Teenager charged with attempted murder

↑ teenager from the Woodbridge area has been Acharged with attempted murder and firearms offences after a 15-year-old boy was shot on his walk to school earlier this month.

Officers were called just after 8.40am on Monday, September 7, to reports that the youth had been shot in Friends Walk, Kesgrave. He sustained serious injuries and was airlifted to Addenbrooke's Hospital.

As **VISION**Woodbridge went to press, his condition was described as critical.

Later that morning, at 10.55am, a 15-year-old boy from the Woodbridge area was arrested by armed police in Westwood Avenue, Ipswich, on suspicion of attempted murder.

He made an initial appearance via video link before Norwich Magistrates' Court on September 9, where he committed to appear before Ipswich Crown Court.

At the time of writing, the suspect has been remanded in custody by the crown court, pending his next appearance on Monday, December 7.

Assistant Chief Constable Rob Jones said he wanted to reassure the local community.

He commented: "I understand this attack will have caused a great deal of alarm and distress to the people of Kesgrave and the surrounding area, but we are now satisfied that this was an isolated incident and there is no wider threat to the local community.

"Our priority is to keep everyone safe and I would like to stress that crimes such as this are extremely rare in Suffolk. This is an area with a number of schools nearby and, going forward, parents should not be concerned about dropping off or collecting their

birding walks and artists' demonstrations. It was perfect and really inspiring. The event was held under difficult conditions but it all worked really smoothly. I am proud to be living here and showing other artists how wonderful our river is.

"Connecting with art doesn't mean you have to pick up your passport to discover the art within yourself. We've held workshops on the guay for the last five or six years but this is the first time we have done anything as significant as Sketchfest."

Mary-Anne said plans are already underway for next vear's Sketchfest.

Community champions in running for award

Aproject in Woodbridge, which has helped to feed hundreds of local people regularly by saving, cooking and redistributing thousands of kilos of food from many businesses, is in the running for a prestigious award.

The Teapot Project is still sending out food parcels to individuals, families, community groups and charities, and also trialling a three box meal plan scheme with a local sheltered housing organisation, where household recipients receive three easy-to-lift boxes, delivered straight to their door, containing a variety of food groups representative of what they might pick up at the local store.

The community-focused group is in the running to win the Changing Lives Special Recognition Award which acknowledges those who have adapted and have put the community first in the fight against COVID-19.

The Teapot Project was set up by Mischa Pearson in 2015. In a Facebook post, she said she was delighted to be nominated.

She wrote: "Not sure how we got nominated, but we're very grateful. We're very proud to be in the running."

The awards are set to be held on November 25.

Popular shop defies pandemic

ashion fans in Woodbridge will be happy after it was announced that the M&Co's store in the town will be staying open.

Although 47 stores across the country will be axed and 380 employees will lose their jobs, the store in The Thoroughfare will be saved from the axe.

Staff from the Woodbridge store took to social media to tell customers the good news.

A post on its Facebook page read: "It was reported in the news that M&Co was closing some of its stores. Well I am pleased to say the Woodbridge store is staying open, all the team here look forward to your continued support to keep the local high streets buzzina."

M&Co chief executive Andy McGeoch said the company went into administration to save most of its jobs and stores.

He commented: "The best way to save most jobs and most stores was to enter administration, with a new company acquiring the assets of the old business, and this process has now been finalised.

"It's not a decision we took lightly, after more than 50 years of trading, but it gives us a sustainable basis from which to rebuild, with the majority of our staff keeping their jobs."

A spokesman added: "Please do come and enjoy the opening of the club but be aware that there are some changes in entrances and exits, as well as strict social distancing rules to be adhered to as per government guidelines."

Author sets up prize to further ill and disabled voices

An author from Rendlesham has set up a new prize to further ill and disabled voices in writing.

The Barbellion Prize was established in honour of the English diarist W N P. Barbellion, whose diary regarded by some as one of the most moving ever written – dealt extensively with his personal experience of multiple sclerosis.

Founder and prize director Jake Goldsmith explained his motivation behind the new award.

He commented: "Illness is ubiquitous, but it is often neglected in our thoughts or it is thoroughly misunderstood. There is a long history of great artists and writers living with illness, from Franz Kafka, Emily Dickinson, John Keats, Katherine Mansfield, Friedrich Nietzsche. Albert Camus and many others.

"All of these writers produced estimable work partly because of their various illnesses and the distinctive perspectives illness gave them, implicitly or explicitly. And today still exists their spiritual company that we should want to celebrate.

"The experiences of the ill and the disabled still

regularly go unnoticed by the wider public, or they remain unsaid. And yet the expression of a phenomenology of illness is perhaps capable of being our most laudable and essential literature. It deserves a much greater audience."

Anvone who is thinking about entering has until October 31 to be considered for this year's award in the sum of £600.

Woodpeckers exit FA Cup as competitive football returns

After a long break owing to coronavirus, football finally returned to Notcutts Park at the beginning of September.

Woodbridge Town FC were very unfortunate to exit the FA Cup against Biggleswade United, who had ex-Glasgow Rangers star Nacho Novo in their line-up.

In the first competitive match of the new season on September 1, a late deflected injury time equaliser for the visitors made the score 2-2 and meant the match went to penalties, with Woodbridge losing the shootout 7-6.

The club have made many changes to make the ground as safe as possible, with a one-way system. social distancing and additional stewarding.

Tickets have been made available online in advance of games to comply with track and trace requirements. Cash entry is also available, but advance ticket purchase is recommended as the ground capacity is currently restricted to just 300.

September – and finally children are getting back to school after a break of many months. There's been a lot of talk about what they have missed educationally and less about what impact these months of isolation from friends may have had on a child's mind. In a virtual world there's no such thing as a virtual playground.

Perhaps, unsurprisingly, it is the younger children who seem to have been showing greater signs of unhappiness, anxiety and clinginess. Socialisation is a lengthy process, and now they may have to start all over again, and how? Masked? Separated by plastic walls? In small groups? Or only at school on certain weeks? Who knows? The guidance changes at a moment's notice.

They say it might take a while for children to adjust. But adjust to what? The adults don't know.

The teenagers keep more to themselves, so it is harder to say what the impact may have been on them. It is clear some have reported themselves as

feeling happier in lockdown than at school, although their behaviour has not necessarily been seen as such by persons older.

But it was always thus.

"The young people of today think of nothing but themselves. They have no reverence for parents or old age," said Peter the Hermit, 800 years ago, while 1,600 years before that, Socrates complained: "Children now love luxury; they show disrespect for elders and prefer chatter to exercise. Children are tyrants, not servants of the households. They no longer rise when their elders enter the room. They contradict their parents, chatter before company, gobble dainties at the table, cross their legs, and tyrannize their teachers."

And I bet Socrates' mum had some things to say about him.

If Socrates was describing your view of lockdown, maybe it's time to have a little rethink, yourself.



Documents: what to keep and what to shred

While moving so much of our lives online means the amount of paper we have to deal with is perhaps not as great as it once was, it's still very easy to get swamped by documents, forms, booklets and more.

Here's a simple guide to what you should be keeping and what can be satisfyingly put through the shredder:

- > **Home documents:** This includes everything from your car logbook (V5C) to building and contents insurance printouts, house deeds, mortgage statements, vehicle records and any rental agreements. These should be kept for as long as they are valid. Utility bills should be kept for a year.
- > **Personal documents:** Birth and marriage documents obviously sit high up on this list and should be kept forever; but consider as well life insurance, Disclosure and Barring Service (DBS) certificates, medical records, driver's licence and pension details. These should be kept for as long as they are valid.
- > Financial documents: These include National Insurance cards, which should always be kept, to tax affairs and recent bank and credit card statements, even if you access these online. Financial documents should be accessible for seven years, but taking this online means your provider can store them rather than you.

For the most part you should now be able to shred anything else, but if you've something you're uncertain of, by all means hold on to it until your next sort-out.

The important thing is to keep hold of what's still relevant and rid yourself of what isn't. On that note, it's a good idea to keep some documents for a year after you dispose of the thing it relates to – for instance, a rented car – in case you need to check back for the purpose of a tax return, or similar.

And it's a good idea too to go back over all paperwork every now and again. Some personal effects that were important then may now be outdated, and keeping your documents organised and up to date is vital.

PLANTATION SHUTTERS a brief history



lantation shutters have been used to add both style and practicality to homes for generations. They are among the most popular choices of window coverings in the UK. But what are the origins of these versatile window coverings?

You might be surprised to read the ancient Greeks used the earliest plantation shutter as a barrier from the strong winds for buildings by the sea. Made of marble, they were incredibly durable and their solid structure meant air couldn't pass through. Given the weight of the material, they were understandably difficult to work with. It's little surprise that over time, wood was used to improve the design and functionality.

Timber shutters grew in popularity throughout the Mediterranean during the Greek and Roman eras, with the light-weight wood allowing for moveable louvres which gave greater control over the amount of light and air which could enter the building. In these hotter climates, that effective climate control allowed households to block out the sun and heat during the day and open them up to cool the house down in the evenings.

It was during the colonial period that plantation shutters saw their greatest use and earned their name. When the Spanish first moved into South America and the Caribbean, they brought shutters to the New World, and soon extravagant mansions were being built, which featured this form of window covering.

On large plantation farms, the shutters of the manor were usually painted white to reflect the sun and keep the home cool during the day. When Britons began to settle in the New England states of North America, they brought with them the wider 'café-style' shutters which are popular today.

In the Victorian period, external shutters grew in popularity. Boxed shutter-style panels became common, the sort which could be folded back into a box at either side of the window when not in use. As towns and cities grew with the Industrial Revolution, these shutters had the added advantage of shutting out some degree of noise and air pollution.

Fast forward to today, the modern shutter retains all of these qualities and more. Serving as a versatile and practical window covering, whilst providing a stylish finish to any room.



BATTLE STATIONS

This year marks eight decades since one of the most important British victories during the Second World War: the Battle of Britain.

t's June 1940 and France has been quickly defeated by Germany in Adolf Hitler's march across Europe. His aim: to bring Gleichschaltung (coordination), the process of Nazification and totalitarian control to the continent.

Hitler was expecting the British to also fall into line and to try to agree a peace deal with Germany. In the first instance, he knew that to have any chance of setting up a successful invasion of British shores (which was codenamed Operation Sealion), he would need to combat the formidable Royal Air Force. Subsequently, he gave the Luftwaffe (the German equivalent of the RAF) the go-ahead to engage with it.

Even though the German occupation of France was rapid, the country had experienced severe damage to its air fleet; yet when asked to go to battle in the skies of Southern England two months later, it was ready.

However, the Luftwaffe hadn't reckoned on Britain's secret weapon in the Battle of Britain – the Dowding System. Named after Commander in Chief of the Fighter Command, Sir Hugh Dowding, it was a remarkable network that brought together ground defence, radar and fighter aircraft.

Knowing where and when the Luftwaffe was on its way to Britain was of huge advantage to the RAF, whereby it could then scramble fighters quickly – notably the Spitfire – to intercept the threat.

However, in truth, it was in the way the Spitfire was armed that gave it a significant edge. And that was thanks to a young mathematician, whose brilliant calculations meant it could leave the ground with

double its original gun capacity.


Her name was Hazel Hill, and she was the daughter of Fred, who was part of the Air Ministry,

Fred returned home from work one day and asked for help in providing a solution to the Spitfire's perceived lack of firepower. The iconic British warplane was initially only designed to have four guns on it; he felt it could be more but needed his daughter's help.

Many of the Air Ministry felt that eight guns would be too heavy for the Spitfire – and for its compatriot, the Hurricane – but Fred and his daughter Hazel found a way to equip the machine with double the artillery. It was a significant advancement, and it worked.

As the conflict heightened, with support from Commonwealth pilots, and as the Luftwaffe fatally miscalculated its own successes, a three-month-long skirmish in the skies eventually started to go the way of the Allies.

The Battle of Britain will go down in history as one of the most important parts of the Second World War and a colossal reason as to why Germany was unable to seize Great Britain. It was a barrier that ultimately led the Nazis to fail in their attempt to take control of Europe, and it preserved the freedom that we acknowledge with gratitude and humility today.

Plant in full to partial sun in loamy, well-drained soil and keep new plants moist until they stop blooming.

Asters attract aphids, spider mites, whiteflies and leafhoppers, all of which can be kept under control with the use of pesticides. They are also prone to stem rot, a fungus that can begin at the start of the germination process. Prevent this by not overwatering and ensuring the soil is well

- Choose a suitable location next to a drainpipe.
- Always install a water butt on a firm and flat surface that is strong enough to hold its weight when full.
- Consider investing in a stand so that you can fill your watering can from the tap at the bottom of the butt with ease.
- Follow the instructions on the diverter kit this will involve cutting through your chosen drainpipe with a hacksaw.
- Cover your water butt with a lid to prevent insects from flying in and to stop children
- Wait for the rain to fall.







However, to get it right and avoid the common pitfalls of bad bangs, you need to choose the right fringe for your face shape.

THE FULL CHOPPY FRINGE

Best for oval face shapes


With this face shape you want a full fringe that will cover your forehead but not one that will overpower your delicate features. Adding choppiness at the ends will create a softer and more textured feel.



Are you making the most of the Tax-Free Childcare Scheme?



The Government is encouraging us all to return to work. Related to this, working families must consider their childcare arrangements. This article considers a scheme that may provide some financial help to those families.

The Tax-Free Childcare Scheme (TFCS) is open to all eligible families with children under 12. Latest figures have revealed that 115,000 families used the TFCS for 130,000 children in the guarter to June 2020 with the government adding £11.6m in top-up payments. These figures are significantly lower than those published for the previous quarter to March 2020 when 218,000 families were using childcare for 258,000 children. The decline is largely due to the closure of childcare facilities for the majority of children in response to the Coronavirus Pandemic. The COVID-19 lockdown led to a large decrease in the number of TFCS accounts used in April and May with a slight recovery beginning in June. This followed the closure of most childcare facilities on 20 March 2020.

The TFCS helps support working families with their childcare costs. The scheme provides for a government top-up on parental contributions. For every 80p in the £1 contributed by parents an additional 20p or 20% will be funded by Government up to a maximum total of £10,000 per child per year. This will give parents an annual savings of up to £2,000 per child (and up to £4,000 for disabled children until the age of 17).

Who is eligible for the Tax-Free Childcare Scheme?

The scheme is open to all qualifying parents including the self-employed and those on a minimum wage. The scheme is also available to parents on paid sick leave as well as those on paid and unpaid statutory maternity, paternity and adoption leave. In order to be eligible to use the scheme, parents will have to be in work at least 16 hours per week and earn at least the National Minimum Wage or Living Wage. If either parent earns more than £100,000, both parents are unable to use the scheme.

The earnings limit does not apply to newly self-employed who started their business in the last 12 months. In addition, as self-employed income can vary, profits can be averaged across the tax year if it is necessary in order to meet the minimum income requirement.

Working parents will be able to continue claiming the TFCS until 31 October 2020, even if their income has temporarily fallen below the minimum income requirement as a result of the pandemic.



Coronavirus and your retirement income...

tock market volatility can be unsettling for Oinvestors of all ages, however much they have invested and whatever their objectives may be.

However, the market fluctuations triggered by the coronavirus outbreak and its impact on the global economy have particular implications for investors taking income from their retirement pots.

There are two related concepts - or risks - at work in retirement investing.

The first is 'pound-cost averaging'. This is the result of buying smaller amount of stocks at different times, perhaps regularly, when building your pension pot; rather than risking making a big investment only to find the market falls.

But when you're withdrawing retirement income in a declining market you have to cash in more of your pot to maintain the same level of income as before. This is known as 'pound-cost rayaging'.

The other is "sequencing risk". This is the risk that a market downturn will happen at a bad time in your drawdown cycle. In a period of prolonged volatility, you may end up taking an unsustainably high amount of cash out of a pot that's dwindling.

When this downturn coincides with the beginning of your retirement, it's when you're most vulnerable because you are no longer working and you have all your retirement years yet to fund.

The good news, however, is there are several ways to help minimise the impacts of these risks.

They include having a cash fund to draw down from in times of volatility, so that equity investments are allowed to fluctuate and weather the storm. While this provides stability, any money held in cash will lose its value in real terms due to inflation.

Another option is to take only 'natural income' such as dividends - rather than drawing from capital. This will mean what you have to spend is variable and will be less when markets are depressed.

You need to be flexible and have several income strategies. The art of managing downturns in retirement is knowing exactly what to do and when - that's where financial advisers earn their stripes.

AFTER 30 YEARS OF HURT, LIVERPOOL FINALLY GOT THEIR HANDS ON THE BIG PRIZE

It's somewhat ironic that for a club who have struggled, grasped and flailed desperately for three decades in their attempts to restore themselves as the best club in English football, their unassailable lead at the top of the Premier League in March almost counted for nothing as a global pandemic swept in. For a couple of months, Jürgen Klopp's side looked

as if they might be denied the prize they have striven for so long to win – through near misses, bad luck and a long duration of underachievement, the Reds have found the likes of Manchester United, Arsenal, Chelsea, Manchester City, Blackburn Rovers and even Leicester City in their way when it came to securing the biggest prize in domestic football.

Yet after Premier League chiefs, fan groups, police forces and local councils approved measures to get the competition restarted on June 17, Liverpool's history-makers were back on track. Predictably, after all the speculation, the hype and a 100-day gap in action – the longest since Second World War – the Merseyside Derby was something of a damp squib as Liverpool and arch rivals Everton played out a goalless draw.

Ultimately, Manchester City's improved form post lockdown saw Liverpool's significant gap at the top narrowed, but when the Merseysiders crushed Crystal Palace 4–0 at home on June 24, they knew that if Chelsea could beat Pep Guardiola's Citizens side 24 hours later, the title would be theirs... and that's just what happened.

True, it may have been seen as a disappointing climax for Liverpool to have had such a season of domestic dominance ended in empty stadiums and without even so much as an open-top bus ride around their famous city to savour. It's a lack of the true adulation deserving of any Premier League

champions, let alone a side who ended the campaign with 99 points and only three leadue defeats all term.

Yet, the record books will always point to the efforts of captain Jordan Henderson, top scorer Mohamed Salah, the rest of the first-team heavyweights and even the young starlets – Curtis Jones, Harvey Elliott and Neco Williams – who are gradually making their mark in the best club side in world football.

Two seasons ago the Reds finished 25 points behind champions Manchester City. Their winning margin this term confirms a 43-point shift in dominance that will impress Klopp as much as it worries Guardiola and the rest of the chasing pack.

The Anfield club's achievements are monumental – Champions League winners, World Club Championship holders and Premier League victors all at the same time. And yet, as manager Klopp states, defending their title crown is not the Liverpool way – attacking it is, and that's undoubtedly what they'll do


