grow them in your garden, you need to recreate these conditions. Violets thrive in winter and spring sun but need summer shade, so their ideal spot is under a deciduous tree or shrub.

Violets will self-sow, but growing your own from seed is a challenge as the seeds need to be fresh. Instead, buy plants during the spring and plant immediately in moist but well-drained soil.

WHAT PESTS ARE COMMON TO VIOLETS?

If your violet leaves turn yellow, this could be the result of an attack by red spider mites. This pest strikes when your plant becomes too hot or dry. The best remedy is to defoliate the plant completely.

Club hopes to serve an ace with fundraising campaign

Frinton-on-Sea's residents are being asked to help the town's Lawn Tennis Club get through the coronavirus pandemic and beyond.

Members at the club, which has a heritage of more than 120 years, have launched a crowdfunding campaign to raise £75,000.

The not-for-profit sports and social club offers lawn and all-weather court tennis, squash, gym, fitness classes, walking football, swimming and croquet, together with a range of events and social activities that serve the local and wider community.

The money will be used to replace some of the club's existing floodlights with LED, restore some funds to allow the club to recover financially and to carry out other essential work, such as repairing the clubhouse thatch.

James Max, club chairman, said the work will help ensure a safe and well-lit space, ensure a

secure clubhouse, give it time to get back on its feet and ensure the club continues to serve the local community.

He said: "The coronavirus pandemic has made it even more important that the local community has a facility on its doorstep that provides opportunities for meeting people and keeping fit. All age groups will benefit. Being a non-profit organisation, all donations will be used for the benefit of the local community."

In addition to the benefits to its members, the club hosts county, national and international tennis tournaments and also hosts a considerable number of events that benefit the community.

The clubhouse is also used for jazz, comedy and music festival events, and the Frinton Summer Theatre.

Jordan set for emotional charity ride later this year



A brave cyclist is preparing to cycle from Frinton-on-Sea to Land's End in the summer in memory of two of his family members.

Jordan Cantlow, 23, hopes to cycle more than 400 miles in July in memory of his mother Michelle who died from cancer in July 2019. Just a year later, Jordan's younger brother Kayden decided to take his own life.

Jordan gave some more detail about just why he is undertaking the epic challenge.

He said: "I remember having a family holiday when I was younger to Cornwall, and for some reason we never managed to make it to Land's End, so I think it is about time that I go there for the both of them."

As well as remembering Michelle and Kayden, Jordan will be raising money for St Helena Hospice, who cared for his mum, and Papyrus UK, which provides help and hope for young people with thoughts of suicide.

He added: "I want to try and reach as many people as possible with a message of positivity. Whatever life throws at you there is always a reason to move forward and make a positive choice."

Jordan has already raised £2,790 and has a target of £5,000.

Conmen take nearly £30,000 from elderly victims

Iderly residents are being warned to stay vigilant after fraudsters persuaded three couples to withdraw large sums of money from their bank accounts.

In each case, the criminals claimed to be police officers who were investigating counterfeit money at a bank.

They persuaded their victims, all in their 80s, to

make the withdrawals, then sent a courier to collect the money from their homes.

Two couples in Frinton-on-Sea and Walton-on-the-Naze were targeted on January 8, and a couple in Frinton-on-Sea received a similar call on January 5. The criminals took more than £29,000 in total.

Detective Sergeant Michael Evans, of Clacton CID, said: "These criminals are callous and despicable, taking advantage of people's trust to take their life savings. We are continuing our enquiries to find those responsible and urge anyone who has received similar phone calls to please contact us

"I also ask people to please be vigilant. Police officers, law enforcement agencies and banks will never ask you to send money, bank cards or other personal property via a courier, taxi or other means.

"They will also never ask for your bank account details or PIN over the phone, so please don't disclose these to anyone."

Injured seal found on beach recovering well in hospital

An injured seal found on Frinton-on-Sea beach last month is making good progress at South Essex Wildlife Hospital.

Derek, a six-week-old pup, was found by the British Divers Marine Life Rescue on January 21, alone, very dehydrated and with several infected wounds caused by dog bites.

He was taken to the South Essex Wildlife Hospital. Founder Sue Schwar said he is recovering well.

She said: "He has been checked over by a vet. The dog bite wounds were not recent, so we clipped his fur off and he's now on antibiotics. He's struggling to maintain temperature which can be quite traumatic but he is eating for himself."

Derek will shortly be sent to an RSPCA hospital in East Winch, Norfolk.

Locals are urged to take part in Census 2021

ouseholds in Frinton-on-Sea and across Tendring will be asked to take part in Census 2021 this

Understanding the needs of the nation helps everyone, from central government to organisations such as Tendring District and Essex County councils and health authorities, plan and fund public services across England and Wales.

Census 2021 will be the first run predominantly online, with households receiving a letter with a unique access code, allowing them to complete the questionnaire on their computers, phones or tablets. There will also be support available for people who are

not confident with online services.

Census day will be March 21, with households receiving letters early that month with online codes explaining how they can take part. The Census will include questions about your sex, age, work, health, education, household size and ethnicity.

For the first time, there will be a question asking people whether they have served in the armed forces, as well as voluntary questions for those aged 16 and over on sexual orientation and gender identity.

Results will be available within 12 months, although personal records will be locked away for 100 years and kept safe for future generations.

New food app expands to cover town

As it is locally based, the money stays in the local economy and contributes towards the community. It also operates on fair-trade-based policies, so takeaways receive what they deserve, and it donates 10p from every order to St Helena Hospice in Colchester.

Businesses in Frinton-on-Sea who have signed up to be part of the app include The Red Lion, Mossla, British India and Star of India.

Gary Richards set up the app and said he was pleased with the reaction.

He said: "We already have more than a thousand registered users and restaurants are approaching us all the time. I really think this is something that will grow and catch on. I'm very excited."

Thirteen rapid COVID-19 testing centres are now fully operational across the county, offering individuals without symptoms easy access to a rapid test to check if they have the virus.

The centre in Tendring is at Long Meadows Community Centre, Long Meadows in Harwich.

Anyone living or working outside their home in any district of Essex will be able to access a LFT at the relevant local centre for their district or the district that they work in.

If the LFT gives a positive result, individuals must self-isolate. There is support available for anyone who is required to self-isolate, including financial support if they are unable to go out to work or work from home.

If the LFT is negative, it is vital that residents continue to follow guidance on social distancing.

LFTs are available by appointment only and can be booked online or by calling 0333 772 6144. Residents can also email booking.confirmation@nhs.net

That means there's little risk in leaving food out for foxes if you're hoping to get a glimpse of these fiery nocturnal beauties, who will happily roam around in the late afternoon as well.

There is a downside, however. From fouling the garden to chewing shoes left outside, to trampling lawns and even digging up deceased pets, if you encourage foxes in, you'll have to go along with their inquisitive, playful habits.





level of gadgetry once reserved for Bond films or the mind of Jason Bourne might soon be coming your way, with boffins in Israel having found a way of beaming music into the brain without the need for speakers or headphones.

It goes by the name of soundbeaming, and this futuristic audio technique has the ability to transform the way we listen to music, play computer games, watch TV or process satellite navigation instructions forever.

The product is called a Soundbeamer 1.0 and is made by Noveto. It sits on a desktop and beams sound to the user – and not just any sound, but rich 3D, circling and weaving soundscapes that fill the ear, swirl around the head and infiltrate the brain, without really seeming to come from any one direction.

What's more, there are no implants required – simply, the 3D sensing module locates and tracks your ear position and sends audio via ultrasonic

waves, creating sound pockets next to the ear. And because there are no headphones blocking other sounds, you will still pick up what's being spoken in the room, so no need for those awkward taps on the shoulder.

The technology is so new and so advanced that even the company's CEO admits he has struggled to comes to terms with it.

"The brain doesn't understand what it doesn't know," he says. "It sounds like a speaker but it is just you who can hear it, and that's quite something for the brain to come to terms with.

"We have other technologies that happen around us that are difficult to comprehend but vital to our lives – the internet is perhaps a good example – and I hope this will come to be regarded in the same way."

As for when we can get our hands on the Soundbeamer – the company hopes that the first will be available for sale by Christmas 2021.
