GOOD COP, BAD COP

WHAT DID WE LEARN FROM THE UN CLIMATE CHANGE CONFERENCE?

or a gathering of global minds, each driven and committed to making huge strides forward in the preservation of the Earth and everything that exists on it, there was no shortage of conflict surrounding the United Nations Climate Change Conference in Glasgow, which was held in the first two weeks of November.

A 26th Conference of Parties (hence the COP26 title that most people referenced the event by), the event invited world leaders to commit to enhanced ambitions in terms of mitigating climate change. They arrived in their droves – more than 25,000 delegates from 200 different countries, including 120 heads of state. That meant there was an immediate pointing to the hypocrisy of a convention configured to help the planet, yet whose carbon footprint was one of the largest in history.

Regardless, included in the number of high-profile attendees were US President Joe Biden, German Chancellor Angela Merkel, French President Emmanuel Macron, Canadian Prime Minister Justin Trudeau, and English broadcaster and natural historian Sir David Attenborough.

Those not in attendance courted similar headlines – China's leader Xi Jinping decided not to participate and instead delivered a written address to the conference, while Russian President Vladimir Putin cited COVID-19 concerns as his reason for staying in Moscow.

Air travel aside, the summit was the cleanest in history, with 70 per cent of electricity being supplied from low-carbon nuclear power from plants in Torness and Hunterston B, while the rest mostly came from wind power. All that energy led to some impressive take-outs from COP26:



DECARBONISATION. There was the ubiquitous acceptance that decarbonisation is the way forward, and on that front a variety of targets were accepted and signed up to across the board.



1.5°C, **NOT 2°C**. Recognition of 1.5°C (the temperature at which we must limit global warming) as opposed to 2°C is now a revised and real climate pact target adopted by those at COP26. Scientists believe this altered figure is a far safer limit for potential global temperature increases.



THE ONE-YEAR RATCHET. Previously, a five-year ratchet system was in place, where countries were conditioned to effect positive change across a multilateral system. This has now been transformed into a yearly ratchet. The accelerated pace from making annual adjustments is thought to be a much more realistic way of succeeding in halving global emissions by the year 2030.



NATURAL RESOURCES. As a final take-out from COP26, significant attention has been placed on the preservation of natural resources, including \$20billion in commitments of public and private money for forest protection.

While critics will say these initiatives are tarnished by some of the climb-downs from the conference – including scaled-back ambitions on the phasing out of coal, and various conditions around China's role in climate change not being enforced owing to its leader's non-attendance – there are clear targets and promises in place that offer renewed hope for the planet.

Yet words will only go so far – as swathes of protesters noted as they marched through the streets of Glasgow and across hundreds of other cities around the world: now is the time for action.

What is the 159 service?

When to call 159

- > Someone contacts you saying they are from your

The 159 number will never call you, and only a fraudster will object to you using this service.

Is the 159 number free?

Calls to 159 are charged at the national rate and are usually part of the included minutes in most A new emergency hotline has been launched in phone tariffs. You can call 159 from your phone if your contract is with BT, including EE and PlusNet; Gamma; O2, including Giffgaff; Talk Talk; Three; Virgin Media; and Sky.

Which banks are taking part?

High street banks that are currently taking part in this service include Barclays, Lloyds (including Halifax and Bank of Scotland), NatWest (including Royal Bank of Scotland and Ulster Bank), Santander, and Starling Bank. TSB plans to implement the number from January 2022.

Nationwide isn't participating in the pilot 159 scheme. f your children love to leave a treat for Santa's reindeer, why not have a go at making your own this Christmas?

A fun, festive activity for all ages, the below wildlife-friendly snacks can be created with just a few simple store cupboard staples and some wild bird seed.

REINDEER FOOD MIX: YOU WILL NEED:

- A handful of wild bird seed may include sunflower hearts, yellow millet, kibbled peanuts and black sunflower seeds
- > A few rolled oats
- A sprinkle of dried fruit such as cranberries, raisins, sultanas and currants
- > Small amount of grated cheese
- > Some dried insects (optional)
- A small pinch of chilli powder this will stop the squirrels from eating the mix before Rudolph arrives

HOW TO MAKE:

Simply mix all of the above ingredients together and then sprinkle all over your garden or leave in a small bowl by the front door before you go to bed.

REINDEER COOKIES: YOU WILL NEED:

- > 250g lard, suet or vegetable shortening
- > 500g wild bird seed mix
- > A handful of dried cranberries
- > Christmas-shaped cookie cutters

HOW TO MAKE:

- > Melt the lard or suet in a saucepan over a low heat do not boil. Make sure to supervise children to avoid injury
- Stir in the wild bird seeds, making sure the mixture sticks together
- > Leave to one side for 10 minutes to start to set
- > While still soft, spoon the mixture into a baking tray
- > Spread evenly, at least 2cm deep
- > Place in the fridge to cool for 30 minutes
- > Remove mix from the tray and place on greaseproof paper
- > Use your cookie cutters to cut out your shapes
- > Leave them to chill in the fridge overnight
- > Place them on your bird table or hang in a tree.

What NOT to put out for Rudolph

- > Anything with sparkles/sequins or that contains plastic
- > Cake sprinkles or edible glitter.



From choosing your colour palette to considering your centrepiece, check out our guide to tablescaping below, complete with our top festiveinspired suggestions.

CHOOSE YOUR COLOUR PALETTE

The first and arguably most crucial step of tablescaping is choosing a colour palette. This will form the foundation of your table and enable you to bring your chosen theme together. As a general rule, two colours is preferable, and you should avoid any colour clashes.

Christmas colours: Red and green, red and gold, or silver and gold.

PICK THE ESSENTIALS

When setting your table, you must not forget all the essential items such as a tablecloth, plates and glassware. While white plates will always look classic, they are not suited to every table theme. Consider black plates for an ultra-modern look, or

floral plates for a vintage vibe.

Christmas essentials: Gold-trimmed plates, a moss table runner and festive napkin rings.

CONSIDER YOUR CENTREPIECE

Every showstopping table needs a centrepiece which will act as the focal point of the entire design. Depending on the time of year, flowers are a great choice, as are an assortment of different sized

Christmas centrepieces: Pine cones and candles of various heights, mini potted Christmas trees, or a snow-filled glass vase complete with silver baubles.

REMEMBER THE SMALL TOUCHES

To create an unforgettable table, you need to add all the little details such as name cards, matching placemats and decorative ornaments. Remember that these all need to match your theme and colour scheme, or your setting may appear overcomplicated and chaotic.

Christmas decorative details: Pine wood card holders, stocking silverware holders, or sprigs of holly and mistletoe.

you always forgetting family commitments? Let us introduce you to the DIY family planner that promises to transform your life from chaotic to calm in a matter of minutes.

All you need is a few supplies and a door - this could be in a kitchen cupboard or even the whole side of a door.

WHAT YOU NEED:

Chalkboard paint | A paintbrush | Sandpaper | Old guttering and gutter clips (for shelf) Old copper pipe and pipe clips (for rail) | Handsaw | Electric drill or screwdriver | Hot glue gun | Spray paint colour of your choice | A bulldog clip | Paper roll

HOW TO MAKE:

Step 1: Prepare the space - If using a cupboard door, remove it from its frame using a screwdriver or electric drill

Step 2: Sand the wood - Sand the door down before you paint it as this will ensure a smoother surface. Wipe down with a wet cloth to remove anv dust.

Step 3: Paint the door - Apply 2-3 coats of chalkboard paint, making sure you leave the door to dry in between each coat.

Step 4: Create a shelf - Measure the width of the door and subtract a few centimetres from each side. Cut the guttering to this size and sand down any rough edges.

Step 5: Spray paint the shelf – Spray paint your guttering in your preferred colour. Apply fine coats gradually to avoid drips.

Step 6: Attach the shelf to the bottom of the door - Screw the gutter clips to your chosen position on the door and place the guttering inside the clips.

Step 7: Make a hanging rail - Cut the copper piping to the same width as your shelf. Screw the pipe clips to the door at least 30cm above the gutter shelf and attach your rail. Add your paper roll.

Step 8: Add a bulldog clip - Attach a bulldog clip to the door using a hot glue gun. This will hold the end of your paper roll in place.

Step 9: Draw your planner - Use a whiteboard pen to draw a grid at the top of the door and then add each week's activities/appointments with chalk.



Apply a dab of toothpaste to any stubborn tea and coffee stains and then wash as usual. Hey presto! No more stains.



Refurbishment project on 701-year-old church begins

Work has started on the interior refurbishment of a 701-year-old Rayleigh church.

Rayleigh's Holy Trinity Parish Church refurbishment project is designed to make the church building more welcoming by improving and updating the heating, lighting and accessibility.

After the tower and windows were restored in 2011. the interior is now due for an update.

The building has been loved and cared for by many generations, and the current church members wish to play their part in securing it for generations to come.

To be more energy efficient, the heating, lighting and electrical systems will all be completely replaced. The new lighting will provide improved reading light while also adding to the building's aesthetic appeal.

The walls will be cleaned and repainted with limewash, as is correct for this historic building. The east end of the church will be opened to allow more natural light and will be enhanced with new stone flooring and an accessibility ramp.

Tributes are paid after county councillor dies

Tributes have been paid to a Rayleigh councillor who sadly passed away.

Councillor Craig Cannell, a local Liberal Democrat, passed away suddenly on November 14, aged 32.

Born in Beverley, raised in Boston and educated in Sheffield, Craig moved to Essex in 2014 to start his career. He was drawn to Ravleigh because of its historic buildings, green spaces and community feel; traits he also enjoyed when living in Lincolnshire.

Craig was elected to Rochford District Council (RDC) in 2018 to represent residents of Downhall and Rawreth. In May 2021, the community also elected Craig as their Rayleigh county and town councillor.

Jonathan Stephenson, chief executive of RDC, said: "All our thoughts and prayers are with Craig's family at this very difficult time."

RDC held a tribute to Craig during a meeting on December 7.



his teeth fighting in Newham North West in 1979. I did much the same when I fought 'Red Ken' Livingstone in Brent East in 1997.

During a hustings at Willesden Green Library, Livingstone said something I have never forgotten: "As an MP, a General Election is an opportunity to commune with your 67,000 employers."

the original Essex 'cheeky chappie'. In short, Sir David Amess MP had more front than Brighton.

Before he was so cruelly taken from us. he broke the world record for the most centenarians at one lunch, in Southend, just a few years ago. He recorded an album with Banarama, and even 'went platinum'. He promoted too many charities to mention, assisted tens of thousands of constituents with their problems, and undertook literally thousands of constituency engagements over four decades of dedicated public service.

Despite this awful tragedy, we are going to 'keep calm and carry on', because I earnestly believe that is exactly what he would have wanted us

And so, we say farewell to Sir David Amess MP, a wonderful husband and father, a fine parliamentarian and an absolutely brilliant constituency MP.

Driver behaviour monitored sa

ssex County Council's (ECC) scheme to monitor Edrivers' behaviour at school crossings is being extended to a site in Rayleigh.

The new four-week trial started on November 15 and is running in London Road, Rayleigh, and near Longwood Primary in Paringdon Road, Harlow.

It follows a previous trial in October, when ECC issued body cameras to school crossing staff in Cloes Lane, Clacton, and Whitmore Way, Basildon.

School crossing patrol officers at the new sites will wear body cameras while they help children cross the road, with the scheme aiming to reduce abuse towards officers and improve safety.

Information from both trials will help judge the success of the body cameras. Once the trials have been evaluated, a decision on the future implementation of cameras will be made.

Councillor Tony Ball, ECC cabinet member for education excellence, lifelong learning and employability, said: "We want to make sure we have as much information available to us as possible before evaluating the trial, which is why we're rolling this out to other parts of Essex.

"Once this second trial period is complete, we'll be able to make an informed decision on whether the use of body cameras is necessary at school crossing patrol sites going forward."

The law says drivers must stop when a school crossing patrol officer holds a stop sign upright.

Drivers who do not stop at a school crossing patrol can be given a fine of up to £1,000 and three points on their driving licence.

Four jailed for armed burglary of cannabis factory

AWickford man has been jailed, together with three others, for attempting to rob a cannabis factory in Forest Gate.

Kris Tiller, 39, (pictured inset on far left), of Meadow Lane, Wickford; Edward Nadif, 33, of Victoria Dock Road, E16; Dominic Fowls, 27, of Southend Road, Maldon; and Daren Cohen, 33, of Vignoles Road, Romford, all pleaded guilty to aggravated burglary.

Nadif also admitted an offence of possession of an imitation firearm.

On Thursday, November 11, at Snaresbrook Crown Court, all four men were handed prison sentences – Tiller seven years, Nadif nine years, Fowls six-and-a-half years, and Cohen seven-and-a-half years.

An investigation was launched after police were called to a residential address in Reginald Road, E7, in the early hours of January 14, 2020, following reports of a disturbance.

Officers attended and Nadif was arrested inside the address. A search of the area was carried out and Fowls, Cohen and Tiller were detained.

All four had forced entry into the address and Nadif had threatened the sole occupant with an imitation firearm before they began stealing the cannabis plants. However, they were disrupted by officers who had rushed to the scene.

Detective Sergeant Keith Faris, of the Northeast Area Burglary and Robbery Team, said: "Following a painstaking and diligent investigation which compiled a weight of evidence, all four men were left with no option but to plead guilty to their crimes.

"Criminality, in particular that which involves drugs, brings misery to our communities and I would ask anyone with information about such offending to come and speak to police. We will listen to you and act accordingly to ensure those responsible face justice."

Family upset over 'rough sex defence' sentence

The family of a murdered backpacker from Wickford has expressed anger and frustration following a similar case earlier this year.

Grace Millane, 22, (pictured) of Wickford, was strangled to death by Jesse Kempson during sex in 2018. He claimed she had asked to be strangled.

Her family has since been campaigning for the 'rough sex defence' to be banned, and they have spoken of their disappointment following a similar incident.

Earlier this year, Sophie Moss, 33, died after Sam Pybus, 32, (pictured inset) applied prolonged pressure to her neck. He told police that Sophie would ecourage him to strangle her during sex.

Pybus admitted her manslaughter and was jailed for four years and eight months in September.

His sentence was reviewed at the Court of Appeal on November 12, after the Attorney General agreed that the sentence may be unduly lenient.

The court rejected the appeal and decided Pybus's sentence should not be increased.

The family of Grace Millane said: "We are so disappointed that despite the changes to the law, the sentencing doesn't reflect that a life has been taken.

"Sophie Moss did not consent to her own murder. Our thoughts are with her family; they deserve justice."

The organisation, We Can't Consent To This (WCCTT), has also emphasised the need for change.

Fiona Mackenzie, from WCCTT, said: "We were horrified to see the court accept Pybus's claim that Sophie had consented and was a willing participant."

Investigation after man injured in collison

Police are investigating after a man was taken to hospital with serious injuries after a collision in Wickford.

Police were called by colleagues in the ambulance service to a collision between a car and a pedestrian on the High Street, which took place at 9.45am on Thursday. November 18.

Officers arrived and found that a man aged in his 80s had sustained head injuries.

He was taken to hospital for treatment and is now expected to make a full recovery.

An 86-year-old man from Wickford has been released under investigation.

Anyone who witnessed the incident or has dashcam or CCTV footage should get in touch with police as soon as possible by calling 101 and citing incident 272 of November 18.

ARTIFICIAL EYES, BIONIC VISION AND OCULAR PROSTHETICS THAT ARE REVOLUTIONISING HOW WE SEE THE WORLD

or people who suffer trauma or serious eye disease, the reality of losing an eye or significant sight can be a harrowing one. In the past, the solution of replacement with a glass eye was the only way of restoring some level of aesthetic appearance.

In 2021, those aesthetics have moved forward significantly. The prosthetic implants involved in eye surgery are at the very peak of artificial eye technology, with a completely natural look and the ability for the patient to resume normal activities, such as driving, swimming and other forms of exercise. They can also apply make-up and mascara to the area without damaging the prosthetic.

Of course, the next level of eye technology is the bionic eye. When science can replace so many other parts of the body, are we really so far away from replacing artificial eyes with fully working machines that restore sight, or even offer it to people who,

from birth, have never been able to see?

Scientists in America are currently working on the bionic eye, although the technology is still in its infancy. It uses a retinal implant to mimic the function of the retina. When connected to a video camera, it converts images into electrical impulses. These, in turn, stimulate existing retinal cells which carry the signal back to the brain for processing.

At present, the bionic eye would produce sight as basic shapes and depth, and in black and white. It would be possible to read a book, though with only 60 electrodes - a fully working eye has a million the quality of vision is limited.

The good news is this is only the start. Just as the technology behind cochlear implants accelerated quickly to give sound to those who thought their hearing was lost forever, so too may there be a light at the end of the tunnel for those who yearn to be able to see.

ew laws are set to come into force from next year to crack down on mobile phone usage while behind the wheel, with 81 per cent of people supporting the tightening of driving rules in the UK.

HOW MANY ACCIDENTS ARE CAUSED BY DRIVERS USING MOBILE PHONES?

According to the Department for Transport, 17 people were killed on the road last year in crashes that involved drivers being distracted by their mobile phones. A further 114 were seriously injured and 385 were slightly injured. More than one in six of those killed or seriously injured were either pedestrians or cyclists.

HOW IS THE LAW CHANGING?

Under current UK laws, drivers are banned from making a phone call or texting using a handheld device, unless there is an emergency. However, from 2022, drivers will also not be

from 2022, drivers will also not be allowed to take photos or videos, scroll through music playlists, or play games on their phones when driving. This includes

when stationary in motorway jams and at traffic lights.

WHAT WILL HAPPEN IF YOU ARE CAUGHT BREAKING THESE NEW LAWS?

Anyone caught using their handheld device while driving will face a £200 fixed penalty notice and six points on their licence.

ARE THERE ANY EXCEPTIONS TO MOBILE PHONE USAGE WHILE DRIVING?

Drivers can still use devices such as sat navs and mobile phones using satellite navigation, but these must be secured in a cradle. They can also make contactless payments using their mobile phones when stationary.

WHEN DO THESE LAWS COME INTO EFFECT?

These new laws will start to be implemented from next year, with the government planning to revise the Highway Code to clearly explain the new

PEARL HARBOR remembered

LOOKING BACK TO THE BATTLE AT PEARL HARBOR, 80 YEARS AGO IN DECEMBER

earl City in 2021 is a pleasant enough place. It is clean, sunny, and remains very proud of its reputation as both an early site for Benjamin Franklin's railway network and a jazz hotbed in late 19th-century Hawaii.

Yet such a peaceful reputation is at odds with events in its harbour, when it came under the attack of one of the most vicious airborne onslaughts in military history.

The Japanese attack on Pearl Harbor was actually a pre-emptive move designed to limit the US army's ability to defend other areas, which were earmarked in phase two for later that day. Essentially, by ripping apart the US Pacific Fleet, it would be unable to stem the tide of attacks on British, Dutch and US territories in southeast Asia.

The Japanese began the assault on December 7, 1941. They rained down bombs on hangars and aircraft around the island, while launching torpedoes at US airships in Pearl Harbor.

Four battleships were hit immediately, with the USS *Arizona* sinking after a bomb hit its explosives stores. A total of 1,177 crew members perished.

The Japanese retreated, though as US troops began to survey the damage and regroup, a second barrage was on its way. Around 90 minutes later, 170 aircraft entered

the area, again firing a devastating

array of artillery on the harbour.

By the end of the second wave, 18 US warships had been sunk or damaged, while almost 200 aircraft were destroyed.

The total number of casualties was 2,403 – all American servicemen or women.

While the attack on Pearl Harbor was monstrous and clinical, crucially the Pacific Fleet's aircraft carriers were not in the area at the time. The fact that these survived became pivotal in the Pacific War that followed, as the US made major moves in restoring balance. Eventually, they helped to tip the scales back towards the Allies and, ultimately, victory, four years later.



n her riveting new documentary, *Lioness: The Nicola Adams Story*, it's revealed that the boxing champion was both a fighter and a survivor long before she ever stepped foot in the ring.

The 2012 Summer Olympics were remarkable in so many ways for the UK, as host city London became the global epicentre for sporting greatness. Medals were won, young athletes were discovered and legends were forged in the eternal flames of the Olympic torch. But of all the many moments of glory, 29-year-old Leeds native, Nicola Adams, becoming the first female boxer ever to win a gold medal is surely one of the most memorable.

Since her triumphant debut as an Olympian almost a decade ago, the charismatic firebrand has cemented her status as a national treasure. After winning a second gold at the Rio 2016 games, Adams turned professional, where she held the World Boxing Organisation female flyweight title two years in a row and retired undefeated.

Then, in 2020, the LGBT icon made history once years on, became an inspiration to others.

more by starring on the 18th series of *Strictly Come Dancing* as part of the show's first same-sex couple, alongside professional Katya Jones. Sadly, Adams's dancing dreams were cut short when she tested positive for COVID-19.

Yet despite her acclaim, very little has been known about Adams's journey before that momentous day in 2012, until now...

Named after Nicola's nickname in the ring, 'Lioness', the Amazon Prime Video documentary – which is available to watch now – not only features exclusive early footage of her career, but also paints a tragic portrait of her childhood, including a violent father and her mother's struggle as a single parent.

It becomes evident that the boxing ring was a refuge for the young athlete, and though she may have faced many challenges since – misogyny, racism and homophobia all feature in her quest for greatness – it was there in that Leeds boxing club where Nicola Adams found her true self, and several years on, became an inspiration to others.
