



A dalliance with design that has lasted 50 years

icky Haslam has assumed many guises throughout his life - designer, show horse breeder, global socialite, friend to the stars. The inspirational designer even waited until his 73rd birthday to release his debut album, finally indulging one of his boyhood daydreams with the assistance of industry heavyweights such as Nick Mason (Pink Floyd), Helena Bonham Carter, Bryan Ferry and the late Cilla Black.

But it is clearly for his immaculate take on style and fashion that we have become most absorbed in Nicky Haslam's work. The Buckinghamshire-born icon has been the creative auteur and driving force behind London institution NH Design, and while he admits his workload has reduced in recent years as he fights against the idea of retirement, his hunger for interiors has never abated.

"We're slaving away on a wonderful house and a wonderful restaurant in New Orleans, a big project in New York, a place in the south of France outside St Tropez, plus some wonderful penthouses in Park Lane, with 360-degree views of London. We're busy."

The designer, who has written for *The Telegraph*, *Vogue* and *Tatler*, and has properties scattered across London, believes the key to good interiors is detail and control. He fills space with objects, blends styles without fear and constructs a 'lived-in' vibe that is brave yet relaxed.

"People are still looking at image and opulence, but these days there is much more attention being paid to comfort and possessions, probably because we are working so hard and we just want to be settled in our own spaces.

"Minimalism is old hat as far as I am concerned. Just surround yourself in what feels right. Don't splash colour around or re-wallpaper because everyone else is doing it; instead, be inspired by things in your locale – reflection is important – and want to learn. Even having practised design for decades, I am still picking up new ideas."

Parents protest against children's centre closure

↑ ngry parents took to the streets of Woodbridge Alast month to protest against county council plans to close a children's centre in the town.

The Caterpillar Children's Centre on Cumberland Street is one of 13 children's centres which could be transformed into a nursery by Suffolk County Council

A council report said the entre on is a building "where evidence and feedback suggests there is not a particularly high volume of service demand by vulnerable families, and where related services are already available from a number of other locations which are within a short walking distance."

Opposition to the proposal has been growing for some time and locals paraded through the town to show the strength of opposition to the scheme.

Jack Abbott is Labour's education spokesman at SCC and took part in the protest.

He said: "We are not going to allow the Conservatives to cut even more children's centres without a fight. These centres are a lifeline for many families, so we will stand alongside parents and their children, doing everything we can to prevent this disaster.

"The response to our Woodbridge march was overwhelmingly positive, underlining just how important children's centres are to so many people. With organisations like the British Association of Social Workers also warning about the devastating impact that these cuts would have on families, it is clear that these damaging proposals need to be dropped."

Woodpeckers bounce back following setbacks



After three league defeats in succession, Woodbridge Town FC returned to winning ways recently.

Defeats against Stowmarket Town, Wroxham and Kirkley & Pakefield have seen the Woodpeckers' drop to second in the table at the time of going to print.

However, following the disappointing run, the team were back to winning ways with a 4-1 win against Thetford Town on September 21 and a 7-1 win against Gorleston on September 28.

Anger growing against bus cuts

The axing of a bus service from Woodbridge and Rendlesham to central Ipswich has created numerous problems for people across the town.

That's the view of Caroline Page, county councillor for Woodbridge, who has started a petition urging bosses at First Bus to reverse the decision.

Cllr Page said the removal of the hourly 800 Park and Ride extension to central Ipswich from Woodbridge and Rendlesham causes problems for Ipswich bound travel and for those with relatives in the Rendlesham care home.

At the same time, the company has also made changes to the timetabling and route of their complementary 64 route.

The buses no longer stop at the Woodbridge Peterhouse estate and the last bus leaves Ipswich an hour earlier, at 5.50pm, meaning anyone leaving work in Ipswich later faces a 45-minute walk to Woodbridge. Early-morning buses are also affected, as is hospital travel.

Cllr Page said she could not understand why the services were being axed.

She commented: "The services were both well-used and vital to many people with few or no transport choices. They were, however, under-advertised. The 800 did not even carry the Woodbridge to Rendlesham destinations on the six maps that were posted inside each bus."

She stressed the impact of the cuts was immense.

Cllr Page added: "Timetable and route changes mean that workers are finding difficulties travelling to and from work. Disabled and elderly people, and young parents with buggies, are having to walk up to 25 minutes to a stop.

"We ask that these cuts and changes be immediately reversed."

Electrical fire destroys pub kitchen

Apub in Woodbridge will be without a kitchen until the end of the month after it was badly damaged by a fire.

The Cherry Tree Pub, in Cumberland Street, has not been able to serve food to customers since September 3 when the fire took place.

Landlord Andy Thompson, who lives on the site with his wife, called fire crews when he was woken by the fire alarm.

A beer and gin festival was also cancelled as the shed where it was due to take place is full of kitchen equipment.

The pub is still open serving drinks and Andy is encouraging pubgoers to bring their own food or order takeaways. Pop-up food vendors, including Keo Street and The Moving Plaice, have also been invited to feed hungry customers.

NEWS FROM THE LONGSHED The Sutton Hoo SHIP'S COMPANY

ast month we unveiled the Sutton Hoo Ship's Company plans to recreate the huge Saxon ship found at Sutton Hoo and we have now begun work to make a 10th scale model – the first step in understanding our measurements for the full-size reconstruction.

It's a painstaking process – but this is just the start of a two-year project set to teach us more about Anglo-Saxon life and times than we thought imaginable.

We will learn about traditional building methods, explore materials, dimensions and feasibility of structure and get hands on with rowing it. Picture this elegant vessel, with 40 rowers tearing down the river to the beat of a drum – with, we hope, not too many clashes of oars.

That voyage will be the start of our sea trials when we intend to find out more about how the original ship might have been operated.

Reconstructing this magnificent vessel in Woodbridge is fitting – continuing that link the town has to a rich maritime history.

The build is taking place at the Longshed – the once derelict site of the old Whisstocks Boatyard.

Open to visitors from 11am to 1pm on Tuesday, Wednesday, Saturday and Sunday all year round, this site is allowing us not just the space to make our vision a reality – but the opportunity to involve the public.

This leads me to continue our appeal to ask the people of Suffolk to get behind us and sponsor a rivet



for just £20.

Each rivet will be individually numbered and the owner will be able to map the location of their rivet on the ship once it's built.

Man bailed following alleged offence

A20-year-old man arrested in connection with a number of incidents involving indecent exposures has been released on bail.

One of the things I bet you had no idea your county councillor does, is walk proposed routes to check whether they are appropriate for Suffolk students walking to school. These routes are anywhere across the county. They must walk to arrive in time for school. So, maybe near Colchester one day, Haverhill the next, or up near Diss or Lowestoft. Hence my early starts.

Hard work to add onto a full working day - but I bring something extra to these walks. Not only all my years as a county councillor, but the lived experience of having been a lone parent walking three children to school, through sickness, disability and bad weather. It means I understand some of the practical difficulties.

Now, I don't want to get into party-politics here. But I do want to lobby here and now for the individual. It seems to me that when people get to elect their local representatives, they often forget to look at the actual person they are voting for.

Concerned about the loss of the local bus? It would be a good idea to vote in a bus user. Worried about school transport? Ensure that your representative has had experience taking children to local schools. And if you are concerned about making sure our public money is well spent, why not find out if they know the cost of a pint of milk and could be trusted to balance the family budget?

Am I suggesting you should always vote for a woman? No. But I am suggesting that life experience. character — and possibly a little hardship — help to make a good representative.

Milestone walk for Tudor historian

A Tudor historian has raised over £400 by taking part in Classic FM's Big Walk in aid of Global's Make Some Noise.



WHERE ARE THE BEST PLACES TO SEE THE AURORA BOREALIS?

The Northern Lights are one of Planet Earth's most amazing natural phenomena, having drawn in, enchanted and amazed generations of travellers to Scandinavia and North America for hundreds of years.

First witnessed by astronomers Gassendi and Galilei in 1621, the stunning, dancing sprays of neon light, almost extra-terrestrial in their appearance, form when charged particles are emitted from the sun at the time of a solar flare. These penetrate the earth's magnetic shield, then collide with atoms and molecules in the atmosphere.

The key areas for seeing these displays of nature's beauty can be found in a zone within northern Scandinavia, between is on 66°N and 69°N, otherwise known as the Aurora Zone. The band can become larger when there is high activity of geomagnetic action which is why the lights can, on occasions, even be visible from north-west

Traditionally, it's been said the best places to

witness the Northern Lights were Sweden and Norway, but Finland, Iceland and Greenland can all lay claim to offering stunning tourist experiences. Much of this factors in the tranquil majesty of surroundings lakes, forests and fells which, while almost completely devoid of light pollution, also add to the mystical air of this remarkable sight.







DEAD AND BURY-D

he sad demise of a once proud football club and what it means for 91 other Football League members.

In September, and in a scenario football fans have seen played out countless times, most expected the white knight to ride in and save Bury Football Club's 125-year membership of the Football League.

The nearer the deadline became, perversely, the more belief grew that things would resolve themselves. And yet, there was no white knight, there were no further stays of execution, and having failed to prove funds were in place for them to survive the season whilst taking care of the Company Voluntary Arrangement agreed a few months previously with creditors, Bury Football Club were expelled from the world's richest football league.

On the face of it, to let a former FA Cup winner wilt for the equivalent of two weeks of Alexis Sanchez's wages is preposterous, but the Shakers' plight is a stark reminder that self-sufficiency is a requirement, not an option, and the Lancashire club's drive for higher division football – and the wages that accompany it – must be a salient warning to all clubs

Emotionally, the situation was made worse for the Gigg Lane outfit by local rivals Bolton Wanderers' survival, though this isn't necessarily the end for Bury. They exist still as a business, with owner Steve Dale seemingly desperate to relinquish all ties as the club seek entry at a much lower level – probably the Northern Premier League – for the 2020/21 season.

What's left is very much the same as before. The pursuit of the riches at the top of the game is as fervent as ever in English football, and clubs will continue to gamble big time in pursuing that. What's changed is that chairman and owners know the trap door is no longer bolted shut.
