SPARE?

AMID THE RELEASE OF HARRY AND MEGHAN'S TRIO OF PROJECTS, WE LOOK AT HOW THE 'SPARE' AND HIS WIFE HAVE BEGUN TO TELL THEIR TRUTH

Since their unexpected flight from both British shores and the working Royal Family in January 2020, Prince Harry and his wife Meghan have caused quite the stir, constructing a new narrative that neither they nor the Royal Family can be certain of recovering from.

First came a biography of the pair, *Finding Freedom*, written by close confidante Omid Scobie, which hinted at unease within the royal ranks. Then, in March 2021, their shock interview with TV talk show maven Oprah Winfrey aired to global comment on both sides of the Atlantic.

Since then, things have been reasonably quiet and calm as the Sussexes have settled into their Los Angeles lifestyle and adjusted to family life with their two children, Archie, aged three, and 18-monthold Lilibet. However, as several multimillion-dollar deals reach their point of fruition, our red-headed prince and his raven-maned wife are once again back in the spotlight.

Last month, their six-part Netflix documentary *Harry & Meghan* was released, which saw the Duke and Duchess of Sussex attempt to tell their side of the story. Capturing the couple from their earliest days together right up to the period after Prince Philip's death, the series has certainly split opinion. While some find it to be insightful and informative, others believe it to be shocking and villainous. Or in some cases, opinions have flipped completely, and those who might not have supported them before have now gone to the other side and have begun to empathise with the pair.

To add to any nerves the Royal Family may have already been experiencing, Harry's book, *Spare*, was released this month. The title alone conveys the Duke's deep disconnection from his own family, one that doesn't appear as if it will be healed anytime soon.


All things come in threes, and Netflix has announced it is also behind the couple's other new project, entitled *Live to Lead*. It showcases inspirational figures – from climate change activist Greta Thunberg to New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern, to South Africa rugby star Siya Kolisi, the first-ever black captain of the side. Harry was inspired by the efforts of Nelson Mandela, and true to the former president's lifelong aspirations, the series of interviews is positioned to offer hope, vision, perspective and understanding... arguably at a time when the world needs it most.

Hopefully Harry himself will find in 2023 ways to reconcile what has been a turbulent and heart-wrenching year for the royals. He and Meghan's latest moves won't have done much to repair relations, but his transparency and clarity over how he feels hard done by may indeed act as a line in the sand, from where a new vista may emerge for the outliers, even if he questions the possibility of that.

"I've had to make peace with the fact that we're probably never going to get genuine accountability or a genuine apology [from my family]," says Harry in the documentary. "My wife and I, we're moving on. We're focused on what's coming next."

Such sentiments have been uttered by many of us regarding our own families, and unequivocally this shows us that when it comes to matters of the heart, the Windsor family, for all their wealth, prestige and glory, really are just like the rest of us. But is this family's broken relationship past the point of repair?

ure, you can save energy by investing in a new boiler, solar panels or roof insulation. If you've got the funds, they'll make a real difference. But these days, most of us don't have the money upfront. And what if you rent your home? Here's our round-up of the best ways to reduce your energy bills - without shivering like crazy or going broke.

CHECK YOUR HEATING

Turn your thermostat down a degree or two and see if the temperature's still okay. Turn down radiators in any room you don't use much. And don't have the heating on when you're out.

If it's not too chilly, put on some warm slippers and a jumper before reaching for the heating switch. If you're reading or watching TV, curl up under a cosy throw.

DON'T LEAVE APPLIANCES ON STANDBY

Don't keep your electrical appliances on standby mode. This goes for TVs, game consoles, laptops, printers, microwaves, electric cookers and phone chargers. And remember, devices with an LED panel, clock or light still use electricity even when they're switched off.

IN THE KITCHEN

Wait till you've got a full load to use your washing machine and run your programme at 30°C. Avoid using your tumble dryer whenever possible – it'll use a lot of electricity even in eco mode.

> Only put on your dishwasher when it's full. And don't overfill the kettle - just boil the amount you need for your tea, coffee or cooking.

IN THE BATHROOM

If you can, take showers rather than baths and limit them to four minutes. You'd be surprised how much less water you'll use. And don't leave taps running - that goes for the kitchen, too.



CHECK THE LIGHTS

Choose energy-efficient LED lightbulbs. They cost a bit more, but they save energy and money in the long run because they use 90 per cent less energy than conventional halogen bulbs. Oh... and don't leave lights switched on when you don't need them.

eigh-on-Sea residents' hard work has paid off as Southend-on-Sea City Council has been shortlisted for the Love Parks Award in Keep Britain Tidy's Network Awards 2023.

The award recognises the work undertaken by the council and volunteers during Keep Britain Tidy's Love Parks Week last summer, including events at Leigh Cliffs, Belton Hills Nature Reserve, Leigh Library Gardens and Two Tree Island Nature Reserve.

Councillor Carole Mulroney, cabinet member for environment, culture and tourism, said: "Our parks and open spaces are tremendously important to residents and visitors, and I am delighted that their

quality is being recognised.

"Our parks department has worked hard to maintain and uplift our parks and deserves credit for its brilliant work, as well as the various groups who volunteer within these great spaces. To be nominated for the Love Parks Award 2023 is a great accolade.

Club celebrates 90th anniversary



eigh-on-Sea's Estuary Club, located on LCanvey Road, recently celebrated its 90th anniversary with a four-course meal.

The special meal took place on December 11. with the committee members toasting to another successful 90 years ahead.

The club was founded by Mr George Holmes and six other advisors back in 1932 on a not-for-profit basis. Not long afterwards, it began the annual Christmas raffle and long-running children's parties, which have become a popular fixture in the local community calendar.

Since then, the club has had an interesting history, from being commandeered for use by air raid wardens during the Second World War, to

more recently having to deal with periods of closure owing to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Nowadays, the club has an incredible membership of around 200 men and women, who often gather together with their families to enjoy the building's snooker room and bar and take part in regular social events such as guiz nights and Sunday lunches.

The club's function room is also used by several other groups in the Leigh community, including the local branch of WeightWatchers, a yoga club, Leigh Lions, the Home Sweet Home over-60s friendship group, the Hoy at Anchor Folk Music Club, and the International German Club.

Police recover car that was stolen three months ago

olice recovered a vehicle last month which had been stolen during a burglary in Leigh-on-Sea in October.

Officers patrolling in Pitsea attempted to stop a Renault Trafic van in the early hours of December 8.

After it failied to stop, the officers were granted permission to follow the vehicle, until it eventually

stopped in Rochford. As stated on Essex Police Southend District's Facebook page by Adam Pipe, of the Operational Policing Command, a number of different tactics were employed during the pursuit, with police acting "decisively, with skill, precision and professionalism" to stop the vehicle.

A man and woman were arrested, taken into custody and questioned. The arrests related to suspicion of multiple offences, including failing to stop, dangerous driving and theft of a vehicle. The man was also arrested on suspicion of possession of class A drugs.

The vehicle has been linked back to a burglary that occurred in Leigh-on-Sea in October, and the owners have been contacted by police.

A post on the Essex Police Southend District Facebook page states: "Thankfully, no injuries were sustained in the incident and the vehicle was brought to a safe stop and two people arrested."

Community gardening group holds final event



BAY Residentsspeak against soil movement plans

Desidents have spoken out against plans to Transport thousands of tonnes of earth and soil through Thorpe Bay and Shoeburyness during the construction of a 214-home development.

Developer Bellway Homes was advised that the site off Barge Pier Road would need to be raised to afford the necessary protection against flooding.

While the original planning application contained information regarding the transportation of soil, residents feel this was not made clear.

A representative of Shoeburyness Residents Association said: "There are cross-party disputes as to why Southend-on-Sea City Council approved an application to transport many thousand tons of soil through Southend using lorries five days a week over the next two and a half years. We are concerned about how this will affect our roads."

A spokesperson for Bellway Homes said: "Bellway is working closely with the local planning authority to find a resolution to its plans and move forward to be able to deliver a sustainable and beneficial development of new homes for residents in Shoebury."

Southend-on-Sea City Council has been contacted for comment.

Plans for 20mph speed limit set to be scrapped

Thorpe Bay residents are celebrating as controversial plans to introduce a 20mph speed limit across much of the area look set to be scrapped.

A consultation regarding a £400,000 traffic-calming scheme offered residents two options, both of which introduced a 20mph limit and only differed with regard to the extent of traffic-calming measures.

A report to Southend-on-Sea City Council's Scrutiny Committee advised that neither option A nor option B be taken forward.

The report cited the consultation which showed 71 per cent of respondents felt speed was not an issue, and 90 per cent didn't feel air quality was an issue.

Councillor Daniel Nelson, vice-chair of the Policy and Resources Scrutiny Committee, said: "This is fantastic news for the residents of Thorpe Bay who I have worked with to stop these proposals. Well done to all involved, democracy at its finest."

taggeringly, between 350,000 and 400,000 British businesses close their doors for good every year. But some companies have been up and running for

BRITISH

The oldest surviving British company is The Royal Mint. It opened in 1279 and, for several hundred years, was based at the Tower of London. In the early 1800s, it moved over the road. But by 1975, it had completed its move to its current home in Llantrisant, Wales. The Mint makes more than 3.3 billion coins and blanks yearly - for the UK and more than 30 other countries.

With the dwindling use of cash, the Mint has expanded into other areas, including precious metals investment, historic coins and luxury collectibles. And it's doing pretty well.

Cambridge University Press, the world's first publishing company, was founded in 1534 and publishes academic and educational texts.

Moving down the years, Royal Mail, as it's now known, was founded in 1586. For almost 500 years, it was owned by the state. But by 2015, it was fully privatised. At one stage in the early 20th century, the company had 22,000 pigeons. And someone's gone to the trouble of counting how many elastic bands it currently uses to bundle mail - apparently 342 million a vear.

Barclays Bank was founded in London in 1690. The institution's long history is contained in an archive of photos, letters and curiosities housed in the Barclays Group Archives in Manchester.

In 1706. Thomas Twining bought a coffee shop in London's Strand and began to sell tea. Back then, tea was very costly. But Twining spotted a

trend. And when he started selling loose tea leaves, as well as cups of the beverage itself, business boomed. By 1717, he'd bought additional space next door - and the shop's still open for business today.

GET THE RIGHT TOOLS

You need to have clean, sharp tools that are designed for pruning, such as secateurs, loppers or a pruning saw if you have a larger pear or apple tree.

Make sure you sharpen them before use.

CUT BACK SUCKERS AND LOWER BRANCHES

Use secateurs to cut back any suckers. These are unwanted shoots that grow near the base of the trunk. Also, cut back lower branches as these do not get sufficient light to bear good fruit.

REMOVE DEAD OR DISEASED WOOD

Remove all branches with discoloured or flaking bark towards the base of the branch by making a cut above an outward-facing bud (one that is on the opposite side of the stem to the main trunk). If there are no buds, remove the entire branch.

CREATE A VASE SHAPE FRAMEWORK

Ideally, you want four or five main branches that help

to create an open vase shape. If you have more than five, remove some at the base by cutting 6mm from the branch collar – this refers to the bulbous area that is attached to the trunk.

Avoid removing more than 25 per cent of the branches in one go as this can affect the tree's health and fruit production.

REMOVE CROSSING OR RUBBING BRANCHES

Remove any branches that are growing into the centre of the tree as this will allow for better air circulation. If two branches are crossing, keep the one that best retains the vase shape of the tree and remove the other one.

SHORTEN THE PREVIOUS YEAR'S GROWTH ON EACH BRANCH BY ONE-THIRD

Cut just above an outward-facing bud on each main branch so that new branches grow outwards. This will help the tree to develop into a healthy shape and prevent congestion.





- Fold your paper in half lengthways so you have a long, slim rectangle.
- 2 Draw a line parallel with the long edge, where the two sides of the paper meet. This line should be about 2.5cm away from
- Starting about 2.5cm in from one of the short edges, draw a series of parallel lines across the rectangle, from the folded edge up to the long line you've just drawn. These lines should be about 2.5cm apart.
- Cut along each of the short lines.
- Erase any noticeable pencil marks, then unfold the paper.

- 6. Run your gluestick along one short side of the lantern. Form the paper into a tube shape, then alue the two short sides together.
- 7. If you like, decorate your lantern or add a ribbon or paper handle.



The incident – in which the brilliant all-rounder was defending a homosexual couple - cost Stokes his place in the 2017/18 Ashes team, and sent the Durham cricketer on a journey of self-discovery that, ultimately, has led him to the heights he finds himself at now.

Stokes roared back from the Bristol incident, inspiring England's 2019 World Cup win, batting sensationally at Headingly in that year's Ashes to win the third Test when all seemed lost, and being named Player of the Series in South Africa that winter.

Last year, Stokes was instrumental in bringing England T20 World Cup glory, yet it is his ascent as Test captain that is truly captivating a nation at the

England clinched an away Test series in Pakistan – a country in which they had only ever won two matches in their entire history – yet it is the manner of the cricket being played that truly reflects a new dawn for the sport.

'Bazball', as it is referred to, is a driven, dynamic and outlandishly positive method of playing the game, the like of which five-day Test cricket has never seen. This cricket revolution epitomises not just Stokes' captaincy, but also his approach to life itself.

As inspirational English sportspeople go, there are few who can rival Stokes' efforts.

Further proof of this was offered when Stokes was named as runner-up in the 2022 BBC Sports Personality of the Year Award. Though he didn't win, his nomination is evidence enough of his incredible success.


