The 1980s were a dark, crusty, sometimes snuffly period where noses were concerned. Despite being accompanied by the radiant Princess Diana, Prince Charles's hooter was seemingly on the front of every newspaper, Barbara Streisand's snorter was helping her to the top of the charts, and even the striking coal miners found themselves at the septum of nostril-led nastiness... 'What do you do if the government gets up your nose? Picket.'

But then, in 1988, something changed. Richard Curtis – for so long sticking his finger up the schnozzle of the establishment courtesy of his iconic *Blackadder* character – paired up with occasional funnyman Lenny Henry to start a new fundraising concept that had comedy at its heart.

It was called Comic Relief. It invited celebrities to challenge, entertain and host; it offered schoolkids and community leaders the chance to get their creative juices flowing; it implored TV watchers to dig deep for the less fortunate in society; and rallied around TV editors to free up screen time and resources for a total tee-hee takeover.

It's now a project that runs every two years, with merchandise, oneoff specials (such as *Comic Relief does The Apprentice*) and outwardbound pursuits (notably this year it's a wealth of celebrities, including Jade Thirlwall and Leigh-Anne Pinnock from Little Mix, *Strictly* judge Shirley Ballas, former MP Ed Balls, and TV presenters Dan Walker, Anita Rani and Alexander Armstrong, climbing the 19,000ft peak of Mount Kilimanjaro). There's also a showpiece event at Wembley Arena, with 2019 welcoming heavyweights from the comedy world: Jimmy Carr, Rob Beckett, John Bishop, Romesh Ranganathan, Alan Carr and others.

And let's not forget the noses themselves – 11 new stonkers such as Sir Schnoz III, The Abominable Snoseman and Hairy Nostroll, all of which can be brought to life with augmented reality on your smartphone through the Red Nose Day app.

Since Red Nose Day 2017, nearly 15 million people across the UK and some of the world's poorest communities have been helped, and an estimated two-and-a-half million of those are children and vulnerable adults.

While the project uses Red Nose Day as its centrepiece – and in the past 30 years has raised over \pounds 1billion for charitable causes – the charity's work stretches well beyond putting a lump of foam on the end of your nozzle. Right now, the organisers are reaching out to anyone

who wants to get involved ahead of the big day on March 15. A mobile phone Red Nose Day giving page is a simple and hassle-free platform for raising funds – past that it's just a case of how far your imagination will take you in dressing up, performing, baking, physical challenges, parties, applebobbing... anything goes for the red nose.

From raising £15million in its first year, to a record high of £108million in 2011, the growth in Red Nose Day's popularity has been Pinocchio-esque. Can it reach new heights – or is it lengths – this year? With your help, perhaps.

April 1 – April Fool's Day. It's one date on the calendar the practical jokers all come out in force for, and avoiding the traps can be tricky.

The provenance of April Fool's Day - it's not really a day as you only have until noon to construct your web of deceit - is sketchy to say the least, but some believe it originates

That particular prank continued into the 18th and 19th centuries where those easily-led were invited to view this supposed annual ceremony... only to find that they been sent on a fool's errand.

hy do onions make you cry? Why does chilli make your mouth burn? We expose the food mysteries that have long since plagued your mind.

Why do onions make you cry?

We have all experienced the burning sensation, followed by the uncontrollable flowing tears when we slice this seemingly innocuous staple ingredient. But why does this happen? It is actually very simple, cutting an onion causes its enzymes to release a pungent gas which causes irritation when it comes into contact with your eyes.

Top tip: Refrigerate your onions prior to cutting.

Why does chilli make your mouth burn?

We are a nation of curry lovers but not all of us can stand the heat. Chilli contains the chemical capsaicin which binds to the receptors in our nose and mouth causing a burning sensation. Top tip: Water is not effective against capsaicin, instead try olive oil or milk, or even whiskey.

Why is it that once you pop you can't stop?


Pringles and other salted potato snacks are very hard to eat in only minimal amounts. Have you ever managed to eat just one or two crisps? Or is the temptation to go back too strong to resist? This is because our bodies are designed to crave sugar, fat and salt, stemming from our caveman days when we needed to store as many calories as possible.

Top tip: Only buy individual packets or better still, snack on unsalted nuts.

Why are you hungry so soon after a Chinese takeaway?

Many Chinese dishes contain MSG. Monosodium Glutamate, which triggers your pancreas to release insulin making you feel hungry. This popular cuisine is also high in carbohydrates such as noodles and rice which cause your blood sugar levels to crash guicker, resulting in overeating.

Top tip: Choose soups and protein-rich dishes with vegetables on the side.





ou've heard of them, and chances are you eat some of them every day... but what exactly are superfoods? And why should you be interested in them?

Anyone who has even the vaguest interest in protecting their long-term health will love the notion that one single food item can have profound positive effects on their body, and that's precisely the logic behind the superfood label. Whether packed with antioxidants which are thought to protect against the harmful effects of free radicals - chemicals which all our cells naturally produce that cause damage or brain-boosting, heart-protecting Omega-3 fatty acids, these superior dietary choices supposedly

have the power to boost your mood, slow down the ageing process, improve physical ability and generally transform you into a super human.

The trouble with superfoods, however, is that there is not an abundance of scientific evidence to back up these claims. Mostly this is down to the fact that research is based on high concentrations of the extracts, meaning that in some cases you would have to eat an awful lot to get any real benefits. On the bright side though, it's indisputable that a diet high in foods such as berries, garlic, broccoli and oilv fish, is going to reduce the risk of chronic illnesses such as heart disease and cancer, and generally help you lead a longer and happier life.



H TING Inflammation t's one of our body's greatest enemies, with age

increasing your chances of encountering arthritic symptoms, from seven per cent up to the age of 45, to over 50 per cent of people in retirement. The symptoms are common and often unrelenting - joint pain, tenderness, stiffness, inflammation, weakness and muscle wasting.

But while doctor-prescribed medication can alleviate some symptoms, there are simpler, more natural ways we can help ease the pain.

Fat - Fatty fish such as salmon, mackerel, sardines and trout are high in Omega-3 fatty acids and are proven to decrease joint pain and morning stiffness.

If fruit and veg is more your thing, garlic, broccoli, spinach and grapes should be sought out.

Ginger is also known for its ability to block the production of substances that promote inflammation, while berries and walnuts will offer you instant improvement.

Drink – In recent years, tart cherry juice has really come to the fore as a rapid healing drink against the ills of arthritis. In a recent US study, participants who drank around 250ml of tart cherry juice a day significantly decreased symptoms of osteoarthritis and inflammation, compared to those who took a placebo.

Exercise – As with any sort of whole-body improvement. exercise must play a part alongside diet and hydration. Movement plans for arthritis are many and varied, but you

need to focus on low-impact aerobics, strength training, regular stretching and subtle building of muscle mass.

The good news is many of these exercises are subtle and discreet consider an office chair as apparatus to

do seated push-ups against, take short walks, practise Pilates, yoga and Tai Chi. Also consider water-based exercises, low impact movements - such as in cycling - and suspension training. Combined, these natural remedies can significantly lessen the impact of arthritis.



Constant CRAVINGS

s your fast-food addiction getting you down? Here are some great tips to help transform the foods you crave, from horribly bad for you to healthy.

EAT PROTEIN WITH EVERY MEAL

If you find yourself starting off the day with a big bowl of porridge, assuming this hearty, healthy meal will fend off hunger pangs, think again. It is protein that helps you feel fuller for longer. So add a handful of nuts and seeds to your bowl, or choose eggs instead, in order to avoid that 11am sugar slump.

DRINK MORE WATER

Quite often we can mistake dehydration for hunger, so next time you feel those pangs, have a glass of water and wait five minutes before reaching for the snacks.

LISTEN TO YOUR BODY

Forcing yourself to eat a salad in December is never going to end well, so try to be aware of what your body is craving. In the summer, choose fruit over ice cream while in winter months make yourself some satisfying soups and stews, in preference to stodgy chips and pies.

MAKE SMART SWAPS

Craving a bag of crisps? Try having a handful of plain nuts instead. Desperate for a slice of cake? Make a big box of date protein balls. With both of these alternatives, you'll be amazed at how much more satisfied and energised you feel. Remember, when it comes to change it is many small steps that make the distance.

CHECK YOUR MOTIVE

kay, so Chinese stole a march with their adoration for fengshui, but look sharp and get tidying, because Marie Kondo is here to change all that.

Marie Kondo is the clean queen wowing homeowners with a message that is as full-on as it is reserved. Is it her slight frame, her softly-spoken voice, or perhaps just a persona that almost effortlessly pushes homeowners towards minimalist magnificence? However she does it, the impact of her KonMari method – inspired by the spiritual practice of Shintoism and built on the premise of surrounding oneself with things that bring joy and satisfaction fairness... plus a little help from Netflix – represents a genuine cleaning revolution.

"It comes down to making home a warm, joyful place," she says, attempting to crystallise what, for some, is a seething, simmering mass of mental and physical torment, all brought about by a failure to be able to stay on top of housework.

Subsequently, Kondo has been embraced by an ever-increasing global gathering of home junkies, spreading warmth, homeliness and a joyful Japanese aesthetic across the Western world.

And as for that language barrier... "Let the cleaning do the talking," she says... and it does.

Roses laid in tribute to victims of the Holocaust

olocaust Memorial Day was marked at Havering Sixth Form College in Hornchurch by two students. Megan Wren, 18, and Rehab Hussain, 17, organised a tribute for the six million Jewish people who were murdered more than 70 years ago.

Megan added: "As the theme this year is 'Torn from Home' the tape we laid on the floor represented railway tracks and the horrible journeys that millions of Jewish people and other minorities had to make. We also asked students and staff to lay a rose in remembrance."

Terminal decision on health centre as funding denied

Plans for a new medical centre on the former St George's Hospital site in Hornchurch have been shelved after government declined to fund it.

Since March 2017 the former hospital on Sutton's Lane has been earmarked for development as Bellway Homes planned to build 365 new homes with provision for a medical centre should the government fund it.

However, government has now said it won't fund the medical centre as bids for other projects were deemed stronger.

A Department of Health and Social Care spokesman said: "The latest round of funding applications were highly competitive and the funding was prioritised on the strength of bids received from local NHS teams who know their patients' needs best."

This has caused frustration for Julia Lopez MP for Hornchurch and Upminster who raised the issues with the health secretary, Matt Hancock, in the House of Commons on Tuesday, January 15.

She said: "The board still hopes to bring health services back to the St George's Hospital site.

"They are now seeking feedback on both the process and some specific elements of their bid to understand how this outcome was reached.

"In the meantime they continue to explore all available options to fund the centre and ensure it can be delivered and be sustainable for the local NHS going forward."

Mr Hancock responded to Mrs Lopez MP's query by saying that he looks forward to working with her and local commissioners before the spending review, when the next round of the capital allocations will be set.





Hornchurch and Upminster



In my last column, I highlighted my campaign for a new health centre on the former St George's Hospital site on Suttons Lane - a facility I believe is vital in delivering expanded GP services, an integrated local health and social care system, improved mental health services and a less-pressured Queen's Hospital. Unfortunately, the centre's bid for NHS capital funding was not successful, and I have now secured a private meeting with Health Secretary, Matt Hancock, to see if the bid can be reviewed. In the meantime, I have met the executive team at Queen's and our regional NHS team to talk about how we strengthen our case and I shall keep constituents up to date with progress.

I also had the chance to talk to the Queen's team about how to ensure we have enough GPs, nurses and consultants to serve our growing population. These discussions form part of a wider skills agenda that my team and I are pursuing to ensure residents can access a broader range of employment opportunities. In Havering, 53 per cent of adults do not have A-level equivalent gualifications - a higher percentage than any other London borough - and I believe we can do

more to match the needs of employers to the talents of people in our community.

Last month I brought big East London employers together to see how we might turn the Beam Reach site in the south of the borough into a centre for training so local people can work on big projects like the Lower Thames Crossing or Havering's estate regeneration programme. I have also brought Google's Digital Garage Bus to the constituency to give parents free digital skills and CV-building courses while their children are in school.

In policing news, I am meeting the Borough Commander and neighbouring MP to discuss how to bear down on street crime. I am also campaigning for a tightening up of taxi regulations to improve passenger safety, and supporting government moves to strengthen laws on criminal trespass and help police and councils deal with unauthorised encampments.

Avering Council has proposed the following (which in my mind will kill off the small shops in Hornchurch, Elm Park and Upminster).

 From Hornchurch and Upminster – remove the free 30-minute parking (Elm Park get to keep this small but important favour)

> Increase parking charges to start at $\pounds1.50$ for the first hour and then increase the fee by $\pounds1$ each hour (2 hours $\pounds2.50$, 3 hours $\pounds3.50$ etc)

> Remove the free Sunday parking and introduce a £1.50 charge (will this also affect parks?)

Implement a CPZ (permit parking) within 1KM of Elm Park Station, Emerson Park Station, Hornchurch Station, Upminster Station, Upminster Bridge Station and Hornchurch Town Centre – these CPZs cover Monday to Saturday 8am till 6pm.

The parking is self-explanatory, now when you need to pop into town or down to the local shops you will need to pay $\pounds 1.50$ – unless you are lucky enough to get into one of the supermarket car parks.

The CPZ will mean that (if you do not have off street

parking) you will have to pay for a parking permit not just for yourself, but also for any visitors. The Permits currently cost £35 for the first car, £65 for the second car £85 for any additional cars (each year). Then there are the parking permits for visitors which are sold in books of 10 covering either four or eight hours. If someone pops in for 30 minutes you use a four-hour ticket (currently about £1.30 each).

Can you imagine the congestion around the edges of these CPZs where everyone will be wanting to park for free?

I urge you – please check who your local councillors are for your ward – use Google and type 'Havering Councillors', click on councillors by ward. If they are Conservative or from Harold Wood contact them and ask how they will vote when these proposals are voted on?

If you feel inclined please tell them that if they vote this in, you will not vote for them at the next elections – it might be the only way to stop them killing your town. Hopefully there will be better and more upbeat news next month.







e it careening down cascading waterfalls or leaping into rapids from a helicopter, Tao Berman has consistently pushed the boundaries when it comes to extreme sports.

SPORT

When it comes to white water, there's extreme... and then there's Tao Berman. The Washington State native, who turns 40 this year, made his name as one of the most fearless kayakers known to the sport, capable of descending near-vertical waterfalls and performing incredible stunts.

"I never had the objective of doing the extreme stunts," he admits. "As I progressed I was just constantly looking for new ways to push against my abilities, and as I got better at it I needed to take greater and greater risks to push my skill set to continue to get better."

This is the man who, as a 15-year-old amateur kayaker, was already starting to "run waterfalls and things of that nature". In 1997, Berman ran an 83ft descent on the El Tomata River in Mexico; by 1999, at age 19, he'd conquered the Upper Johnston Falls in Banff National Forest – all 98 feet of its thundering vertical drop – and landed a coveted place in the Guinness Book of World Records.

At the turn of the decade, however, Berman decided to hang up his paddle and retire from the world of extreme kayaking, having "accomplished every goal" he had set for himself.

"When I first got into it, I was pushing and progressing into the extreme end of the sport and after setting several world records in the extreme end, including the highest waterfall ever kayaked, I then got into freestyle kayaking," he explains. "After being ranked number one in the world, by winning the three world championships, I was looking for a new challenge so I got into extreme racing – which is racing down white water for a time – and after doing

a couple of undefeated seasons doing that, there wasn't much left in the sport to excite me."



AN ORIGINAL ENGLAND ICON

he passing of Gordon Banks in the middle of February offered the nation a chance of reflect and admire arguably the most iconic keeper the England football team has ever had.

Across two World Cups the Sheffield-born stopper wrote his name into Three Lions folklore – first, repelling West Germany at Wembley in 1966 as Sir Alf Ramsey's men lifted the Jules Rimet Trophy; then four years later, in Mexico, making a seemingly impossible save to thwart the great Pele.

In truth, England's World Cup win on July 30, 1966, was built around 10 other footballers, and as for the best save ever, it's doubtful... and these are facts the impossibly modest Banks reminded people of regularly in what is half a century since.

His humility was only one part of his character. Banks was a dominant, strapping, resilient, battling keeper from an altogether different era, where footballers were everyday folk, and retirement often led to opening a pub rather than going after the much-vaunted 'media work'.

He starred for Leicester City at the time of England's greatest game, and despite surprisingly being allowed to leave the Foxes little more than a year after that Wembley win, went on to make almost 200 appearances for Stoke City, prolonging his international career until the age of 35.

His retirement from the game was ultimately forced on him after a car crash in October 1972. He lost the sight in his right eye, and with it, the ability to perform fully as a keeper, despite stints thereafter in the US and Ireland.

Although he took up coaching and management roles, his experiences were never going to match those as a player and he left the game, returning later as an ambassador for Stoke City and regular member of the Pools Panel.

Banks passed peacefully away in his sleep on February 12, 2019.

One: TYRES

Check there's a spare tyre, a jack, its handle and the wheel brace for your vehicle. Remember too, the minimum legal tyre tread is 3mm. Make sure tyre pressures are correct - this will help handling and avoid you using excess fuel. It may also keep you on the road.

Two: LIGHTS

Check all of the lights, indicator, brake, dip, full beam and fog individually. Ask someone to stand out in front to help you make sure there are no faulty bulbs. Alternatively park by a clear wall or shop window in the night to see for yourself.

□ Three: WINDSCREEN

Make sure windows are washed and clear, and top the water for the windscreen wipers. Also check the wipers for any wear and tear... a smear on the window is the clearest sign your wiper blade needs replacing.

Four: OIL

Check engine oil or things may overheat. Do this

by checking the dipstick when the car has been dormant, and ensure vou're on a level surface. Top oil up via the cap and don't overfill.

□ Five: FAN BELT

Check the fan belt for any cracks or slippage.

□ Six: RADIATOR

If your car has been bought within the last decade, it should have the overflow bottle marked with a minimum and a maximum water level. Older vehicles will have a radiator cap. Make sure the engine is switched off and cool, then top up with an equal mix of water and antifreeze coolant.

Seven: EQUIPMENT

Always have emergency equipment in the car - so, torch, screwdrivers, pliers and adjustable spanner. Fire extinguishers are always useful, and your car should contain a medical kit and reflective jacket if you breakdown, plus bottles of (unopened) water.


