SPARE?

AMID THE RELEASE OF HARRY AND MEGHAN'S TRIO OF PROJECTS, WE LOOK AT HOW THE 'SPARE' AND HIS WIFE HAVE BEGUN TO TELL THEIR TRUTH

Since their unexpected flight from both British shores and the working Royal Family in January 2020, Prince Harry and his wife Meghan have caused quite the stir, constructing a new narrative that neither they nor the Royal Family can be certain of recovering from.

First came a biography of the pair, *Finding Freedom*, written by close confidante Omid Scobie, which hinted at unease within the royal ranks. Then, in March 2021, their shock interview with TV talk show maven Oprah Winfrey aired to global comment on both sides of the Atlantic.

Since then, things have been reasonably quiet and calm as the Sussexes have settled into their Los Angeles lifestyle and adjusted to family life with their two children, Archie, aged three, and 18-monthold Lilibet. However, as several multimillion-dollar deals reach their point of fruition, our red-headed prince and his raven-maned wife are once again back in the spotlight.

Last month, their six-part Netflix documentary *Harry & Meghan* was released, which saw the Duke and Duchess of Sussex attempt to tell their side of the story. Capturing the couple from their earliest days together right up to the period after Prince Philip's death, the series has certainly split opinion. While some find it to be insightful and informative, others believe it to be shocking and villainous. Or in some cases, opinions have flipped completely, and those who might not have supported them before have now gone to the other side and have begun to empathise with the pair.

To add to any nerves the Royal Family may have already been experiencing, Harry's book, *Spare*, is released this month. The title alone conveys the Duke's deep disconnection from his own family, one that doesn't appear as if it will be healed anytime soon.


All things come in threes, and Netflix has announced it is also behind the couple's other new project, entitled *Live to Lead*. It showcases inspirational figures – from climate change activist Greta Thunberg to New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern, to South Africa rugby star Siya Kolisi, the first-ever black captain of the side. Harry was inspired by the efforts of Nelson Mandela, and true to the former president's lifelong aspirations, the series of interviews is positioned to offer hope, vision, perspective and understanding... arguably at a time when the world needs it most.

Hopefully Harry himself will find in 2023 ways to reconcile what has been a turbulent and heart-wrenching year for the royals. He and Meghan's latest moves won't have done much to repair relations, but his transparency and clarity over how he feels hard done by may indeed act as a line in the sand, from where a new vista may emerge for the outliers, even if he questions the possibility of that.

"I've had to make peace with the fact that we're probably never going to get genuine accountability or a genuine apology [from my family]," says Harry in the documentary. "My wife and I, we're moving on. We're focused on what's coming next."

Such sentiments have been uttered by many of us regarding our own families, and unequivocally this shows us that when it comes to matters of the heart, the Windsor family, for all their wealth, prestige and glory, really are just like the rest of us. But is this family's broken relationship past the point of repair?



LENS REPLACEMENT SURGERY: SAY HELLO TO A CLEARER FUTURE

Lens replacement surgery (also known as refractive lens exchange)

The procedure is similar to cataract surgery which is a commonly performed procedure. Lens replacement surgery removes the clear natural crystalline lens (compared to cataract in which the natural lens has opacified and obstructs vision) in the eye and replaces it with a clear artificial intraocular lens (IOL). This procedure can help improve your eyesight, often eliminating the need to wear glasses for both near and distance, or contact lenses. (Multifocal lens implants are not available on the NHS).

Mr Jagmohan Chawla is an experienced Consultant Ophthalmic Surgeon at Spire Hartswood Hospital in Brentwood, Essex, specialising in multifocal lens implants, refractive lens exchange and complex cataract surgery. We spoke to Mr Chawla to find out more.

What is lens replacement surgery?

Lens replacement surgery requires replacing your eye's clear natural lens with an acrylic artificial multifocal lens. This is done to correct your eyesight, restore near vision or achieve sharper focus; reducing your need for glasses. The artificial lens is a permanent replacement for your natural lens and is designed to last for the rest of your life.

Mr Chawla told us: "Following surgery to both eyes, lens implants will enable you to focus at all distances. The customised toric lenses can also help to eliminate pre-existing blurred vision caused by astigmatism, a condition where light is focused at more than one place in the eye."

A recent patient's perspective of lens replacement surgery on both eyes with Mr Chawla: "On both days of my surgery I was naturally nervous but felt reassured by Mr Chawla. The team at Spire Hartswood Hospital were so kind, efficient and helpful. Following both surgeries I was contacted with a follow-up call, which I wasn't expecting - this was such a great service, particularly as I live on my own."

How long does the procedure take?

The procedure usually takes about 25 - 30 minutes and is performed as a day case procedure. Each eye is done separately, usually about 1 - 2 weeks apart.

Mr Chawla explained: "The operation is usually done under local anaesthetic and mild sedation. It can take a couple of days for your sight to become clearer, and vision for near and far distance should stabilise in 2-4 weeks."

What is the recovery time?

You will usually be able to go home on the same day as the procedure: however, you'll need someone to accompany you as your vision will be impaired.

Mr Chawla says: "It takes around two weeks before you can resume normal daily activities including light exercise, swimming, and using computers. Driving is possible within three days if one eye has already been done earlier."

Lens replacement surgery has proven results. Mr Chawla's previous patients have said:



f you're thinking about staying in this Valentine's Day, shellfish offers a decadent and delicious centrepiece for a romantic meal for two.

However, if you're unsure what to serve for that special someone come February 14, here are five of the most popular types of shellfish, as well as how to serve them.

Ovsters are the most nutrient-rich shellfish available and also the most expensive. With a reputation as an aphrodisiac, oysters have a gooey texture and a salty flavour. Most commonly served raw on ice, you can fill their shells with lemon, butter, hot sauce or a zingy mixture made from shallots and vinegar. Alternatively, they can be grilled, baked or fried.

One of the easiest shellfish to prepare and cook, mussels are usually steamed in flavoured broth or sauce. Mussels need to be kept alive before they are cooked and can only be refrigerated for one or two days. Any mussels with broken shells or ones with open shells and that don't close when tapped should be discarded. Enjoy moules frites (steamed mussels and fries), served with a huge chunk of crusty bread.

Crabs take a bit more effort to prepare and cook, but it's definitely worth it as you'll be rewarded with tender, delicious meat. You can boil, roast, steam or grill crab and this shellfish is commonly used in dips, pastas, seafood dishes and salads. White crab meat boasts a meaty texture and a more delicate flavour, whereas brown meat is softer with an almost pâté-like consistency.

Another highly tender and succulent type of shellfish, scallops make the perfect starter. Boasting a rich, buttery flavour, you can choose between small and sweet bay scallops or big and bold sea scallops. Pan-seared scallops with peas and mint are our go-to recipe at any time of year.

Known for its melt-in-the-mouth texture, lobster is the epitome of elegance. Lobster can be cooked whole, and the most succulent meat is found in the tails, legs and claws. Try garlic herb butter lobster tail as a delicious starter or lobster risotto as a main course.

JANUARY 20. IS NATIONAL CHEESE LOVER'S DAY - HERE'S HOW TO CELEBRATE

eeling a little cheesed off? Well don't despair, for Friday, January 20, is National Cheese Lover's Day, giving you carte blanche to celebrate and indulge in all your favourite dairy delights.

Not surprisingly, Britain is a nation of cheese lovers. Whether it's a humble cheddar sarnie, a saucy slice of Welsh rarebit or a fancy fondue dip, the average Brit eats 30g of cheese a day and there are more than 700 cheeses produced in the UK.

Around half of sales are cheddar – named after the famed Cheddar Gorge caves in Somerset where the cheese was once stored to ripen - but we're still partial to more exotic fromages such as mozzarella, parmesan and feta.

HOW TO CELEBRATE

With such a thriving cheese industry in this country, it couldn't be easier to indulge in this Wookey Hole-iest of days. Most major supermarkets now boast English-made gems such as Wensleydale Blue and Red Leicester, but it's also worth seeking out some lesser-known treats from your nearest speciality cheesemonger. Or, if you're really enthusiastic, you can head to your local dairy farm where they will likely have a shop selling their creations.

Not only is cheese incredibly tasty and diverse, it's also highly nutritious. A great source of protein, it contains vitamin B12 (which is vital for red blood formation), and a matchbox-sized slice provides one-third of an adult's daily calcium requirement.

So don't be sheepish - make like a mouse and treat yourself to a little of what you fancy. Whether red, yellow or blue, in moderation, cheese is very good for you.



love. But you might need to take a good look around - because red hair is rare. Only two in every 100 people are natural redheads, making it the rarest hair colour in the world. And the rarest people of all are redheads with blue eyes.

The genes responsible for red hair are recessive. This means that to have a red-haired baby, both parents must carry a red-haired gene. If both parents carry the gene but don't have red hair themselves, they'll have around a one in four chance of having a red-haired baby. If one of

the parents is a redhead and the other is a carrier of the gene but doesn't have red hair, the chances go up to around one in two. And if both parents have ginger locks, chances are that all their children will have red hair too.

Hundreds of years ago, redheads were thought

although some people still think natural gingers are brash and hot-headed. That's not true, of course. But recent studies have shown that redheads require more anaesthetic than people with other hair colours. THE STORY BEHIND BRITAIN'S ICONIC VACUUM CLEANER

le's not the most aesthetically pleasing member of the household cleaning family, nor the most powerful, and as far as cutting-edge technology goes, he pre-dates even the era of the mobile phone and internet connectivity.

Yet despite all of that, our love affair for Henry lives on, more than 40 years since the compact and affordable vacuum cleaner was launched by Numatic International.

Its founder, Chris Duncan, first started toying with his vacuum cleaner concept back in 1969, when he dressed up one of his standard vacuum cleaners with a Union Jack, hat and smiley face during a particularly long night at a trade show.

The response from visitors was a revelation for the inventor, who discovered that taking an inanimate object and giving it a personality enchanted people who were looking for something different from the standard

Of course, the cleaner plays its part where performance is concerned too, using large-capacity microfibre dust bags encased in a shell that is built for longevity and durability.

Since the machine was officially launched in 1981, sales continue to accelerate and now frequently exceed the one million mark each year. While Numatic has never advertised the machine, nor does it employ the services of a PR agency, an estimated 20 million have been sold in the UK to date.

Henry isn't the only named machine in the range. Previous versions have been called James, Charles, Nuvac, George, David, William, Edward, Basil, Wendy, Harry and Jack, while limited-edition models have been launched for B&Q, Screwfix and John Lewis.

It has also led to spinoff designs, notably the Henry and Hetty Spray Mops.

In 2023, it is the only massproduced consumer vacuum cleaner still made in Britain. and has made its founder a millionaire many times over.



Ture, you can save energy by investing in a new boiler, solar panels or roof insulation. If you've got the funds, they'll make a real difference. But these days, most of us don't have the money upfront. And what if you rent your home? Here's our round-up of the best ways to reduce your energy bills - without shivering like crazy or going broke.

CHECK YOUR HEATING

Turn your thermostat down a degree or two and see if the temperature's still okay. Turn down radiators in any room you don't use much. And don't have the heating on when you're out.

omford Conservatives have launched a petition after the Mayor of London Sadiq Khan announced plans to expand the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ) to outer London boroughs, including Hornchurch.

From August 29, 2023, drivers of vehicles that fail to meet emission and safety standards set by Transport for London will have to pay a £12.50 fee per day to enter the Greater London Authority (GLA) boundary.

Romford Conservatives' petition seeks to urge Havering Council to seek to prevent the ULEZ expansion, saying: "The ULEZ will have damaging impacts for local families and businesses, not just in Havering, but all across outer London."

The Mayor of London has also announced a scrappage scheme worth £110million to support Londoners and charities to scrap or retrofit their noncompliant vehicles.

Councillor Ray Morgon, Leader of Havering Council. said: "We do understand the negative impact of poor air quality on the lives of local residents and others, but pollution levels in inner central London remain much higher than in outer London boroughs.

"The GLA recognises that Havering is known to have good air quality, apart from a handful of hotspots.

"Furthermore, Havering is already taking action to improve our air quality further.

"We recognise our views have been listened to in regard to the new scrappage scheme. However, with the high cost of living and the large jump in prices in the second-hand car market, this will be yet another pressure on hard-working families.

"Furthermore, the public transport infrastructure in the borough is inadequate and not sufficient to encourage people to move away from cars.

"We will continue to lobby as there should be more thinking about the impact this will have."

Mayor Khan said: "There is still far too much toxic air pollution damaging the health of young Londoners and leading to thousands of early deaths every year.

"Expanding the ULEZ London-wide will mean five million more people will be able to live healthier lives."

Hornchurch and Upminster

am writing this column just before Christmas but by the time it is published, we shall be into the new year. I hope residents had a wonderful festive season in the meantime.

At the beginning of December, we were delighted to break ground on the new NHS St George's Health and Wellbeing Hub on Suttons Lane in Hornchurch – a project my team and I have been working on for five years.

Since my last column, Mayor of London Sadiq Khan has confirmed his intention to expand the Ultra Low Emission Zone (ULEZ). I have once again written to him, sharing the countless letters I have received from worried constituents about the ULEZ extension, amid concerns that this is just the start of daily vehicle levies.

I took the leader of the council to meet the Local Government Finance Minister, Lee Rowley MP, to discuss Havering's financial challenges. The Chancellor has provided a substantial budget uplift to councils on social care, and Communities Secretary, Michael Gove, has now confirmed extra cash as part of the Local Government Finance Settlement.

I had some great schools visits before Christmas, including to Abbs Cross Academy and Arts College, where I spoke to the leadership team about their recent application for Sixth Form provision. I share in their disappointment that the Department for Education declined their application, and I have taken this up with ministerial colleagues to see whether we can get the decision reviewed.

I welcome extra government funding that has been announced for schools in Hornchurch and Upminster, as part of my 2019 election commitment to improve constituency education. Schools face real economic pressures this year, and I hope this support will help long-term energy efficiencies and give short-term certainty to our teaching teams. I am also glad the Chancellor has confirmed that per-pupil funding levels are being addressed.

I know residents are concerned about illegal migration across the Channel. Prime Minister Rishi Sunak launched a five-point plan last month to tackle the problem, including an agreement with Albania, a new permanent Small Boats Operational Command in the Channel, tougher immigration enforcement, cheaper accommodation sites and doubling of caseworkers to clear the backlog.

I joined local Macmillan fundraisers on their newly branded Macmillan bus for a drive around the constituency to raise awareness of their cancer support. Local Macmillan manager Paul Lyons has been working with Stagecoach East London to create the bus to promote the charity. The vehicle is known by drivers as Martyn's Bus, in memory of Martyn Henderson, a much-loved colleague and friend who suffered from cancer and supported many others. Macmillan services are planned at the NHS St George's Health and Wellbeing Hub in Hornchurch so residents can access holistic care when undergoing treatment, including support for family and loved ones.

Work Starts on new NHS health and wellbeing hub

Work has begun on the £17million St George's Health and Wellbeing Hub on the site of the former St George's Hospital in Hornchurch.

A groundbreaking ceremony took place on Friday, December 2, after the government approved the scheme at the end of November.

The hub is scheduled for competition by March 2024, and will act as a base for a joint team of health and social care professionals across Barking, Dagenham, Havering and Redbridge.

Zina Etheridge, chief executive officer at North East London Health & Care Partnership, said: "The event marks another key milestone for the project – we're absolutely thrilled that work can finally get underway on this fantastic new health centre.

"Providing a range of health and care services in one place, right in the heart of the community, will make an enormous difference to so many people's lives."

Speaking at the ceremony, Julia Lopez, MP for Hornchurch and Upminster (pictured second from right), said: "The NHS project team have been incredible in their vision and persistence, and I have enjoyed working with them to get this hub started.

"This project will deliver truly integrated health and social care services in the heart of the community while reducing pressure on Queen's Hospital."

Cabinet agrees new waste disposal contract

avering Council's cabinet agreed to award its waste collection and street cleaning service to a contractor who will be named this month.

The new contract will cost £90million over eight years and is due to start on July 30 2023, with an option to extend for a further eight years.

The contractor will take on current in-house street cleansing services, as well as existing outsourced waste and recycling and weed control services. The agreement will also include green garden waste service, fly tipping clearance, graffiti clearing, and collection of clinical and bulky waste.

Following the council's commitment to a greener borough, improved recycling services will be offered. Glass has been added to household orange sack collections, and plastic pots, tubs and trays will now also be collected.

Councillor Ray Morgon, Leader of Havering Council, said: "The award of this contract is great news for our residents and for our borough.

HOW TO GET THE BEST OUT OF YOUR GARDEN IN THE COLD WINTER MONTHS

ome of us may regard winter as the season when our desire to venture out into the garden wanes completely. STRUCTURAL STATEMENTS

CALL FOR COLOUR

The assumption that the colour drains out of our gardens in winter is, ultimately, wrong. There are many stem-like winter plants that are radiant and

beautiful – consider the pinky purple of dogwood, evergreen rhododendrons and the shining white trunks of a birch tree.

TAKE FORWARD TRADITION

Planting a number of hardy winter varieties will give your garden presence as well as helping to carry forward the legacy of a traditional English garden. Use hellebores and snowdrops to create a classic, elegant effect.

TREMENDOUS TREES

Stripped of their summer decoration, let skeletal trees stand out against a snowy backdrop. Mixed up with evergreens, you can create a brilliant contrast.

FANTASTIC FEASTS

Finally, don't assume your winter garden can't put produce on the table. Carrots and fava beans will still thrive throughout the winter, and you can extend the growing period of a number of other varieties of fruit and veg if you keep your greenhouse operational throughout the cold months.

f you want to enjoy a good fruit cycle, you need to prune your apple and pear trees over the winter. For those who are new to fruit pruning, this step-by-step guide tells you all you need to know.

GET THE RIGHT TOOLS

You need to have clean, sharp tools that are designed for pruning, such as secateurs, loppers or a pruning saw if you have a larger pear or apple tree. Make sure you sharpen them before use.

CUT BACK SUCKERS AND LOWER BRANCHES

Use secateurs to cut back any suckers. These are unwanted shoots that grow near the base of the trunk. Also, cut back lower branches as these do not get sufficient light to bear good fruit.

REMOVE DEAD OR DISEASED WOOD

Remove all branches with discoloured or flaking bark towards the base of the branch by making a cut above an outward-facing bud (one that is on the opposite side of the stem to the main trunk). If there are no buds, remove the entire branch.

CREATE A VASE SHAPE FRAMEWORK

Ideally, you want four or five main branches that help

to create an open vase shape. If you have more than five, remove some at the base by cutting 6mm from the branch collar – this refers to the bulbous area that is attached to the trunk.

Avoid removing more than 25 per cent of the branches in one go as this can affect the tree's health and fruit production.

REMOVE CROSSING OR RUBBING BRANCHES

Remove any branches that are growing into the centre of the tree as this will allow for better air circulation. If two branches are crossing, keep the one that best retains the vase shape of the tree and remove the other one.

SHORTEN THE PREVIOUS YEAR'S GROWTH ON EACH BRANCH BY ONE-THIRD

Cut just above an outward-facing bud on each main branch so that new branches grow outwards. This will help the tree to develop into a healthy shape and prevent congestion.

- Some sheets of paper (A4 paper makes a lantern about 20cm tall, and A5 paper makes a lantern about 14cm tall). You can use different coloured or patterned paper
- > A ruler, pencil and eraser
- A glue stick
- Scissors
- Extra decorations such as stick-on shapes, sequins, braid or ribbon (optional)

- Fold your paper in half lengthways so you have a long, slim rectangle.
- 2 Draw a line parallel with the long edge. where the two sides of the paper meet. This line should be about 2.5cm away from
- Starting about 2.5cm in from one of the short edges, draw a series of parallel lines across the rectangle, from the folded edge up to the long line you've just drawn. These lines should be about 2.5cm apart.
- Cut along each of the short lines.
- Erase any noticeable pencil marks, then unfold the paper.

FIVE AGE-OLD BRITISH COMPANIES STILL WITH US TODAY

taggeringly, between 350,000 and 400,000 British businesses close their doors for good every year. But some companies have been up and running for centuries.

The oldest surviving British company is The Royal Mint. It opened in 1279 and, for several hundred years, was based at the Tower of London. In the early 1800s, it moved over the road. But by 1975, it had completed its move to its current home in Llantrisant, Wales. The Mint makes more than 3.3 billion coins and blanks yearly – for the UK and more than 30 other countries.

With the dwindling use of cash, the Mint has expanded into other areas, including precious metals investment, historic coins and luxury collectibles. And it's doing pretty well.

Cambridge University Press, the world's first publishing company, was founded in 1534 and publishes academic and educational texts.


Moving down the years, Royal Mail, as it's now known, was founded in 1586. For almost 500 years, it was owned by the state. But by 2015, it was fully privatised. At one stage in the early 20th century, the company had 22,000 pigeons. And someone's gone to the trouble of counting how many elastic bands it currently uses to bundle mail – apparently 342 million a year.

Barclays Bank was founded in London in 1690. The institution's long history is contained in an archive of photos, letters and curiosities housed in the Barclays Group Archives in Manchester.

In 1706, Thomas Twining bought a coffee shop in London's Strand and began to sell tea. Back then, tea was very costly. But Twining spotted a

trend. And when he started selling loose tea leaves, as well as cups of the beverage itself, business boomed. By 1717, he'd bought additional space next door – and the shop's still open for business today.







Thile no one expects to be involved in a car accident, these types of incidents can happen in the blink of an eye and, if you don't know what to do next, can cause you untold stress and expense.

Here's everything you need to know about DOIHAVE TO MAKE A CLAIM AFTER AN making a claim following an accident.

WHAT INFORMATION DO I NEED TO MAKE A CLAIM?

If you are involved in a motoring incident with another person, you should do your best to obtain the below information on the scene:

- > Their full name
- > Their vehicle registration
- > A contact telephone number

It can also be a good idea to find out their address and details of their insurance provider. If there are any witnesses, try to get their details as well. When you phone your insurance company, they are likely to ask you for your policy number, so make sure you have this to hand.

WHEN DO I NEED TO MAKE A CLAIM?

Although it can vary from one insurance provider to the next, typically you have 24 to 48 hours to inform them if you are involved in a motoring accident. This is regardless of whether the incident was your fault or caused by another party. Where possible, you should call them while still at the scene.

ACCIDENT?

There is no rule that says you have to make a claim after a road accident, but you are required by law to tell your insurer about what has happened.

DO I NEED TO CALL THE POLICE AFTER A CAR ACCIDENT?

According to the Road Traffic Act, you must report a car accident to a local police station within 24 hours. You can do this using the nonemergency number 101. If there is an injury or the road is blocked, call 999 immediately.

WHAT HAPPENS IF I DON'T WANT TO MAKE A CLAIM?

You may choose not to make a claim. This will allow you to keep your no-claims discount intact, although you will have to pay for any necessary repairs to your vehicle yourself. It is worth knowing that, even if you do not make a claim, the other driver involved may still do so.






THE AIM: Change the word at the top of the ladder one letter at a time to make the word at the bottom.
