

SPARE?

AMID THE RELEASE OF HARRY AND MEGHAN'S TRIO OF PROJECTS, WE LOOK AT HOW THE 'SPARE' AND HIS WIFE HAVE BEGUN TO TELL THEIR TRUTH

Since their unexpected flight from both British shores and the working Royal Family in January 2020, Prince Harry and his wife Meghan have caused quite the stir, constructing a new narrative that neither they nor the Royal Family can be certain of recovering from.

First came a biography of the pair, *Finding Freedom*, written by close confidante Omid Scobie, which hinted at unease within the royal ranks. Then, in March 2021, their shock interview with TV talk show maven Oprah Winfrey aired to global comment on both sides of the Atlantic.

Since then, things have been reasonably quiet and calm as the Sussexes have settled into their Los Angeles lifestyle and adjusted to family life with their two children, Archie, aged three, and 18-monthold Lilibet. However, as several multimillion-dollar deals reach their point of fruition, our red-headed prince and his raven-maned wife are once again back in the spotlight.

Last month, their six-part Netflix documentary *Harry & Meghan* was released, which saw the Duke and Duchess of Sussex attempt to tell their side of the story. Capturing the couple from their earliest days together right up to the period after Prince Philip's death, the series has certainly split opinion. While some find it to be insightful and informative, others believe it to be shocking and villainous. Or in some cases, opinions have flipped completely, and those who might not have supported them before have now gone to the other side and have begun to empathise with the pair.

To add to any nerves the Royal Family may have already been experiencing, Harry's book, *Spare*, was released this month. The title alone conveys the Duke's deep disconnection from his own family, one that doesn't appear as if it will be healed anytime soon.


All things come in threes, and Netflix has announced it is also behind the couple's other new project, entitled *Live to Lead*. It showcases inspirational figures – from climate change activist Greta Thunberg to New Zealand Prime Minister Jacinda Ardern, to South Africa rugby star Siya Kolisi, the first-ever black captain of the side. Harry was inspired by the efforts of Nelson Mandela, and true to the former president's lifelong aspirations, the series of interviews is positioned to offer hope, vision, perspective and understanding... arguably at a time when the world needs it most.

Hopefully Harry himself will find in 2023 ways to reconcile what has been a turbulent and heart-wrenching year for the royals. He and Meghan's latest moves won't have done much to repair relations, but his transparency and clarity over how he feels hard done by may indeed act as a line in the sand, from where a new vista may emerge for the outliers, even if he questions the possibility of that.

"I've had to make peace with the fact that we're probably never going to get genuine accountability or a genuine apology [from my family]," says Harry in the documentary. "My wife and I, we're moving on. We're focused on what's coming next."

Such sentiments have been uttered by many of us regarding our own families, and unequivocally this shows us that when it comes to matters of the heart, the Windsor family, for all their wealth, prestige and glory, really are just like the rest of us. But is this family's broken relationship past the point of repair?

THE STORY BEHIND BRITAIN'S ICONIC VACUUM CLEANER

le's not the most aesthetically pleasing member of the household cleaning family, nor the most powerful, and as far as cutting-edge technology goes, he pre-dates even the era of the mobile phone and internet connectivity.

Yet despite all of that, our love affair for Henry lives on, more than 40 years since the compact and affordable vacuum cleaner was launched by Numatic International.

Its founder, Chris Duncan, first started toying with his vacuum cleaner concept back in 1969, when he dressed up one of his standard vacuum cleaners with a Union Jack, hat and smiley face during a particularly long night at a trade show.

The response from visitors was a revelation for the inventor, who discovered that taking an inanimate object and giving it a personality enchanted people who were looking for something different from the standard cleaning devices.

It has also led to spinoff designs, notably the Henry and Hetty Spray Mops.

In 2023, it is the only massproduced consumer vacuum cleaner still made in Britain. and has made its founder a millionaire many times over.



ure, you can save energy by investing in a new boiler, solar panels or roof insulation. If you've got the funds, they'll make a real difference. But these days, most of us don't have the money upfront. And what if you rent your home? Here's our round-up of the best ways to reduce your energy bills - without shivering like crazy or going broke.

CHECK YOUR HEATING

Turn your thermostat down a degree or two and see if the temperature's still okay. Turn down radiators in any room you don't use much. And don't have the heating on when you're out.

If it's not too chilly, put on some warm slippers and a jumper before reaching for the heating switch. If you're reading or watching TV, curl up under a cosy throw.

DON'T LEAVE APPLIANCES ON STANDBY

Don't keep your electrical appliances on standby mode. This goes for TVs, game consoles, laptops, printers, microwaves, electric cookers and phone chargers. And remember, devices with an LED panel, clock or light still use electricity even when they're switched off.

IN THE KITCHEN

Wait till you've got a full load to use your washing machine and run your programme at 30°C. Avoid using your tumble dryer whenever possible – it'll use a lot of electricity even in eco mode.

> Only put on your dishwasher when it's full. And don't overfill the kettle - just boil the amount you need for your tea, coffee or cooking.

IN THE BATHROOM

If you can, take showers rather than baths and limit them to four minutes. You'd be surprised how much less water you'll use. And don't leave taps running - that goes for the kitchen, too.

CHECK THE LIGHTS



Choose energy-efficient LED lightbulbs. They cost a bit more, but they save energy and money in the long run because they use 90 per cent less energy than conventional halogen bulbs. Oh... and don't leave lights switched on when you don't need them.

Manjailed for 32 years following sexual abuse

AClacton man convicted of sexually abusing three children between 2011 and 2014 has been jailed for 32 years for 18 separate offences.

Graham Carson, 68 (pictured left) of The Drive, Clacton, denied the offences, including multiple counts of rape, but was convicted on September 30 following a trial at Chelmsford Crown Court.

He was sentenced at the same court on Thursday, December 8, to 26 years in prison with a six-year extension as he was deemed by the judge to be a "dangerous offender".

The offences came to light in August 2020 after they were reported to Essex Police. Carson had said to one of his victims "wish you were 16", while telling another it would be "their secret". The victims have

been supported by specialist officers.

Investigating officer Detective Constable Reuben Brame said: "The three victims in this case have been through an unimaginable ordeal at the hands of Graham Carson and have demonstrated incredible strength in reporting what happened to them.

"The impact of Carson's abuse cannot be overstated and those affected live with the memory of what's happened to them every day.

"I am pleased our work has been able to put him behind bars and, while no sentence will ever undo his crimes, I hope it will help his victims move forward."

Sergeant Bailey added: "Visits like this are so important in building positive relationships with younger members of our community. It's crucial that they know we are here to keep them safe and help them when they need us."

Miss Woods, Lawford Primary School foundation stage teacher, said: "The dog unit was incredible with the children. It was an interactive visit, and the children haven't stopped talking about Dexter and Oreo. They were fascinated by watching them at work."

Government's £1million investment plan approved

The government has signed off on spending plans for more than £1million in Tendring as part of its levelling-up agenda.

Tendring District Council (TDC) has received £1.18million from the government through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund, spread across the rest of the current financial year and the next two years.

The current allocation must be committed by the end of March; as such, the initial focus will be on council-led projects.

This includes the Starlings redevelopment project in Dovercourt, funding to support the Javwick Sands

commercial workspace scheme, and small grants to increase participation in sport and leisure.

In addition, funds will be provided to the University of Essex to carry out a feasibility study for a green skills and innovation centre in the district linked to Freeport East.

Councillor Neil Stock OBE, Leader of TDC, said that the funding agreement had now been signed and returned.

He said: "This funding will undoubtedly have a positive impact on Tendring. The allocation will not only directly support some exciting projects which will support economic growth and wellbeing in our district, but also I hope unlock other funding streams and leverage even more investment in Tendring."



I have received positive feedback from constituents regarding the Energy Bills Support Scheme. This has been a lifeline to households to help them heat their homes, and I know this has saved lives.

It is such a shame that, after a damaging global pandemic, we are then faced with a terrible and unnecessary war started by an expansionist despot. The government is stepping up to the plate to help where it can, both here and overseas.

But to more local matters... While I have not been in Parliament owing to the Christmas break, it doesn't mean the work has stopped. I held a surgery just before Christmas and I was out in Point Clear speaking to residents about the things that matter to them.

As we look to the new year, I am reinvigorated to champion Clacton's causes: faster and more reliable trains to London; devolved powers to the local authority over our coastline: more dentists to reduce the backlog; and ensuring we are not left behind in the levelling-up agenda.

Trees planted for anniversary

At the time of writing, we are ending a year of extraordinary international turbulence. It is chilling to keep remembering the fact there is state-on-state warfare in our own continent of Europe and we have seen scenes of devastation of modern cities and queues of refugees waiting for trains - images we thought would remain in history.

Putin's war is not just on Ukraine, but on the whole international order of law and security which has underpinned our own national safety and prosperity since the Second World War. The energy crisis and the inflation that grips European economies is not merely a consequence of Putin's war; it is Putin's war using energy, economics, cyber attacks, direct sabotage of critical national infrastructure, the destabilisation of democratic states, and the flows of refugees, all as weapons to undermine our security and prosperity.

At the same time, the cost-of-living crisis and inflation is driving down living standards so that even in an affluent country like our own, millions more people are finding it harder to make ends meet. It's important to remember not only those least fortunate, but also those who give up their own time and resources to care for them, and we give thanks for their generosity of spirit.

As we begin 2023, so many challenges together seem daunting, but for more than 1,000 years, our nation has always recovered from adversity, learned from mistakes and emerged stronger, as a beacon of freedom, democracy and security which many other nations around the world so admire. Let us, then, approach the new year resolute and confident that whatever events afflict us, our nation will find its inner strength and meet whatever challenges we face.

Residents find migrant boats

esidents of Walton and Frinton came upon two small boats that had been used by migrants to cross the English Channel illegally, while walking along the Essex beaches.

Stuart Keen, a resident of Walton-on-the-Naze, said that while walking his dog, he spotted the boat in the distance.

He said: "After realising nobody was inside, my first reaction was to take pictures. I wondered what had happened to the occupants, then immediately phoned the police."

The boat had already been marked by the Ministry of Defence (MoD), which marks boats to identify that they are aware of them, but their priority is to get the occupants to safety.

The same day, a Frinton resident posted on Facebook about finding a different boat that had washed up on the beach, also marked by the MoD, while walking their dog.

The boats are just two of the 23 boats detected between December 9 and December 14, with those boats holding more than 1,000

Four individuals were confirmed to have died after a boat capsized on December 14.

Responding to the incident, a government spokesperson said: "This is a truly tragic incident. Our thoughts are with the friends and families of all those who have lost their lives today."

More than 45,700 migrants crossed the English Channel by small boats in 2022, a 60 per cent increase from 2021.



n January 12, it's Kiss A Ginger Day the perfect time to show redheads some love. But you might need to take a good look around – because red hair is rare. Only two in every 100 people are natural redheads, making it the rarest hair colour in the world. And the rarest people of all are redheads with blue eyes.

The genes responsible for red hair are recessive. This means that to have a red-haired baby, both parents must carry a red-haired gene. If both parents carry the gene but don't have red hair themselves, they'll have around a one in four chance of having a red-haired baby. If one of

the parents is a redhead and the other is a carrier of the gene but doesn't have red hair, the chances go up to around one in two. And if both parents have ginger locks, chances are that all their children will have red hair too.

Hundreds of years ago, redheads were thought

to be witches and were shunned by society. These days, things have thankfully improved although some people still think natural gingers are brash and hot-headed. That's not true, of course. But recent studies have shown that redheads require more anaesthetic than people with other hair colours. Their response to painkillers is also different – for the medication to work, they need more of some types of painkillers and less of others.

So how are you going to celebrate on January 12? If you've got a natural ginger among your family and friends, show them how much you appreciate their extraordinary tresses. And if you're not that lucky, listen to some music by redheads - Ed Sheeran or Florence and the Machine, anyone? Or how about a film starring Julianne Moore or Jessica Chastain? The choice is yours.

FIVE AGE-OLD BRITISH COMPANIES STILL WITH US TODAY

BRITISH

The oldest surviving British company is The Royal Mint. It opened in 1279 and, for several hundred years, was based at the Tower of London. In the early 1800s, it moved over the road. But by 1975, it had completed its move to its current home in Llantrisant, Wales. The Mint makes more than 3.3 billion coins and blanks yearly - for the UK and more than 30 other countries.

With the dwindling use of cash, the Mint has expanded into other areas, including precious metals investment, historic coins and luxury collectibles. And it's doing pretty well.

Cambridge University Press, the world's first publishing company, was founded in 1534 and publishes academic and educational texts.

Moving down the years, Royal Mail, as it's now known, was founded in 1586. For almost 500 years, it was owned by the state. But by 2015, it was fully privatised. At one stage in the early 20th century, the company had 22,000 pigeons. And someone's gone to the trouble of counting how many elastic bands it currently uses to bundle mail - apparently 342 million a year.

Barclays Bank was founded in London in 1690. The institution's long history is contained in an archive of photos, letters and curiosities housed in the Barclays Group Archives in Manchester.

In 1706, Thomas Twining bought a coffee shop in London's Strand and began to sell tea. Back then, tea was very costly. But Twining spotted a

trend. And when he started selling loose tea leaves, as well as cups of the beverage itself, business boomed. By 1717, he'd bought additional space next door - and the shop's still open for business today.



HOW TO GET THE BEST OUT OF YOUR GARDEN IN THE COLD WINTER MONTHS

ome of us may regard winter as the season when our desire to venture out into the garden wanes completely. Yet whether we're negotiating a path across a frosty lawn, or simply viewing nature from the warmth and comfort of the indoors, making your garden into a winter wonderland is a rewarding task.

So while you may not have the summer sorcery of flower sprays, sun loungers and an abundance of fruit and produce, these tips will help keep your outside space special even in the depths of winter.

STRUCTURAL STATEMENTS

A winter garden is one that's lighter on detail, so create new space and interest with some cool man-made structures. From trellises to metalwork, benches to rockeries, winter provides a great opportunity for man-made materials to enter the fray.

CALL FOR COLOUR

The assumption that the colour drains out of our gardens in winter is, ultimately, wrong. There are many stem-like winter plants that are radiant and

beautiful – consider the pinky purple of dogwood, evergreen rhododendrons and the shining white trunks of a birch tree.

TAKE FORWARD TRADITION

Planting a number of hardy winter varieties will give your garden presence as well as helping to carry forward the legacy of a traditional English garden. Use hellebores and snowdrops to create a classic, elegant effect.

TREMENDOUS TREES

Stripped of their summer decoration, let skeletal trees stand out against a snowy backdrop. Mixed up with evergreens, you can create a brilliant contrast.

FANTASTIC FEASTS

Finally, don't assume your winter garden can't put produce on the table. Carrots and fava beans will still thrive throughout the winter, and you can extend the growing period of a number of other varieties of fruit and veg if you keep your greenhouse operational throughout the cold months.

f you want to enjoy a good fruit cycle, you need to prune your apple and pear trees over the winter. For those who are new to fruit pruning, this step-by-step guide tells you all you need to know.

GET THE RIGHT TOOLS

You need to have clean, sharp tools that are designed for pruning, such as secateurs, loppers or a pruning saw if you have a larger pear or apple tree. Make sure you sharpen them before use.

CUT BACK SUCKERS AND LOWER BRANCHES

Use secateurs to cut back any suckers. These are unwanted shoots that grow near the base of the trunk. Also, cut back lower branches as these do not get sufficient light to bear good fruit.

REMOVE DEAD OR DISEASED WOOD

Remove all branches with discoloured or flaking bark towards the base of the branch by making a cut above an outward-facing bud (one that is on the opposite side of the stem to the main trunk). If there are no buds, remove the entire branch.

CREATE A VASE SHAPE FRAMEWORK

Ideally, you want four or five main branches that help

to create an open vase shape. If you have more than five, remove some at the base by cutting 6mm from the branch collar – this refers to the bulbous area that is attached to the trunk.

Avoid removing more than 25 per cent of the branches in one go as this can affect the tree's health and fruit production.

REMOVE CROSSING OR RUBBING BRANCHES

Remove any branches that are growing into the centre of the tree as this will allow for better air circulation. If two branches are crossing, keep the one that best retains the vase shape of the tree and remove the other one.

SHORTEN THE PREVIOUS YEAR'S GROWTH ON EACH BRANCH BY ONE-THIRD

Cut just above an outward-facing bud on each main branch so that new branches grow outwards. This will help the tree to develop into a healthy shape and prevent congestion.

Incorporate a pomade with a shine finish, gel or wax into your styling routine to give your hair a neater, more polished appearance.



- A ruler, pencil and eraser
- A glue stick
- Extra decorations such as stick on shapes. sequins, braid or ribbon (optional)

- Fold your paper in half lengthways so you have a long, slim rectangle.
- 2 Draw a line parallel with the long edge, where the two sides of the paper meet. This line should be about 2.5cm away from
- Starting about 2.5cm in from one of the short edges, draw a series of parallel lines across the rectangle, from the folded edge up to the long line you've just drawn. These lines should be about 2.5cm apart.
- Cut along each of the short lines.
- Erase any noticeable pencil marks, then unfold the paper.

- 6. Run your gluestick along one short side of the lantern. Form the paper into a tube shape, then alue the two short sides together.
- 7. If you like, decorate your lantern or add a ribbon or paper handle.


