

# Nelson Mandela A MAN OF THE PEOPLE

ON THE CENTENARY OF HIS BIRTH. ROYAL CORRESPONDENT CHARLES RAE LOOKS. BACK AT NELSON MANDELA AND HIS RELATIONSHIP WITH BRITAIN.

elson Mandela walked into a room with the Queen in Durban, South Africa. He briefly left her side as she talked to another guest. I suddenly found myself standing next to the great man and he turned to me and said: "Isn't Elizabeth wonderful?"

Slightly taken aback and wondering who he was taking about, I asked, "Who is Elizabeth?"

Mr Mandela, who had retired as South Africa's first Black president a few months earlier in 1999 looked astonished and pointed at the Queen and said: "Elizabeth of course, your Queen."

I was shocked as I had never heard anyone be so familiar with Her Maiesty. I knew her family name was Lilibet and that the Duke of Edinburgh sometimes affectionately called her "Cabbage".

> If that left me surprised, I was more shocked when I spoke to his daughter Zindzi who told me that when Mr Mandela and the Queen were alone together in private he called her "Lizzie".

> > If anyone could pull it off, it's the late South African president. He and "Lizzie" were quite close—she signed letters to him with "Your sincere friend, Elizabeth R."

She referred to him as Nelson.

The couple had become great friends ever since his release in 1990. Eighteen of those years were spent on Robben Island, off the coast of Cape Town. He had been jailed in 1963 after being found guilty of trying to overthrow the government.

The Queen had shown a remarkable piece of judgment. After all, Mrs Thatcher had called Mandela a terrorist in Vancouver in 1987.

The world mourned when he died in 2013, aged 95. This month (July 18) marks the centenary of his birth.

Although he spent his life fighting Britain's colonial legacy in South Africa, Nelson Mandela was an Anglophile. The roots of his close and contradictory relationship with

> > It was the custom then for all the African boys to be given English names, so on his first day his teacher renamed him Nelson Mandela and a man of the people was born.

Tf travel sickness means you dread long journeys, these helpful dos and don'ts may serve you well ⊥on your next vacation.

- ✓ DO choose the best seat. The front of the car, the middle of the aeroplane over the wing, or the lower levels of a ship are where you should be.
- DO have a steady flow of fresh air.
- ✓ DO be prepared. If you are prone to sickness, take antihistamines the night before, then on the morning of your trip. If you only think you might be sick, pack hyoscine tablets such as Kwells, which can work within 15 minutes.
- DO dose up on ginger. Studies have shown that this warming spice can really help travel sickness. So, take ginger capsules half an hour before travelling, have ginger candies in your bag (from health food stores) and if you are sick, drink plenty of water to overcome the effects.

# ACHIP

The history of the classic fish 'n' chips

he UK may be serving up the world something of a food renaissance when it comes to ground-breaking chefs, but in reality, all we need to really dine out on is our greatest ever food export, fish 'n' chips.

Although some of the history around our finest takeaway treat is sketchy, it seems the idea of marrying together the two first came about in the 1860s in Lancashire, when Mosslev-based entrepreneur John Lees began selling the combo out of a modest wooden hut. Prior to that, the idea of frying potato had actually been considered as an alternative to fish for the times in the cold winter months when rivers and fishing lakes froze over.

This new dinner revolution quickly caught on, particularly as, over time, people began to discover the ability to add their own subtle touches: ketchup, salt 'n' vinegar, tartar sauce as extra flavouring; right through to mushy peas, sausages and onion rings as full accompaniments.

Fish 'n' chips are even credited with helping us win the First World War, with the British government of the time making the safeguarding of stocks a priority, just as they did again when we went into battle again in 1939. And you can see why such a complement of carbohydrates and fish (that we regularly call 'brain food') would fuel a nation under attack.

Being an island too, fish stocks have always been in plentiful supply, even if EU regulations over recent decades have affected our reach. Some of the red tape has led to a slight change in consumer tastes. with the emergence of fish such as pollock and hake, although cod remains a solid first choice, with over 60 per cent of us choosing the fluffy, white, moist flavours as our perfect Friday night treat.



Drainage, weight distribution, possible planning permission and choosing suitable plants are all important factors. # 5 POISOMOUS TANTS

eware the hidden dangers that are lurking in your garden which could prove fatal to your beloved family pets if consumed. We have identified the most common garden plants which could poison your dog or cat to help you keep your animals safe.

From the stem to the petals, the tulip flower is toxic, but the bulb specifically is poisonous to dogs and cats and when consumed will result in a nasty case of nausea, mouth irritation and excessive drooling. If you are a horse aficionado, it is worth noting that this flower is toxic to our equine friends also.

If you are a keen allotment gardener, always ensure that your tomato plants are not accessible to either cats or dogs as the leaves of this plant are toxic to them.

This variety of crocus is extremely dangerous for both cats and dogs and if ingested can lead to liver and kidney damage, seizures and even death. The spring crocus is not without fault as it can still cause vomiting and diarrhoea but doesn't lead to fatalities.

The beautiful lily flower is a complete no-no for any cat owners as every part of this plant is toxic to them; as little as one petal can make them very ill indeed. Certain varieties are also toxic to dogs.

This common perennial grass weed that can grow up to two feet tall is incredibly harmfu to dogs. Most likely to be found in open fields but it could be growing in your garden, this

Pour roughly 250ml of glue into a bowl and add one teaspoon of gel at a time, mixing as you go until the slime no longer sticks to your fingers. Get creative and add food colouring and glitter to your slime.

### Friday

Strengthen their little fingers (great for handwriting) and have them in fits of laughter with cornstarch goo; it's basically homemade quicksand. Just gradually mix cornstarch with water and you are off.



### Tvesday

Build a fortress with DIY kinetic sand; so much cheaper than the shop bought product and the kids will never know the difference. Simply bake 2lbs of sand at 120 degrees for 5 hours. Then, mix one bottle (5oz) of clear glue with one cup of liquid starch until you have a runny slime consistency. Gradually add a spoonful of the slime to the sand until you get the desired effect.

FIVE SECRET. COST-EFFECTIVE TIPS TO GET YOUR FURNITURE GLEAMING AGAIN

### Revive with coconut oil

If your wooden surfaces or leather upholstery are looking a little lacklustre, they probably just need rehydration and nourishment. But you don't need to splash out on fancy furniture polish or beeswax, as a little coconut oil will do the trick just as well. Start by giving the surface a wipe down with warm water and soap, and when dry, apply coconut oil to an old rag before thoroughly rubbing into furniture.

### Use vinegar to naturally stain wood

If you have a wooden table that's looking patchy, or you just prefer a new finish, you can stain naturally with vinegar. Simply combine one cup of vinegar (balsamic for a dark effect, apple cider for a lighter colour) with one cup of water and leave in a bucket for 24 hours with a steel wool pad. Then paint this solution onto your wood - note: it will look significantly lighter when wet (not darker, as you may expect).

### Remove stains and marks with everyday products

Forget the harsh chemicals, by mixing up a solution that's three quarters vegetable oil and a quarter vinegar. you can get rid of most superficial wood marks - just rub on and leave. For leather, try using lemon juice, or for tough stains, rub in alcohol.

### Shine up glass and mirror surfaces

Got smears that just won't budge? Start with a microfibre cloth to remove dust, then mix a solution that's half white vinegar and half water in a spray bottle. Apply and then buff with microfibre. Finish with a rub of scrunched-up newspaper.

### Fill rail holes with wood

What's the best material to fill a hole in wood with? Wood, of course. Depending on the size, use a toothpick, or wooden skewer to fill the space, cut it to the right size and fix with a little wood alue. Sand to finish.

n an aesthetic sense, the humble ceiling regularly fails to get the credit it deserves. Done properly, it can really enhance the sensation of space and light, leading to happier, uplifted homes. Consumers also switched on to the idea of spotlights and the need for false ceilings, while even a simple cover-up of these bumpy, bobbly designs proved a mammoth task (either in sanding or plastering over) that many ventured never to Artex again.

Oh, and the final nail in the coffin was the small matter of asbestos until the mid-1980s, white asbestos was added to Artex to strengthen it - and we all know the dangers associated with inhaling the mineral's microscopic fibres.

While Artex certainly defined a generation of amateur interior designers, it's commonly accepting now that plain designs are best for eliminating shadow, whilst also allowing light to move across a space, and this peculiar trend has probably had its day.

fter upping sticks for the US three years ago, James Corden has become one of the biggest names in world entertainment, yet it's refreshing to find Uxbridge's most famous export hasn't lost any of his tenderness, humility or down-to-earth charm.

He presents one of the biggest talk shows in the world, stars in Hollywood blockbusters and calls Harry Styles his best mate. In December, he welcomed his third bundle of joy, Charlotte, and despite a burgeoning family life, remains hopelessly in demand for shows and events on both sides of the Atlantic.

### Man sent to prison for supplying drugs

Aman from Hornchurch was sentenced to over five years' imprisonment for possession with intent to supply Class A drugs in Potters Bar.

Don Cole, aged 29, was sentenced to five years' imprisonment for possession with intent to supply heroin and five years for possession with intent to supply cocaine, to run concurrently. He was given a further two months for failing to surrender to custody.

Detective Constable Chris Payne from the Hertsmere Local Crime Unit said: "Officers on routine patrol stopped a man acting suspiciously in Ashwood Road on October 20, 2016. He was searched for drugs and £1.800 in cash and a number of mobile phones were found.

"Officers suspected that Cole had drugs on him and he was further detained. He ran off but was detained after a brief foot chase during which time he tried to discard a package, found to contain a substantial quantity of heroin and cocaine. worth at least £1,600."

Cole was arrested and dealt with by Hertsmere Local Crime Unit. He was charged and remanded into custody and appeared at Hatfield Magistrates' Court the following day. He was released on bail but subsequently failed to appear at St Albans Crown Court for trial.

He was arrested on November 4, 2017 trying to enter the UK through Glasgow Airport. He was remanded into custody and pleaded not guilty resulting in a four-day trial at crown court. However, he was unanimously convicted by the jury sitting.

Commenting on what he hoped to achieve in the role, Cllr Deon-Burton said: "Not to embarrass the very able Deputy Mayor's Consort whom I'm thankful to have supporting myself, the rest, I shall have to come back to vou."

# MP hoping for Heathrow hub to be close to home

As we prepare to leave the EU, I am passionate about turning the government's Global Britain agenda into something of tangible benefit to constituents.

One of the big decisions before Parliament relating to that agenda right now is airport expansion. The government is keen to push forward with a third runway at Heathrow to open new routes to fastgrowing markets in Asia.

How can we ensure that Hornchurch and Upminster gain from this?

If Heathrow gets the green light for expansion, it wants to establish four 'logistics hubs' for the off-site construction of the expanded airport. This would be a pioneering method of construction, bringing the engineering and manufacturing jobs of the future to wherever a hub is established.

I am currently working with Havering Council and neighbouring MPs to bid for one of Heathrow's hubs to be sited at Beam Reach in Rainham, transforming a vast brownfield site next to our constituency into a centre of modern industry and logistics. The hub would reignite use of the River Thames to transport parts to Heathrow and it would connect Rainham to

the growing ports of Tilbury and London Gateway, placing Havering as the link between London and trade with the rest of the world.

This proposal could unlock massive regeneration opportunities for our region in jobs, business, education and housing terms. Havering College and CEME already have campuses nearby to train local people for engineering and manufacturing jobs, but a Heathrow hub could help us attract a university campus to the site and draw on Rainham's history in steel, distribution and car-manufacturing by providing the blue-collar work of the future.

This month, I invited Transport Secretary Chris Grayling to Havering to discuss our hub proposal and visit the Railway Academy at Havering College's campus in Harold Hill. I was also able to discuss with him local train services and how we might encourage the Mayor of London to invest more in the capital's outer boroughs.

With Heathrow's team visiting us soon to assess the bid, I hope they will see just what enormous economic benefit could be spread to our borough as we strengthen trading links between our nation and the rest of the world.

The plans would introduce new parks and landscaping along the length of the New Road, with easier access to the historic Rainham Village and Beam Reach Country Park.



Man jailed for six years following high-speed pursuit on M11

↑ man has been jailed for six years following a high-Aspeed pursuit on the M11 that saw five vehicles being struck and an officer being assaulted.

Cormack Doolin, 24, from Hornchurch, received three years for robbery, two years for dangerous driving, six months for theft and six months for actual bodily harm, all to run consecutively.

At Chelmsford Crown Court on Monday, June 11, he was also disqualified from driving for six years and received no separate penalty for driving without insurance.

At around 10.50am on Sunday, February 18, Essex Police were carrying out speed checks on the M11 when Doolin drove past travelling at 99mph.

Roads policing officer, PC Mike Bignell, followed the car and signalled for it to stop without success. Doolin drove off, weaving in and out of lanes at 120mph over 11 miles, before crashing into two vehicles on the junction 7 slip road.

PC Bignell got out of his car and tried to open Doolin's door but was run over and knocked to the floor, suffering a hand injury. Despite this, the officer got up and continued the pursuit.

Doolin was later involved in two further head-on collisions with four cars along the A414 in Church Langley - one car carrying two children. He ran off but was tripped over by a member of the public. Mark Solomon, and was quickly arrested by PC Bignell.

His car was found to have been stolen from an address in Romford.

Doolin was also sentenced after robbing a guard carrying an empty cash box in Brentwood High Street at 12.45pm on October 11, 2017. The box was later found smashed in a car park in Park Road.

Investigating officer, DC Mel Keen, of Brentwood CID, said: "Doolin was determined to escape at any cost. He drove at dangerous speeds, collided with five vehicles and ran over a police officer.

"His dangerous actions resulted in an innocent woman suffering broken ribs and a man having to undergo surgery for back pain.

"PC Bignell suffered soft tissue damage and despite being in pain, still bravely pursued the vehicle and arrested Doolin. I would like to thank him for his courage and determination.

"My praise and thanks also goes to Mr Solomon who tripped Doolin and has since been rewarded with £200. His actions have resulted in a dangerous individual being locked in prison for a number of

Come to the edge... and they came, and he pushed. and they flew.





Before this, he was an apprentice engineer at Smith's Instruments, and even spent some time with the Royal Navy aboard HMS Swiftsure, rising to the rank of Petty Officer.

### Neville Southall

Widely considered one of the greatest goalkeepers ever to grace British football - and Wales' all-time appearance maker to boot - Southall came into the beautiful game relatively late having worked as a binman, waiter and hod carrier, the first of these becoming the inspiration behind his autobiography The Binman Chronicles.
